SA COVID-19 UPDATE MULA SA DEPT OF HEALTH - MIMAROPA CASE MONITORING DASHBOARD NA MAY PETSANG 14 DISYEMBRE: May 10 na nadagdag na bagong kaso ng Covid19 sa rehiyon. Sa pinakahuling monitoring, ang Mimaropa ay may 231 Covid-19 active cases ... Ito ay nasa: Oriental Mindoro 81, Palawan 57, Puerto Princesa City 39, Occ Mindoro 29, Romblon 18, Mduque 7. Mayroon 31 na gumaling, at 3 ang nasawi. Sa kabuuan, nagkaroon na ng 33,695 Covid19 cases sa Mimaropa region; 31,924 ang total recoveries at 1030 ang total deaths sa Covid19.

PIA OCCIDENTAL MINDORO: Bilang bahagi ng pagtiyak sa kaligtasan ng publiko sa buong probinsya kaugnay ng Bagyong Odette, naglabas kahapon ng Executive Order (EO) 26 si Governor Ed Gadiano. Nakasaad sa EO 26 ang pagsususpende ngayong Biyernes, ika-17 ng Disyembre, ng klase sa lahat ng antas, pribado at pampublikong paaralan, gayundin ng pasok sa local, national at private offices. Magpapatuloy naman ang paghahatid ng serbisyo ng mga tanggapang may kinalaman sa basic at health services at ang disaster preparedness and response. (VND)

PIA ORIENTAL MINDORO: Nasa 84 na rolling cargos ang nai-stranded sa kahabaan ng Nautical Hi-way sa Calapan City dahil sa kanseladong biyahe ng mga barko palabas at paparating ng Oriental Mindoro dahil sa nakataas na typhoon signal bunsod ng bagyong si Odette. Dahil sa bantang dulot ng bagyong Odette, suspendido ngayong araw, December 17, 2021 ang pasok sa lahat ng pampubliko at pribadong institusyon maliban na lamang sa mga partikular na tanggapang nakasaad sa atas ng Ehekutibo Blg. 59 na ipinalabas ni Gov. Bonz Dolor. Hinihikayat na ipagpaliban muna ang lahat ng mga Christmas

Party o mga pagtitipon na maaaring magdala ng peligro sa mga dadalo rito. Nasa ilalim ng Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal #2 ang buong lalawigan ng Oriental Mindoro. (LTC)

PIA MARINDUQUE: Kasabay ng mass oath-taking ng mga bagong talaga at promoted na mga kawani ng pamahalaang panlalawigan ng Marinduque, kamakailan ay inanunsyo na rin ni GovPresbitero Velasco Jr. na makatatanggap ang mga ito ng karagdagang insentibo. Kabilang sa ibibigay ang Collective Negotiation Agreement (CNA) at Productivity Enhancement Incentive (PEI) na pormal nang inaprubahan ng Gobernador. Samantala, pasasalamat naman at pagkilala ang ipinagkaloob sa mga retiradong kawani ng Pamahalaang Panlalawigan ng Marinduque.

Ang naturaang parangal ay ibinigay sa mga nagretirong indibidwal ngayong taon. Ayon sa Gobernador, ito umano ay bilang pagkilala at pagpapahalaga sa mga naging ambag ng bawat empleyado na nanatiling matapat sa kanilang sinumpaang tungkulin. (RAMJR)

PIA ROMBLON: Nanatiling walang biyahe ang lahat ng sasakyang pandagat sa probinsya ng Romblon ngayong Biyernes dahil sa banta ng Bagyong Odette. Miyerkules nang kanselahin ang biyahe ng mga barko galing Romblon patungong Masbate, Lucena at Batangas at pabalik dahil sa masamang panahon at sa nakataas na gale warning. Sa huling tala, may aabot sa 8 ang stranded na mga barko sa lalawigan dahil sa bagyo. Wala namang stranded na mga pasahero at mga trucking services dahil maagang nagpalabas ng abiso ang mga shipping lines kaugnay sa kanselasyon ng biyahe. (PJF)

PIA PALAWAN: Suspendido ang pasok sa mga pampublikong opisina at pribadong establisyemento sa mga munisipyo sa bahaging Norte ng Palawan simula sa araw ng Biyernes, Disyembre 17, hanggang sa Linggo, Disyembre 19, bilang paghahanda sa pagpasok ng Bagyong Odette sa lalawigan. Batay ito sa inilabas na Executive Order No. 087, Series of 2021 ng Pamahalaang Panlalawigan ng Palawan kahapon.

Kabilang sa kautusan ang suspensyon sa klase ng mga mag-aaral sa lahat ng antas maging ito man ay limited face to face o online classes. Ipinag-uutos rin ang mandatory at/o forced evacuations sa mga lugar na may panganib ng baha o pagguho ng lupa. Sa Bulletin #16 ng PAGASA, signal #3 ang northern portion ng Palawan (El Nido, Taytay, Araceli, Dumarán, Rocas, San Vicente), Puerto Princesa City at ang mga isla ng Cuyo at Cagayancillo; at signal #2 sa central portion ng Palawan (Narra, Española, Quezon, Aborlan, Rizal, Brookes Point); at signal #1 sa naiiwan pang lugar sa Palawan kabilang ang mga isla sa Calamian at Kalayaan. (OCJ)

PIA MIMAROPA: Umabot na sa 1,377,577 ang nabakunahan sa Mimaropa kasama na rito ang mga nabigyan ng isang dose. Sa ulat ni Dr. Mathew Medrano ng DOH CHD Mimaropa sa pulong ng RTF Covid 19 Mimaropa kahapon, 928,731 ang ganap na ang bakuna (fully vaccinated) at 448,846 ang naturukan na ng unang dose. Ang hahabulin na lang, ayon kay Dr. Medrano, ay 870,972 batay sa kanilang masterlist. Umaasa si Dr. Medrano na mas maraming mababakunahan sa ikalawang National Covid 19 Vaccination Days mula December 20 hanggang 22 sa susunod na linggo. (LP)

TROPICAL CYCLONE BULLETIN NO. 18 🌀

Typhoon “#OdettePH”

Issued at 11:00 AM, 17 December 2021

Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin at 2:00 PM today

“#OdettePH” CONTINUES TO TRAVERSE THE SULU SEA WHILE MOVING WESTWARD TOWARDS PALAWAN.

Location of Center (10:00 AM): The center of the eye of Typhoon “ODETTE” was located based on all available data at 90 km South Southwest of Cuyo, Palawan (10.1°N, 120.7°E)

Intensity: Maximum sustained winds of 155 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 215 km/h, and central pressure of 955 hPa

Present Movement: Westward at 25 km/h

Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds: Strong winds or higher extend outwards up to 480 km from the center

TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNALS (TCWS) IN EFFECT

TCWS No.3 (Destructive typhoon-force winds prevailing or expected within 18 hours)

Luzon

The northern portion of Palawan (El Nido, Taytay, Araceli, Dumarán, Roxas, San Vicente, Puerto Princesa City) including Cagayancillo and Cuyo Islands

Visayas

The southern portion of Iloilo (Tigbauan, Leon, Tubungan, Guimbal, Igaras, Miagao, San Joaquin), the southern portion of Antique (Patnongan, San Remigio, San Jose, Belison, Sibalom, Hamtic, Tobias Fornier, Anini-Y)

TCWS No.2(Damaging gale- to storm-force winds prevailing or expected within 24 hours)

Luzon

The southern portion of Oriental Mindoro (Bansud, Bulalacao, Roxas, Bongabong, Mansalay), the southern portion of Occidental Mindoro (Rizal, San Jose, Magsaysay, Calintaan, Sablayan), the western portion of Romblon (Looc, Ferrol, Santa Fe, San Jose, Alcantara, Santa Maria, Odiongan, San Agustin, San Andres, Calatrava), and the central portion of Palawan (Narra, Sofronio Española, Quezon, Aborlan, Rizal, Brooke's Point) including Kalayaan and Calamian Islands

Visayas

Aklan, Capiz, the rest of Iloilo, the rest of Antique, Guimaras, The northern and central portions of Negros Oriental (Pamplona, City of Tanjay, Santa Catalina, Amlan, San Jose, Sibulan, Valencia, Dauin, Dumaguete City, Bacong, Zamboanguita, Siaton), Negros Occidental

TCWS No.1(Strong winds prevailing or expected within 36 hours)

Luzon

Masbate including Ticao and Burias Islands, Marinduque, the southern portion of Quezon (San Antonio, Tiaong, Candelaria, Sariaya, Dolores, Lucena City, Pagbilao, Padre Burgos, Atimonan, Agdangan, Unisan, Gumaca, Plaridel, Pitogo, Lopez, Buenavista, Catanauan, General Luna, Macalelon, Mulanay, San Narciso, San Andres, San Francisco, City of Tayabas), the

rest of Occidental Mindoro including Lubang Islands, the rest of Oriental Mindoro, the rest of Palawan, the rest of Romblon, and Batangas

Visayas

Cebu including Bantayan and Camotes Islands, Bohol, Biliran, the western portion of Leyte (Isabel, Calubian, Albuera, Matalom, Tabango, Merida, City of Baybay, Villaba, Kananga, Ormoc City, Carigara, Inopacan, Matag-Ob, Palompon, San Isidro, Hilongos, Jaro, Leyte, Capoocan, Bato, Burauen, Tunga, Hindang), the western portion of Southern Leyte (Tomas Oppus, Bontoc, Malitbog, Padre Burgos, Macrohon, City of Maasin, Limasawa), and Siquijor

Mindanao

The northern portion of Zamboanga del Norte (Baliguian, Gutalac, Kalawit, Labason, Liloy, Tampilisan, Salug, Godod, Bacungan, Sindangan, Siayan, Jose Dalman, Manukan, Pres. Manuel A. Roxas, Katipunan, Sergio Osmeña Sr., Dipolog City, Polanco, Piñan, Mutia, Dapitan City, La Libertad, Sibutad, Rizal), and the northern portion of Misamis Occidental (Don Victoriano Chiongbian, Aloran, Oroquieta City, Lopez Jaena, Concepcion, Sapang Dalaga, Calamba, Baliangao, Plaridel) Tropical Cyclone Wind Signals hoisted in areas that are no longer listed herein are hereby lifted.

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall

- Today: Heavy to torrential rains over Western Visayas, Palawan including Calamian, Cuyo, and Cagayancillo Islands, and Negros Oriental. Moderate to heavy with at times intense rains over the Bicol Region, Zamboanga Peninsula, Quezon, and the rest of MIMAROPA. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains over Cagayan Valley, the rest of CALABARZON, Cordillera Administrative Region, Aurora, Lanao del Norte, Misamis Occidental, Lanao del Sur, and the rest of Visayas,
- Tomorrow: Heavy to torrential rains over Kalayaan Islands. Moderate to heavy rains over Catanduanes, Camarines Provinces, Quezon, and Aurora. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains over Cagayan Valley, Cordillera Administrative Region, Eastern Visayas, Rizal, Bulacan, mainland Palawan including Calamian Islands, and the rest of Bicol Region.
- Under these conditions, scattered to widespread flooding (including flash floods) and rain-induced landslides are expected especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazard as identified in hazard maps, and in localities with significant antecedent rainfall.

Severe Winds

- Destructive typhoon-force winds will be experienced within any of the areas where TCWS #3 is in effect. This may bring moderate to heavy damage to structures and vegetation.
- Damaging winds reaching gale- to storm-force strength will be experienced within any of the areas where TCWS #2 is in effect. This may result in generally light to moderate damage to structures and vegetation.
- Strong winds (strong breeze to near gale) with higher gusts will be experienced within any of the areas where TCWS #1 is currently in effect during the passage of the typhoon. This may generally bring up to very light damage to structures and vegetation.

Coastal Inundation

There is a moderate to high risk of storm surge of up to 3.0 m in height in the next 24 hours which may cause life-threatening flooding in the low-lying coastal areas of Negros Provinces, Iloilo, Antique, Guimaras, and several localities in the northern portion of Palawan (including Calamian, Cuyo and Cagayancillo Islands).

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

- In the next 24 hours, moderate to very high seas (1.2 to 10.0 m) will be experienced over the seaboard of areas where TCWS is in effect (especially in the open sea areas). These conditions are risky for all types of sea vessels. Mariners are advised to remain in port or take shelter in port until winds and waves subside.
- Under the influence of Typhoon "ODETTE" and the prevailing Northeast Monsoon, a Gale Warning remains in effect for several coastal waters not under any wind signal, specifically the seaboard of Northern Luzon, and the eastern seaboard of the country. For more information, refer to Gale Warning #51 (Intermediate) issued at 8:00 AM today.
- In the next 24 hours, moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 3.1 m) will also prevail over the remaining seaboard of the country that are not under any wind signal. These conditions are risky for those using small seacrafts. Mariners are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigating in these conditions.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- Moving generally westward, the typhoon is forecast to make landfall in the vicinity of northern or central portion of Palawan this afternoon, re-emerge over the West Philippine Sea tonight, and pass in the vicinity of Kalayaan Islands tomorrow. The typhoon is forecast to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility tomorrow morning or early afternoon.
- "ODETTE" may still see some slight weakening until it crosses Palawan, but it is forecast to remain as a typhoon. Re-intensification is likely once "ODETTE" emerges over the West Philippine Sea. However, continuous weakening may ensue beginning Sunday as the typhoon becomes exposed to increasing vertical wind shear and the surge of the Northeast Monsoon.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.

The next tropical cyclone bulletin will be issued at 2:00 PM today.
