EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 138

FULL DEVOLUTION OF CERTAIN FUNCTIONS OF THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTS, CREATION OF A COMMITTEE ON DEVOLUTION, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, Section 6, Article X of the Constitution provides that local government units (LGUs) shall have a just share, as determined by law, in the national taxes which shall be automatically released to them;

WHEREAS, in Mandanas, et al. v. Executive Secretary, et al. (G.R. Nos. 199802 and 208488) ("Mandanas"), the Supreme Court held that all collections of national taxes, except those accruing to special purpose funds and special allotments for the utilization and development of the national wealth, should be included in the computation of the base of the just share of LGUs;

WHEREAS, considering the prospective character of the *Mandanas* ruling, and in keeping with Section 284 of Republic Act (RA) No. 7160 or the "Local Government Code of 1991," which states that the share of LGUs in national taxes is based on the collections in the third year preceding the current fiscal year, the adjusted national tax allocations of LGUs shall only start in Fiscal Year (FY) 2022;

FULL DEVOLUTION OF CERTAIN FUNCTIONS OF THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTS, CREATION OF A COMMITTEE ON DEVOLUTION, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Pursuant to Section 7(g) of Executive Order (EO) No. 138 dated 01 June 2021, the following rules and regulations are hereby promulgated and adopted:

RULE I POLICIES AND OBJECTIVES

Section 1. Title. The rules contained herein shall be known and cited as the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of EO No. 138.

Section 2. Declaration of Policy. The National Government (NG) is fully committed to the policy of decentralization enshrined in the Constitution and relevant laws, which are aimed at *(i)* developing capabilities of local governments to deliver basic social services and critical facilities to their constituents, increase productivity and employment, and promote local economic growth; and *(ii)* ensuring accountability, competence,





Rationale/Legal Framework

Republic Act No. 7160 or the Local Government Code of 1991

Sec. 2 (a) "... the State shall provide for a more responsive and accountable local government structure instituted through a **system of decentralization** whereby local government units shall be given more **powers, authority, responsibilities, and resources**."

Sec. 3 (d) " ... the vesting of duty, responsibility, and accountability in local government units shall be accompanied with provision for **reasonably adequate resources** to discharge their powers and effectively carry out their functions..."

• Supreme Court Ruling on the Mandanas-Garcia petitions clarified the basis for the computation of local government just shares of LGUs and ordered NG to include all collections of national taxes in the computation of LGU share

• EO No. 138, S. 2021 LGUs are primarily and ultimately responsible in the implementation and delivery of devolved functions pursuant to LGC, Sec 17 and other laws which subsequently assigned new functions to LGUs



Guiding Principles

- LGs are primarily responsible for providing direct service delivery to their constituencies and will assume greater responsibility and accountability in ensuring the quality of devolved services.
- LGs are expected to strengthen their capacity to exercise stewardship of their increased fiscal resources; enhance their organizational capability for service delivery; and institute transparent, accountable, and participatory mechanisms to better achieve national and local development objectives.
- LGs are encouraged to establish robust partnership with NGA private sector, NGOs, CSOs, POs, and academic institutions as providers of technical expertise and information, innovations, and governance models on service delivery.

LGU Devolution Transition Plans

All provinces, cities, municipalities, and barangays shall prepare their DTPs LGU's roadmap to ensure strategic perspective; systematic and coherent actions towards their full assumption of devolved functions

Foster alignment of priorities and complementation and influence the design of the devolution transition activities of NGAs

Leverage support from other governance stakeholders in cooperative undertakings during the devolution transition period

Guide in the monitoring and performance assessment of LGUs by NGAs, DBM, and DILG



Preparation of the LGU DTPs

- LGU DTP preparation shall be undertaken in close coordination with the NGAs
- Subject to their <u>development priorities</u>, <u>capacities</u>, <u>and resources</u>, <u>and with</u> <u>reference to NGA DTPs</u>
 - 1. identify the responsibilities to fully assume and PPAs of NGAs to absorb
 - 2. prioritize which of these needs scaling-up;
 - 3. adopt a phased approach towards full assumption of devolved responsibilities
- Full assumption of devolved functions and services may entail <u>updating of their</u> <u>OSSP and CapDev Agenda</u>
- LGUs are reminded of the projected decrease in their respective FYs 2023 & 2024 NTA shares due to the effects of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic through the identification of possible revenue sources to address potential gaps.



Preparation of the LGU DTPs

- Higher LGUs to <u>perform oversight functions</u> over component LGUs within their jurisdiction and ensure harmonization and vertical integration of development requirements.
- CC and municipalities to <u>coordinate with province</u> in the development of their CapDev Agenda and in the formulation of the menu of support by the provinces
- Cities and municipalities to <u>guide and support their component barangays</u> in the assumption of their new roles and responsibilities
- LCE to <u>spearhead preparation of LGU DTP</u> and organize the LGU Devolution Transition Committee (LGU DTC) to be responsible for the preparation and monitoring of LGU DTP
- Local Sanggunian to <u>review and approve the LGU DTP</u> through a Sanggunian Resolution





General Policies

- **1. No forced/involuntary separation, termination, or lay off** of permanent national government personnel affected by the full devolution effort;
- **2. No diminution in the basic salaries** of incumbent affected employees who would opt to be transferred to any department/agency within the Executive Branch as a result of the implementation of full devolution under EO No 138;
- 3. Personnel shall enjoy **security of tenure** in the agencies where they have been transferred to as a result of the implementation of full devolution under EO No 138;



General Policies

- 4. Positions of personnel who may be affected by the full devolution effort and will not opt to retire or separate from the service shall be marked coterminous with the incumbent (CTI);
- 5. Option to be taken by an affected employee pursuant to Section 12 of EO No 138 is considered final once the department/agency/GOCC Devolution Transition Plan (DTP) is approved by the DBM, and shall preclude the availment of other options;






- 7. Hiring by the LGUs of affected personnel from the NGAs shall be subject to the related provisions of RA No 7160 (Local Government Code of 1991 and Civil Service Law, rules, and regulation; and
- 8. Any internal operationalization guidelines that may be instituted or issued by departments/agencies/GOCCs concerned shall be made consistent with the provisions of the JMC.







What is EO No. 138, s. 2021?

EO No. 138, s. 2021 was issued to support the efficient

implementation of the Supreme Court Ruling on the

Mandanas-Garcia case and strengthen the autonomy and empowerment of local government units (LGUs).

It directs the full devolution of certain functions of the Executive Branch to the LGUs. It also provides for the

creation of a Committee on Devolution to monitor the

implementation of said EO.

Which government entities are covered by this EO?

All LGUs Departments/Agencies/Instrumentalities of

the Executive Branch whose functions are in line with the devolved functions of the LGUs under Section 17 of RA No. 7160 and other pertinent laws.

Is the BARMM covered by this EO?

What is the Supreme Court (SC) Ruling on the Mandanas-Garcia Case?

In 2018, the SC ruled that the just share of LGUs from the national taxes is not limited to "national internal revenue taxes" collected by the Bureau of Internal Revenue but includes collections (customs duties) of the Bureau of Customs, and other tax collecting agencies. With the expected increase in the just shares of LGUs, they will be better equipped
