SUBJECT	REQUEST FOR PARTICIPANTS TO THE TRAINING ON RISI PROFILING AND MANAGEMENT TO ENHANCI

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), through the Biodiversity Management Bureau (BMB), is executing the DENR-Asian Development Bank (ADB)/Global Environment Facility (GEF) Project on Combating Environmental Organized Crime in the Philippines or IWT Project. The Project aims to combat illegal wildlife trade through: a) legal, policy and regulatory reforms; b) capacity building through the law enforcement chain; and c) reduction of demand for illegal wildlife, parts and derivatives.

INTERCEPTION OF ILLEGAL WILDLIFE TRADE

Among the activities done under the Project are various trainings on Basic Wildlife Law Enforcement and the assessments of some seaports for readiness to address wildlife trafficking using the Port Monitoring and Anti-Trafficking Evaluation (PortMATE) Tool.

One of the key findings in the port assessments is the lack of a risk profiling system complemented with wildlife crime risk indicators that port and customs agencies and other port stakeholders can refer to or use to efficiently intercept illegal wildlife trade. Thus, it was recommended that a training be conducted to address this limitation.

In view of the above, DENR-BMB, UNODC, BOC and the DENR-ADB/GEF Project are coorganizing the **Training on Risk Profiling and Management to Enhance Interception of Illegal Wildlife Trade** scheduled on **12-14 October**, **8:30 AM– 4:30PM via Zoom**.

The proposed training aims to provide participants with better understanding of risk profiling and management, and identify wildlife crime risk indicators, and their relation to the transnational nature of illegal wildlife trade. It will be delivered by international trainers from UNODC, via lectures and practical exercises.
