WITNESSETH: That

WHEREAS, FY 2018 General Appropriations Act, Volume IA, X. DENR, A. Office of the Secretary, Special Provisions, Item Number 5b. National Greening Program states that the amount of Fifty Million Pesos (Php 50,000,000) shall be used for the planting activities and site maintenance and protection of nipa palm trees, including mangrove reforestation for the coastal campuses of state universities and colleges;

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 192, Series of 1987, mandates the Department of Environmental and Natural Resources (DENR) to serve as the primary government agency responsible for the sustainable management and development of the country's natural resources;

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 193 expanded the implementation of the National Greening Program (NGP) as a government priority in order to pursue sustainable development for poverty reduction, food security, biodiversity conservation, and climate change mitigation and adaptation, with DENR as lead agency;

WHEREAS, the executive issuance further recognize the need to harmonize all greening efforts being undertaken by the government, civil society and the private sector to achieve the objectives of the Expanded National Greening Program (ENGP);

WHEREAS, there is a need to harness concerted support, consolidate resources and efforts toward successful implementation of the government's poverty reduction programs that would achieve economic development in rural communities while safeguarding the environment.

WHEREAS, nipa, a mangrove species is a promising source of bioethanol is being explored by MMSU, ASU, CLSU, CSU, MSC, PSU, UA and WPU to augment the shortage of locally produced bioethanol as required by RA 9367 known as Biofuels Act of 2006 and also to vertically integrate the farmers in the biofuel industry;

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises and the mutual covenants herein set forth, the parties stipulate and agree as follows:

ARTICLE I ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PARTIES

A. The DENR through its Regional Offices concerned shall:

- 1. Jointly with the abovementioned SUC's within their jurisdiction, identify available and suitable areas for the nipa plantation development and mangrove reforestation for
- Conduct survey, mapping and planning (SMP) for the identified sites and prepare the maps/shapefiles for development;

3. Jointly with the SUC's conduct regular monitoring of the established plantations;

4. Provide assistance in seed sourcing, collection, processing and storage as well as establishment of nipa nurseries and facilities.

5. Provide technical assistance in the selection or profile of species to be planted, based on existing DENR research outputs, experiences and policies.

6. Provide such other available support to help ensure the successful establishment and operation of the nipa nursery as well as implementation of the NGP.

7. Allocate and provide funds for the development of nipa plantation and mangrove reforestation by the SUC's based on the approved Work and Financial Plan, which will form part of this agreement, subject to existing accounting and auditing laws, rules and regulations.

B. The 8 above-named SUC's (MMSU, ASU, CLSU, CSU, MSC, PSU, UA, WPU) shall:

1. Prepare the required Work and Financial Plan for the implementation of their target;

2. Provide such other available support to help ensure the successful establishment and operation of the nipa nursery as well as implementation of the NGP;

3. Establish nipa plantation and conduct enhancement planting and other activities related to nipa plantation development, and mangrove reforestation in coastal campuses as indicated in the approved Work and Financial Plan (WFP);

4. Jointly conduct regular monitoring of the progress of project implementation;

Issue Official Receipt for the funds transferred by the DENR and maintain separate subsidiary record/ledger for the fund transfer pertaining to the project;

6. Use the funds allocated and released by the DENR solely for the project and maintain Financial and Accounting records for the funds in accordance with existing accounting and auditing laws, rules and regulations;

7. Make available all records and files pertaining to transactions involving the fund upon

request of the Commission on Audit (COA) Auditor;

8. Take full responsibility in the proper disposition and disbursement of funds in accordance with COA rules and regulations;

9. Prepare and submit to the DENR Quarterly Physical and Financial Reports and a Final Accomplishment Report on the progress of the different activities based on the approved WFP, complying with the following schedules:

a. Quarterly Reports to be submitted on or before the last day of the months of

March, June, September and December; and

b. An Accomplishment Report to be submitted on or before the 31st day of December.

10. Submit geo-tagged photos, taken at a spatial resolution of 2-4 cm per pixel with time stamp, shapefiles, report on areas and seedlings planted to the DENR on a quarterly basis;

11. Return to DENR any unused funds or savings generated after the duration of the agreement with corresponding official receipts;

12 Submit information on best practices and research findings to DENR, through the Final Accomplishment Report;

- 13. Jointly with the DENR, formulate a monitoring and evaluation scheme to assess the progress of this undertaking.
- 14. Meet regularly with DENR and other stakeholders involved to identify problem areas, if any, and resolve the same.
- 15. The MMSU shall be the lead state university to oversee the implementation of the nipa development project by the other SUC's

ARTICLE II **FUNDING**

In line with FY 2018 General Appropriations Act, Volume IA, X. DENR, A. Office of the Secretary, Special Provisions Item Number 5b. National Greening Program, Provided, That, DENR shall allocate Php 50,000,000.00 for planting activities and site maintenance and protection of nipa palm trees, including mangrove reforestation for the coastal campuses of State Universities and Colleges.

The eight (8) SUCs shall be provided with funds, the corresponding Work and Financial Plan shall be prepared and submitted for approval which will form part of the agreement.



ARTICLE III AMENDMENTS AND MODIFICATION OF THE AGREEMENT

No modification of this MOA or any part of the Agreement or consent to deviate therefrom shall be valid, unless such variation or modification is in writing and has been signed by the parties and such variation, modification, or consent shall be valid only for a specific case and for the purpose or which and the extent to which it was made or given.

ARTICLE IV TERMINATION

Either party may terminate this Agreement with cause by giving the other party thirty (30) days prior notice of its intention to do so.

ARTICLE V DISPUTE RESOLUTION

In the event of any doubtful issues that maybe raised concerning certain provisions of this Agreement, the Parties shall immediately exert best efforts to settle the same amicably. Otherwise, said issue will be settled through arbitration and/or non-adversarial alternative dispute resolution process.

ARTICLE VI INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

Unless agreed otherwise between the parties, all INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY resulting from, or developed during the PROJECT, shall be owned jointly and equally by the parties.

ARTICLE VII Separability Clause

If any provision of these Memorandum of Agreement are declared unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity and effectivity of the other provisions hereof.
