

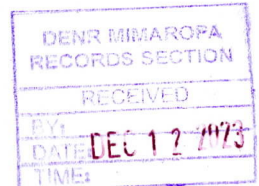


Please be informed that the El Nido Managed Resource Protected Area – Protected Area Management Office (ENMRPA - PAMO) conducted the following CEPA activities;

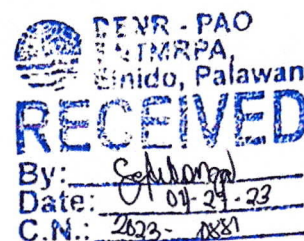

This pertains to instruction of Protected Area Superintendent Mildred A. Suza to attend in the above subject.

What:

Information, Education and Communication (IEC) campaign/meeting.

Where and When:

A series of IECs was held at Barangay Covered Court of Bagong Bayan (9:30 AM, April 20, 2023); and Barangay Covered Court of Bebeladan (2:30 PM, April 20, 2023) all barangays of El Nido, Palawan.

Who and Whom:

On April 20, 2023, the IEC team was composed by Development Management Officer IV Mariano P. Lilang Jr.; Forest Technician I Rodel M. Dorado; and Forest Ranger Richard Pariñas together with Forester II Donna C. Tabernilla, Chief, Monitoring and Enforcement Section (MES); Forester I Michael M. Marasigan; Forest Technician II Bienvenido Veguilla III, Team Leader, Forest Product Monitoring Station II-Bagong Bayan; Forest Ranger Yolando Edep Jr.; Admin. Aide VI Cañette dela Rosa; Ms. Aljen Becera, Information Officer of El Nido Managed Resource Protected Area (ENMRPA) and Mr. Christian Villamor of Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office (MENRO) El Nido.

The receiving communities are:

1. A total of 28 individuals composed of 16 males and 12 females participated in the said activity in Barangay Bagong Bayan, El Nido, Palawan. Nine (9) of them were senior citizens.
2. A total of 59 individuals composed of 10 males and 49 females participated in the said activity in Barangay Bebeladan, El Nido, Palawan. Ten (10) of them were senior citizens.
3. A total of 87 individuals were reached by the IEC team for the period of two (1) day.

Why:

The purpose of IEC was to inform and educate the community specially to residents living within forestlands and coastal areas regarding the primary environmental laws being implemented by this Office such as the Presidential Decree No. 705 or the Revised Forestry Code of the Philippines, Republic Act No. 9175 or the Chainsaw Act, Republic Act No. 7942 or the Philippine Mining Act of 1995, Presidential Decree No. 1067 or the Water Code of the Philippines, Republic Act No. 7586 or the Enhanced National Integrated Protected Areas System (ENIPAS) and land matters.

How:

The following were presented/discussed:

- a) Brief information about the El Nido Managed Resource Protected Area (ENMRPA) profile by the undersigned;
- b) Salient provisions of PD 705 by For. Tabernilla;
- c) Proper waste management and the local policy about no to single-use plastic by Mr. Villamor;
- d) Brief information re: the El Nido Green Economy Model (GEM) project and PowerPoint presentation of various laws mentioned above; and
- e) DMO IV Lilang promptly answered queries about sand and gravels extraction/utilization and land matters such as tax declaration and land titling process.

Issues and Concerns:**Bagong Bayan**

1. Reclassification of their area from timberland to alienable and disposable (A&D).
2. Tax Declaration for timberland areas
3. Process for land titling with issued Tax Declaration
4. Inquiry on the authorized individual to conduct land survey for Timberland areas
5. Sand and gravel activity at So. Omas, Bagong Bayan

Bebeladan

1. Punong Barangay Antonio Cabezas Jr. is proposing for centralized septic tank to reduce the waste water pollution in their barangay.
2. PB Cabezas proposed to exclude the mainland Bebeladan in protected area.
3. Kaingin making within the dispute property of Francisco Pedrosa
4. Newly built concrete house within the 40 meters easement zone

Other matters:

Further, the activity was compliant to the Implementation Plan of the Office on Environmental Management System (EMS), basically the 5S technique of the organization, namely: 1. Sort, 2. Set in Order, 3. Shine, 4. Standardize, and 5. Sustain. The team also distributed posters and locally produced pamphlets on environmental laws. In addition, goods (2 kilos of rice, 1 pack of noodle and 1 can of sardines) were also distributed to the attendees who actively participated in the question-and-answer portion of the activity.

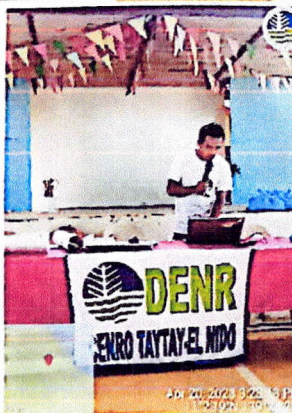

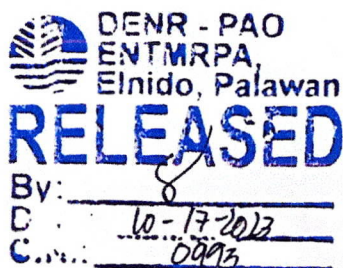

The overarching goal was to enhance their participation in the program and contribute to the broader objectives of the ENMRPA.</p> <p>The ENMRPA-PAMO staff comprehensively elucidated the ENMRPA, covering its definition, jurisdiction, and its collaborative efforts with partners such as the Palawan Council for Sustainable Development (PCSDs) and Malampaya Foundation Incorporation (MFI). Pertinent legislation, including the RA 9147 Wildlife Act and the ENIPAS Act of 2018 (RA 11038), were discussed and presented to the WPU-El Nido students.</p> <p>To gauge the impact of this initiative, a pre-test and post-test were administered to evaluate the students' existing knowledge and determine their level of engagement and the extent to which they had acquired knowledge concerning the jurisdiction of protected areas and related topics.</p> <p>A total of 60 participants, including students, WPU faculties, and ENMRPA-PAMO staff, participated in the initiative. Among these, 47 students were respondents and underwent examination. In the pre-test, the majority of respondents (55%) scored between two (2) and</p>	

	<p>five (5), while 45% scored between six (6) and eight (8), with two (2) being the lowest and eight (8) being the highest attainable scores. In the post-test, one (1) student achieved a perfect score of 10, seven (7) students scored 9, five (5) students scored 7-6, and the remainder received scores between 7 and 8, indicating improvements in their knowledge. Notably, in the pre-test, students struggled the most with question number 6, whereas in the post-test, question number 4 presented the most significant challenge.</p> <p>The results reveal that out of the 46 students from WPU-El Nido who participated, an impressive 99% actively engaged and attentively listened during the lectures conducted by the guest speakers from ENMRPA-PAMO, MFI, and PCsDs. Furthermore, the students at WPU-El Nido exhibited a growing appreciation for the concept of biodiversity conservation, especially within protected areas, as a means to promote sustainability.</p> <p>In conclusion, the CEPA initiative conducted at WPU-El Nido Campus has effectively captured the attention of the students, enabling them to acquire more knowledge about ENMRPA, protected areas, marine protected areas (MPA), and environmental laws. This newfound knowledge is expected to empower them to actively contribute to the protection and conservation of biodiversity.</p>

	<p>In the pre-test, a significant portion, accounting for a half majority (55%) of the respondents, achieved scores ranging from five (5) to two (2), with 45% of respondents obtaining scores between eight (8) and six (6), considering a scale where two (2) represents the lowest score and eight (8) signifies the highest attainable score. While in the post-test, one (1) student attained a perfect score of 10, while seven (7) students received a score of 9, and five (5) students acquired scores in the range of seven (7) to six (6), which represent the lowest scores.</p> <p>Notably, it is observed that in the pre-test, students exhibited a higher rate of incorrect responses in question number 6, whereas in the post-test, question number 4 yielded the highest number of incorrect responses. However, it is noteworthy that despite the low scores observed in the pre-test, the post-test saw a substantial improvement, with a student achieving the maximum score of 10.</p>

One significant constraint pertains to safety and wilderness skills, which has been observed as an area where female students at WPU may feel less confident. This lack of confidence arises both from the impressions they receive from other participants and from the apprehension of answering questions posed by guest speakers and staff.</p> <p>Limited experience is also a constraint that affects students, including female students, who may lack the practical experience and knowledge required for effective engagement in CEPA initiatives, particularly in specialized fields like environmental conservation. Female students at WPU may encounter specific constraints when it comes to accessing the resources and benefits associated with CEPA activities related to ENMRPA. Some primary barriers include language differences and cultural norms. Limited proficiency in the language used during CEPA activities can act as an obstacle to accessing these resources and benefits. Additionally, sociocultural norms may discourage female students from pursuing careers or participating in activities related to environmental conservation and CEPA.</p> <p>However, achieving gender equality objectives within the CEPA activities of ENMRPA can open up a range of opportunities and benefits. These include increased participation, skill development, and sustainable resource management, benefiting both the local community and conservation efforts. ENMRPA has the potential to harness the abilities of the entire community, including women, to more effectively protect and preserve the managed resource protected area. This approach leads to more comprehensive and sustainable conservation efforts, ultimately benefiting the entire community.</p>

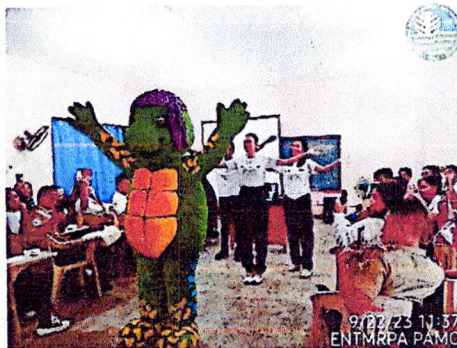
