






Weight-for-Age among 0-59 months old children






Weight-for-Age among 0-23 months old children




Height-for-Age among 0-59 months old children






Height-for-Age among 0-23 months old children






Prevalence Rate of Stunting and Severe Stunting among 0-59 months old children (2017-2021) by Province/City






Weight-for-Height among 0-59 months old children






Weight-for-Height among 0-23 months old children



Prevalence Rate of Wasting and Severe Wasting among 0-59 months old children (2017-2021)




Prevalence Rate of Wasting and Severe Wasting among 0-59 months old children (2019-2021) by Province/City

Prevalence Rate of Overweight and Obesity among 0-59 months old children (2017-2021)




Prevalence Rate of Overweight and Obesity among 0-59 months old children (2019-2021) by Province/City
