EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

On 28 July 2021, from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm, the 2021 Fourth MIMAROPA Expanded Regional Intelligence Committee (ERIC) and Regional Situational Awareness and Knowledge Management (RSAKM) Cluster meetings were virtually presided over by NICA-4 RD **Rufino C Mendoza**, and was participated in by 40 members, representatives and guests, including the ERIC-4 Secretariat.

RSAKM CLUSTER ACCOMPLISHMENTS

G2, 2ID, PA

From January to July 2021, the G2, 2ID, PA had 53 media engagements/interviews; 63 news releases; 52 radio programs; 14 infomercials/radio plugs; 344 SOCMED operations; 78 hanged tarpaulins/billboards/posters; 478 distributed leaflets; 25 film showings; 216 inter-agency meetings; and 65 POC meetings.

On social media activities, a total of 6,458 press releases; 3,355 videos; 3,737 photos; and 2,992 quote cards were shared.

U2, WESCOM

From April to June 2021, U2, WESCOM participated in 14 meetings, of which, three (3) were held in April; five (5) in May; and, six (6) in June.

RID-MIMAROPA

From January to June 2021, the RID-MIMAROPA held 10,717 activities, of which, 1,550 were held in January; 1,908 in February; 2,605 in March; 1,834 in April; 1,705 in May; and 1,115 in June.

DILG-MIMAROPA

DILG-MIMAROPA held Regional Rollout on the Establishment of CSO Desk and institutionalization of People's Desk in the LGU; advocacy campaign to youth sector; continuous support and monitoring situation of Former Rebels; and Conference and meetings got a positive result for the implementation of EO 70.

PIA-MIMAROPA

From April to June 2021, PIA-MIMAROPA held the following activities: 15 meetings; 86 SitReps; 87 text blasts; 57 articles; three (3) kapihan/VP/Prescon; 58

NICA-4

The NICA4 held 12 seminar and workshops programs with a total of 2,289 attendees. Shared 91 daily, 13 weekly, three (3) monthly, and one (1) quarterly. Hosted four (4) FB Pages with 7,170 likes and 7,229 followers and posted IO Materials to a 480 FB Pages and 296 FB Groups. Created 579 IO cards on anti-terrorism and anti-corruption.

COVID-19 UPDATE IN MIMAROPA

As of July 2021, the region has 15,913 confirmed cases of COVID-19, of which 1,186 are active cases, 14,139 are recovered, and 364 deaths.

Among the 15,913 confirmed cases in the region: Oriental Mindoro is the highest with 5,723; followed by Palawan with 2,956; Puerto Princesa City (PPC) with 2,754; Occidental Mindoro with 1,977; Romblon with 1,609; and Marinduque with 894. In 1,186 active cases in the region: Oriental Mindoro is the highest with 386; followed by Romblon with 312; Palawan with 251; Occidental Mindoro with 94; Marinduque with 87; and PPC with 56. A total of 364 deaths in the region: Oriental Mindoro is the highest with 174; followed by PPC with 81; Occidental Mindoro with 37; Palawan with 35; Marinduque with 22; and Romblon with 15.

The province is still Delta variant-free. However, other variants, such as the Alpha, Beta, and P.3, were recorded in the region. Among the 113 COVID-19 variants, Alpha recorded highest with 69; Beta with 44; and P.3 with 1. Of these, 60 have already recovered.

In facility and equipment, the region has 48 ICU beds; 435 isolation beds; 262 COVID-19 beds; 2,474 non-COVID-19 beds; 51 ventilators; and 1,715 TTMFs. Following are the available facility and equipment, 31 ICU beds; 265 isolation beds; 140 COVID-19 beds; 1,375 non-COVID-19 beds; and 43 ventilators.

RSAKM CLUSTER IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

The intelligence community will be heavily involved in the RSAKM Cluster. It is mandated to provide timely and accurate information and assessment on situations regarding the CTG and government services across the whole-of-nation Team and support the efforts to end the local communist armed conflict.

2021 FOURTH MIMAROPA ERIC/RSAKM CLUSTER REGULAR MEETING (04-2021)

28 July 2021 (Wednesday), 1:00 p.m. | via Zoom

Call to Order. The virtual 28-July Regular Meeting of the MIMAROPA Expanded Regional Intelligence Committee (ERIC) and Regional Situational Awareness and Knowledge Management (RSAKM) Cluster meeting was called to order to discuss the RSAKM Cluster Accomplishments of U2, SOLCOM; U2, WESCOM; RID-MIMAROPA; DILG-MIMAROPA; PIA-MIMAROPA; and NICA4; and COVID-19 Updates in MIMAROPA.

The meeting was presided over by NICA-4 Regional Director **Rufino C Mendoza** and participated in by 40 members/representatives, guests, including the Head Secretariat and Staff.

Opening Remarks. NICA-4 RD **Rufino C Mendoza**, on behalf of Director General **Alex Paul I Monteagudo**, welcomed the attendees to the regular meeting, and called the meeting to order.

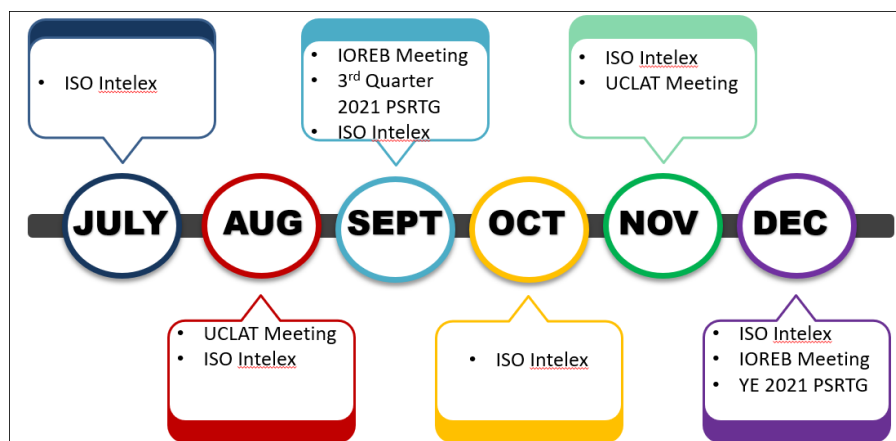

RD **Mendoza** asked how many ECLIP beneficiaries does the region have from January to July 2021. Ms **Panganiban** said that there are 419 former rebels, of which, 216 are in Occidental Mindoro; 46 in Oriental Mindoro; 146 in Palawan; and 11 in Puerto Princesa City (PPC) who were all given assistance amounting to Php26,664,711.40. RD **Mendoza** also asked if there are halfway houses in MIMAROPA. Ms **Panganiban** said that there are half way houses in Bgy Tayamaan, Mamburao, Occidental Mindoro; Bgy Pag-asa, Bansud, Oriental Mindoro; and Bgy Irawan, PPC, Palawan. The half way houses in Oriental Mindoro and Occidental Mindoro have been completed while Palawan is still about to start its construction. RD **Mendoza** requested to be informed once the halfway house is completed and used.

RD **Mendoza** said that the NICA-4 will provide PIA-MIMAROPA of its activities in MIMAROPA, including the photos to be included in new releases for dissemination. Mr **Plantilla** thanked the **Chair** and also requested other members to provide information on their engagements. He requested the NICA-4 to label if the information shared is for public dissemination. Mr **Plantilla** also encouraged the members to provide them a write-up of the engagements with a video compilation or photos.

RD **Mendoza** also asked if the Balik-Loob Program of NICA-4 is also being shared by the PIA-MIMAROPA. Mr **Plantilla** answered that they also shared the said program and also the UP-UP program in their Facebook Account/Pages. RD **Mendoza** asked how the NICA-4 can avail the local news publication in the AOR. Mr **Plantilla** said that due to pandemic, most of the news publication uses online publication and added that they are still completing the list of online publications in the AOR.

F. RSAKM CLUSTER ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF NICA-4

Ms **Goldwyn Macatangay** presented the RSAKM-MIMAROPA Accomplishment for the 2nd Quarter, to wit:

1. The region held 11 seminar and workshops programs with a total of 611 attendees, of which, six (6) are in regional offices, one (1) each in Oriental Mindoro, Occidental Mindoro, Palawan, Marinduque, and Romblon.
2. PNP-MIMAROPA held different orientations, seminars, distribution of flyers on Community Anti-Terrorism Awareness (CATA), ECLIP, National Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict (NTF-ELCAC), and Knowing the

Enemy (KTE). Also, the AFP organized influence operations working group from the provincial to the barangay level.

3. The RSAKM Cluster shared 91 Daily and 13 Weekly bulletins and accomplishments to cluster members and RTF-ELCAC, as well as three (3) monthly, and one (1) quarterly accomplishment reports to RTF-ELCAC Secretariat.

4. The NICA-4 hosted four (4) Facebook Pages with a combined total 7,170 likes and 7,229 followers. NICA4 also shared different IO Materials to a 480 FB Pages and 296 FB Groups.

5. A radio program is also being broadcasted weekly over Care FM 102.5 in San Jose Occidental Mindoro and was also being played via FB Live.

6. Some 568 IO cards on anti-terrorism were created and shared to NICA-4's Facebook pages and social media accounts.

7. NICA4 also shared 72 information and intelligence reports; 91 COVID-19 Situation Reports; 13 weekly regional intelligence assessments reports; and three (3) monthly regional intelligence summary.

8. Eleven IO cards on anti-corruption were created and shared to NICA-4's Facebook pages and various social media accounts.

9. One (1) Security Awareness Seminar was held with 93 participants.

10. Some 39,935 text messages on terrorism awareness were text blasted; 240 stickers; 350 Wakasan Comics; and 910 leaflets were distributed and posted in the AOR.

For RSAKM Ways Forward:

- a. Assist concerned agencies in organizing FR groups into cooperative or provisions of training on livelihood.
- b. Continue current operations against the CTG and its front organizations.
- c. Enhance CI activities against graft and corruption

Mr **Plantilla** requested to coordinate with the staff to create a story on the activities of the cluster for the people to know why such activities are being held.

ARD **Arzaga** said that NICA-4 holds Anti-Terrorism Act (ACT) orientations and asked the PIA-MIMAROPA to cover the orientation and to be added in news releases. She also reminded the body to send their RSAKM Cluster Accomplishments every 22nd of the month to be included in the RSAKM Cluster Accomplishments which are regularly submitted to the RTF-ELCAC.

RD **Mendoza** also requested the update on the detained RBKU members to the RID-MIMAROPA if the office can get affidavits to be used in the proscription. PSSG **Jagong** said that he will relay the message to the assigned personnel.

2. Among the 15,913 confirmed cases in the region: Oriental Mindoro is the highest with 5,723; followed by Palawan with 2,956; Puerto Princesa City (PPC) with 2,754; Occidental Mindoro with 1,977; Romblon with 1,609; and Marinduque with 894.
3. A total of 1,186 active cases in the region: Oriental Mindoro is the highest with 386; followed by Romblon with 312; Palawan with 251; Occidental Mindoro with 94; Marinduque with 87; and PPC with 56.
4. A total of 364 deaths in the region: Oriental Mindoro is the highest with 174; followed by PPC with 81; Occidental Mindoro with 37; Palawan with 35; Marinduque with 22; and Romblon with 15.
5. A total of 885 clustered cases in 180 barangays, of which, 352 in Romblon; 241 in Oriental Mindoro; 106 in Palawan; 74 in Occidental Mindoro; 67 in Marinduque; and 45 in PPC.
6. Among the 65,328 individuals tested, 24.0% tested positive.
7. In Rapid Antigen tests, 4,835 tested positives, of which, 171 are active; 4,465 recovered; 124 deaths; and 75 non-covid deaths. In isolation/quarantine status, 64% are in hospitals, 18% each in home isolation and facility.
8. In terms of growth rate, the region has low growth rate, of which, Romblon is high, minimal in Palawan, and low in Marinduque, Oriental Mindoro, PPC, and Occidental Mindoro.
9. The province is still Delta variant-free. However, other variants, such as Alpha, Beta, and P.3, were recorded. Among the 113 COVID-19 variants, Alpha recorded highest with 69; Beta with 44; and P.3 with one (1). Sixty of the said cases have already recovered.

10. In facility and equipment, the region has 48 ICU beds; 435 isolation beds; 262 COVID beds; 2,474 non-COVID beds; 51 ventilators; and 1,715 TTMFs. Following are the available facilities and equipment, 31 ICU beds; 265 isolation beds; 140 COVID beds; 1,375 non-COVID-beds; and 43 ventilators.
11. The total reported number of confirmed COVID-19 cases in MIMAROPA region is slowly decreasing, however there are still areas of concern, based on the latest Average Daily Attack Rate (ADAR), Two-Week Growth Rate (2WGR) and high number of active cases, especially in Romblon.
12. Clustering of cases is high in Calapan City (18 barangays affected), Naujan (17 barangays) in Oriental Mindoro, and Odiongan in Romblon (16 barangays).
13. About four (4) in every ten (10) active cases quarantined at home are symptomatic.
14. Exposure at home is among the top source of exposures. Home quarantine remains a concern in terms of community transmission where possible exposure of other household members who are not quarantined are likely to infect family members and others in the community through face-to-face interactions, going to workplace, and/or attending ordinary gathering or events.
15. In terms of Health Care Utilization, occupancy is generally low, all below the 80% danger zone.
16. Regionally, more than half of all the active cases admitted in hospitals are mild and asymptomatic who are competing with resources and attention that are best reserved for moderate, severe, and critical COVID-19 cases.

ARD **Arzaga** presented the RSAKM Cluster Implementation Plan.

ARD **Arzaga** asked if P.3 variant is now called Theta variant. Mr **Martin** said that its is the proposed name of the variant, but only if it reaches the sufficient number of confirmed cases to be classified as separate variant. ARD **Arzaga** also asked if DOH-MIMAROPA is submitting samples for genome sequencing. Mr **Martin** said that from the collection of the sample and if the samples reached the acceptable value, it will be sent to the Philippine Genome Center for genome sequencing. ARD **Arzaga** asked how long the results of the genome sequencing are released. Mr **Martin** said that it usually takes one (1) month to release the results since there is only one (1) Genome Center to test the samples from 13 regions.
