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NEWS ON THE GO PIA-MIMAROPA REGIONAL OFFICE DECEMBER 16, 2021

SA COVID-19 UPDATE MULA SA DEPT OF HEALTH - MIMAROPA CASE MONITORING DASHBOARD NA MAY PETSANG 14 DISYEMBRE: May 10 na nadagdag na bagong kaso ng Covid19 sa rehiyon. Sa pinakahuling monitoring, ang Mimaropa ay may 231 Covid-19 active cases ... Ito ay nasa: Oriental Mindoro 81, Palawan 57, Puerto Princesa City 39, Occ Mindoro 29, Romblon 18, Mduque 7. Mayroon 31 na gumaling, at 3 ang nasawi. Sa kabuuan, nagkaroon na ng 33,695 Covid19 cases sa Mimaropa region; 31,924 ang total recoveries at 1030 ang total deaths sa Covid19.

PIA OCCIDENTAL MINDORO: Hanggang ngayong araw na lamang ang Agbiliwa ng DTI Occ Mdo, na matatagpuan sa Municipal Compound ng bayan ng San Jose. Paliwanag ni Nornita Guerrero, DTI OIC-Prov Director, maagang nilang tatapusin ang programa na sana ay sa Disyembre 20 pa. Aniya, naranasan nila noong huling Agbiliwa na nasira ng bagyo ang mga produktong ibinebenta at ayaw niya itong maulit pa ngayong may umiiral na sama ng panahon. Kaugnay nito, nanawagan ang opisyal sa publiko na tangkilikin ang mga lokal na produkto sa Agbiliwa sa huling araw nito. Ang AGBILIWA ay programa ng DTI na nagbibigay ng pagkakataon sa mga local MSMEs na maipakilala ang kanilang mga produkto.(VND)

PIA ORIENTAL MINDORO: Nasa 173,526 na ang mga naipamahaging bakuna sa lungsod ayon sa huling datos ng City Health Task Force na naitala kahapon. Umabot na sa 97.30% o 99,294 ang mga nabakunahan habang ang mga nakatanggap na ng kumpletong bakuna ay nasa 79,079 na indibidwal o 77.49% na target na mabakunahan. Samantala, ang mga nabigyan ng booster shots ay nasa 1052 na. Target ng lokal na pamahalaan na mabakunahan ang 102,050 Calapeño kung saan 70% na tinatayang populasyon na naitala noong 2020 na 145,786. (DN)

PIA MARINDUQUE: Bilang bahagi ng paggunita ng World AIDS day, isinagawa ang HIV/AIDS awareness campaign gayundin ang Candlelight Memorial activity sa bayan ng Boac. Layon nito na matiyak ang mas ligtas na kapaligiran para sa lahat at maalala ang maraming buhay na nawala dulot ng sakit na AIDS. Ang naturang adbokasiya ay inilunsad ng grupong BILA-BILA, o kilala rin sa tawag na LGBT Pride-Marinduque, isang komunidad na kinabibilangan ng mga Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transexual, Queer at iba pa, sa lalawigan. Samantala, katuwang ang pamahalaang bayan ng Boac sa pamumuno ni Mayor Armi DC. Carrion at PHO Marinduque ang programa ay matagumpay na naisagawa, taglay ang temang "Ending the HIV epidemic, Equitable Access, Everyone's Voice". (RAMJR)

PIA ROMBLON: Pinaghahanda na ni San Jose, Romblon Mayor Ronnie Samson ang mga opisyal ng barangay sa kanilang bayan sa posibleng paglapit sa kanilang bayan ng bagyong Odette. Sa panayam ngayong December 15 sa alkalde, sinabi nito na nakipagpulong na siya sa mga barangay kapitan sa kanilang lugar kung saan ipinaliwanag nila ang track ng nasabing bagyo at kung ano ang dapat ihanda. Sinabi ng alkalde na ngayong may Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal na sa kanilang lugar, ipagbabawal na ang paglalagay ng mga sasakyang pandagat maging ang mga pagpapalaot ng mga maliliit na bangka. Samantala, inihahanda na rin ng Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management

Office at ng Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office ang mga relief packs na kanilang ipapamahagi kung may pamilya na kailangang ilikas mula sa mga low-lying areas. (PJF)

PIA PALAWAN: Naghahanda na ang City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office ng Puerto Princesa sa pagdaan ng bagyong Odette sa lalawigan. Ayon kay CDRRM Officer Earl Timbancaya, kahapon ay binuksan na ang virtual operation center at nakapagsagawa na ng pre-disaster risk assessment. Itinaas na rin sa Oplan Listo Charlie protocol ang status ng paghahanda. Nagsagawa din ng pagpupulong kahapon para sa palagiang update at monitoring ng mga nagaganap na paghahanda at sitwasyon sa lungsod ng Puerto Princesa. (MCE)

PIA MIMAROPA: Umapila ang mga ahensiya ng RDRRMC sa publiko na sundin ang mga tagubilin ng mga lokal na pamahalaan sa pagdaan ng Bagyong Odette. Sa Palawan, naglabas ng Storm Surge Warning Signal No. 1 ang DOST Pagasa-Puerto Princesa City para sa mga bayan sa Hilagang Palawan: Agutaya, Araceli, Cagayancillo, Cuyo, Dumarang, Linapacan, Magsaysay, Roxas at Taytay. Ayon kay Merari Rosaroso ng MGB Mimaropa, mapanganib ang kumbinasyon ng malakas na hangin, high tide at naglalakihang alon sa mga kumunidad na malalapit sa dalampasigan. Una rito, nanawagan si OCD Mimaropa Regional Director Ruben L. Carandang sa mga LGU na magsagawa ng maagang pre-emptive evacuation hangga't maari. (LP)

Typhoon “#OdettePH”

Issued at 11:00 AM, 16 December 2021

TYPHOON “#OdettePH” INTENSIFIES FURTHER AS IT ENDANGERS THE BUCAS GRANDE-SIARGAO ISLANDS AND DINAGAT ISLANDS

Location of Center (10:00 AM): The center of the eye of Typhoon “ODETTE” was located based on all available data including those from Hinatuan Doppler Weather Radar at 175 km East of Surigao City, Surigao del Norte (9.7°N, 127.1°E)

Intensity: Maximum sustained winds of 185 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 230 km/h, and central pressure of 940 hPa

Present Movement: West Northwestward at 25 km/h

Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds: Strong winds or higher extend outwards up to 480 km from the center

TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNALS (TCWS) IN EFFECT

TCWS No.4 (Very Destructive typhoon-force winds prevailing or expected within 12 hours)

Visayas

Southern Leyte, and the eastern portion Bohol (Talibon, Trinidad, San Miguel, Dagohoy, Pilar, Sierra Bullones, Jagna, Garcia Hernandez, Duero, Guindulman, Anda, Candijay, Alicia, Mabini, Ubay, Pres. Carlos P. Garcia, Bien Unido)

Mindanao

Dinagat Islands, Surigao del Norte including Siargao and Bucas Grande Islands

TCWS No.3 (Destructive typhoon-force winds prevailing or expected within 18 hours)

Visayas

The northern portion of Agusan del Norte (Kitcharao, Jabonga, Santiago, Tubay, City of Cabadbaran), and the northern portion of Surigao del Sur (Carrascal, Cantilan, Madrid, Carmen, Lanuza, Cortes, City of Tandag)

TCWS No.2 (Damaging gale- to storm-force winds prevailing or expected within 24 hours)

Luzon

The southern portion Albay (The city of Tabaco, Malilipot, Rapu-rapu, Bacacay, Santo Domingo, Legazpi City, Manito, Camalig, Daraga, Jovellar, Guinobatan, Pio Duran, City of Ligao, Oas), Sorsogon, Masbate including Ticao and Burias Islands, Romblon, the central and southern portions of Oriental Mindoro (Pinamalayan, Gloria, Bansud, Bongabong, Roxas, Mansalay, Bulalacao, Socorro, Pola), the central and southern portions of Occidental Mindoro (Sablayan, Calintaan, Rizal, San Jose, Magsaysay), and Palawan (El Nido, Calamian Islands, Taytay, Dumaran, Araceli, Cuyo Islands)

Visayas

Northern Samar, Eastern Samar, Samar, Biliran, the rest of Leyte, the rest of Cebu, the rest of Negros Occidental, Iloilo, Capiz, Aklan, and Antique

Mindanao

The rest of Surigao del Sur, Agusan del Sur, the rest of Agusan del Norte, the extreme northern portion of Zamboanga del Norte (Dapitan City, Siayan, Sindangan, Jose Dalman, Manukan, Pres. Manuel A. Roxas, Katipunan, Sergio Osmeña Sr., Polanco, Dipolog City, Piñan, Mutia, La Libertad, Rizal, Sibutad), the extreme northern portion of Zamboanga del Sur (Josefina, Molave, Mahayag, Dumingag, Tambulig), Misamis Occidental, the northern portion of Lanao del Norte (Kolambugan, Maigo, Munai, Bacolod, Poona Piagapo, Kauswagan, Pantao Ragat, Matungao, Linamon, Baloi, Tagoloan, Pantar, Iligan City), Misamis Oriental, Camiguin, the northern portion of Bukidnon (Cabanglasan, City of Malaybalay, Lantapan, Talakag, Baungon, Libona, Manolo Fortich, Sumilao, Impasug-Ong, Malitbog), and the northern portion of Lanao del Sur (Tagoloan II, Kapai)

TCWS No.1 (Strong winds prevailing or expected within 36 hours)

Luzon

Catanduanes, Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, the rest of Albay, Marinduque, the southern portion of Quezon (San Antonio, Tiaong, Candelaria, Sariaya, Dolores, Lucena City, Pagbilao, Padre Burgos, Atimonan, Agdangan, Unisan, Gumaca, Plaridel, Pitogo, Lopez, Guinayangan, Buenavista, Catanauan, General Luna, Macalelon, Mulanay, San Narciso, San Andres, San Francisco, Tagawayan, Calauag, Quezon, Alabat, City of Tayabas, Perez), Batangas, the rest of Oriental Mindoro, the rest of Occidental Mindoro, the rest of mainland Palawan including Balabac and Kalayaan Islands

Mindanao

The northern portion of Davao Oriental (Baganga, Cateel, Boston), the northern portion of Davao de Oro (Laak, Mawab, Nabunturan, Montevista, Monkayo, New Bataan, Compostela), the northern portion of Davao del Norte (Talaingod, Santo Tomas, Kapalong, Asuncion, San Isidro, New Corella), the rest of Bukidnon, the rest of Lanao del Norte, the rest of Lanao del Sur, the rest of northern portion of Zamboanga del Norte (Labason, Kalawit, Tampilisan, Liloy, Salug, Godod, Bacungan, Gutalac, Baliguian), the rest of northern portion of Zamboanga del Sur (Bayog, Lakewood, Kumalarang, Guipos, Dumalinao, Tukuran, Ramon Magsaysay, Aurora, Sominot, Tigbao, Labangan, Pagadian City, Midsalip,), and the northern portion of Zamboanga Sibugay (Titay, Ipil, Naga, Kabasalan, Siay, Diplahan, Buug)

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall

- Today through tomorrow early morning: Heavy to torrential rains over Caraga, Central Visayas, Misamis Oriental, Camiguin, Southern Leyte, and Negros Occidental. Moderate to heavy with at times intense rains over Leyte, the southern portions of Eastern Samar and Samar, Zamboanga del Norte, Lanao del Sur, Davao Oriental, Davao de Oro, Davao del Norte, and the rest of Northern Mindanao. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains over Bicol Region, Quezon, and the rest of Visayas, the rest of Zamboanga Peninsula, and mainland Bangsamoro.
- Tomorrow early morning through Saturday early morning: Heavy to intense with at times torrential rains over Central Visayas, Western Visayas, and Palawan including Calamian Islands, Cuyo, and Cagayancillo Islands. Moderate to heavy with at times intense rains over Bicol Region, Zamboanga Peninsula, Quezon, Occidental Mindoro, Oriental

Mindoro, Romblon, Marinduque, Lanao del Norte, Lanao del Sur, and the rest of Visayas. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains over Caraga, the southern portion of Aurora, and the rest of Northern Mindanao.

- Saturday early morning through Sunday early morning: Heavy to torrential rains over Kalayaan Islands. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains over Cagayan Valley, Aurora, Quezon, mainland Palawan and Calamian Islands.
- Under these conditions, scattered to widespread flooding (including flash floods) and rain-induced landslides are expected especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazard as identified in hazard maps, and in localities with significant antecedent rainfall.

Severe Winds

- Winds may reach typhoon strength up to 185 km/h in strength within any of the areas where TCWS #4 is hoisted during the passage of the typhoon. This may cause generally heavy to very heavy damage to structures and vegetation.
- Destructive typhoon-force winds will be experienced within any of the areas where TCWS #3 is in effect. This may bring moderate to heavy damage to structures and vegetation.
- Damaging winds reaching gale- to storm-force strength will be experienced within any of the areas where TCWS #2 is in effect. This may result in generally light to moderate damage to structures and vegetation.
- Strong winds (strong breeze to near gale) with higher gusts will be experienced within any of the areas where TCWS #1 is currently in effect during the passage of the typhoon. This may generally bring up to very light damage to structures and vegetation.

Coastal Inundation

There is a moderate to high risk of storm surge of up to 3.0 m in height which may cause life-threatening flooding in the low-lying coastal areas of Central Visayas, Northern Mindanao, Iloilo, Guimaras, Negros Occidental, Eastern Samar, Southern Leyte, Dinagat Islands, Surigao del Norte, Surigao del Sur, Agusan del Norte, and several localities in the northern portion of Palawan including Calamian, Cuyo and Cagayancillo Islands, Antique, the southern portion of Samar, Leyte, and Davao Oriental. For more information, refer to Storm Surge Warning #4 issued at 5:00 AM today.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

- In the next 24 hours, moderate to very high seas (1.2 to 10.0 m) will be experienced over the seaboard of areas where TCWS is in effect (especially in the open sea areas). These conditions are risky for all types of sea vessels. Mariners are advised to remain in port or take shelter in port until winds and waves subside.
- Under the influence of Typhoon "ODETTE" and the prevailing Northeast Monsoon, a Gale Warning remains in effect for several coastal waters not under any wind signal, specifically the seaboard of Northern Luzon, and the eastern seaboard of Central and Southern Luzon. For more information, refer to Gale Warning #49 issued at 5:00 AM today.
- In the next 24 hours, moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 3.1 m) will also prevail over the remaining seaboard of the country that are not under any wind signal. These conditions are risky for those using small seacrafts. Mariners are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigating in these conditions.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- On the forecast track, Typhoon "ODETTE" will continue moving generally westward or west northwestward over the Philippine Sea and the center of its eye is forecast to make its initial landfall in the vicinity of Siargao-Bucas Grande Islands or Dinagat Islands between 1:00 and 3:00 PM today. Afterwards, the center of "ODETTE" will move westward and cross several provinces in Central and Western Visayas regions before emerging over the Sulu Sea tomorrow morning. After passing near or in the vicinity of either Cuyo or Cagayancillo archipelago, "ODETTE" is forecast to cross the northern or central portion of Palawan tomorrow afternoon or evening before emerging over the West Philippine Sea.
- Typhoon "ODETTE" is forecast to continue intensifying until it makes landfall this afternoon. Considering the recent trend in its intensification, the typhoon may reach a pre-landfall peak intensity of 185 to 195 km/h. "ODETTE" may see some slight weakening as it crosses northeastern Mindanao, Visayas, and Palawan, but it is forecast to remain as a typhoon. Re-intensification is likely once "ODETTE" emerges over the West Philippine Sea. However, weakening may ensue beginning Saturday evening or Sunday as the typhoon becomes exposed to increasing vertical wind shear and the surge of the Northeast Monsoon.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or

very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.

The next tropical cyclone bulletin will be issued at 2:00 PM today.

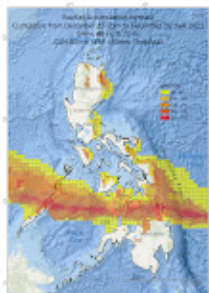
