C. Message

DIR. III LAUREFEL P GABALES, Chairman of the Regional ICAD/ROCBDC/ROCBS, and Regional Director of PDEA MIMAROPA, welcomed the members and guests present.

Thereafter, he rendered an opening message. Giving emphasis on the participation of all members of the MIMAROPA Regional ICAD Coordinating Group in attaining the goal of MIMAROPA region as the "First Drug-Cleared Region" by 2022.

D. Approval of the Calendar of Business

The proposed agenda was approved as presented.

E. Approval of the Minutes of the 3rd Quarter Joint RICG and ROCBDC, ROCBS and ROCJDO Virtual Meeting

On motion duly seconded, the minutes of the previous meeting was approved.

F. Agenda

1. Regional Drug Situation & Updates on BDCO & BALAY SILANGAN

DIR II LAURA P NEBATO, ARD/Head, RBDCPT, presented the Regional Drug Situation of MIMAROPA from January to March 2021. Discussed were the following:

 Drug of Choice- Methamphetamine Hydrochloride or Shabu is the no. 1 drug of choice in the region followed by Cannabis Sativa or Marijuana. There is an emerging drug which is the Cannabis vape oil which was confiscated during an anti- illegal drug operation on July 2020 at Puerto Galera, Oriental Mindoro;

- Illicit Trafficking/ Drug Routes- The drugs brought to the Region thru airports, our numerous seaports, mail and parcel services, and our vast coastlines are the entry and transshipment point of illegal drugs operation.
- Supply Reduction Accomplishment from January to March, 2021-Based on Operational Report Management Information System (PORMIS), a total of 132 positive negation operations, 127 drug personalities arrested and 23 high value targets arrested. For the volume of drug seized in the region, there is a total of 218.2318 grams Shabu, 633.0658 grams marijuana dried leaves, 29 pcs. Marijuana plants uprooted and 250 ML marijuana oil both from separate interdiction operations.
- Demand Reduction Accomplishment- For the region's anti-illegal drugs advocacy campaigns, there is a total of 336 lectures, seminars, symposia and guest speakership conducted, 133 conferences/ meetings attended, 27 other advocacy campaign activities 660 multimedia efforts and 279,950 audiences reached in PECI activities, and multi-media efforts. Further presented was the PDEA official teleradio program, Drug Buster on Air, "We sail ,We Fly, We Bust "which is broadcasted every last Wednesday of the month at DZSB 104.1 Spirit FM, Calapan City form 10:30-11:00 AM;
- Barangay Drug Clearing Accomplishment from (January 2017 to present) - In MIMAROPA, out of 1, 460 barangays, there are 338 certified drug unaffected, 921 are Drug-Cleared and 201 remaining drug affected barangays;
- Balay Silangan Reformation Center (2018 to present) There are 357
 Balay Silangan graduates in the region.
- Tentative scheduled of deliberation/declaration & validation for FY 2021

- April 27, 2021 (Deliberation/Validation)
October 2021 (Deliberation/Validation)

-June & November 2021 (Deliberation/Validation)

Occidental Mindoro -May & November 2021 (Deliberation/Validation)

Dra. Sahlee Montevirgen-Sajo of DOH MIMAROPA reported that her Office has not yet received self-evaluation from the LGUs with regard to their General Intervention (GI) and CBDRPs pursuant to DDB Regulation No. 4, Series of 2020 and this might affect the scheduled deliberation and validation on April 27.

Ms. Myla Panganiban of DILG MIMAROPA said that the DILG Central Office has already prepared a Memorandum Circular for all LGUs to conduct self-evaluation of this GIs and CBDRPs for accreditation of the DOH MIMAROPA.

2. Guidelines in the Validation Process of Barangays with Drug-Cleared

Ms. Lano extensively discussed Agency Memorandum Circular No. 2021-003 re Validation Process of Barangays with Drug-Cleared Status

- Issuance of Certified Inventory of Drug Personalities (CIDP) The PDEA Investigation and Intelligence Service (IIS) shall issue a CIDP to barangays with Drug-Cleared Status as a basis in the conduct of
- Issuance of resolution on the presence of active drug personalities ROCBDC to Barangay Anti-Drug Abuse Council (BADAC) - The ROCBDC shall issue a Resolution stating the presence of Active Drug

Managed by the DOH Accredited MHO/CHO using approved DOH

- b) Community Based Drug Rehabilitation Program (CBDRP);
- c) Drug Treatment and Rehabilitation Center (DTRC)

Managed by the Local Government Unit (LGU):

- Categorizing of identified individuals listed in the CIDP- This is assigning color codes to interventions undertaken by individual listed in the CIDP for easy reference, identification and management as per MC
- Deliberation and Conferment of Retention of Drug-Cleared Status;
- Reportorial Requirements- Post ROCBDC Deliberation Reports shall be in accordance to the provisions of MC 2020-041 except for the submission of Certificates of Drug-Cleared Barangays.

Dir Rosalie Escobin, Deputy Regional Director of NICA inquired about the meaning of color coded in the CIDP. Ms. Lano clarified each color and the corresponding intervention/status of each drug personality in the CIDP. Further, Dir Escobin inquired if stated in the red category the case status of

Engr. Manuel B Wong, RD TESDA asked the action taken of PDEA to those personalities who belong in the white category. ARD Laura P Nebato answered that the ROC thru a letter will notify the Barangay Captain of the current address of drug personalities who transferred residence.

3. Update On Plea Bargaining Agreement

Assistant Regional Prosecutor, Atty. Rogelio Radoc Jr., said that the DOJ opposed the Motion for Plea Bargaining filed by the accused but the court overruled our opposition. However, the decision of Supreme Court in the case of People vs Omprado, the Supreme Court ruled that the Regional Trial Court cannot allowed Plea Bargaining in violation of Section 5 to Section 12 in order to declogged the court dockets.

4. Updates on Plans, Programs & Activities of RICG Advocacy Cluster

Ms. Myla Panganiban of DILG MIMAROPA presented update on plans, programs and activities of RICG Advocacy Cluster. On her presentation, Ms. Panganibang said that the Advocacy Cluster conducts its regular monthly meeting. For the first quarter, the Cluster conducted meetings on January 29, February 26, and March 26, 2021, respectively.

Further, DILG MIMAROPA organized ICAD Advocacy Cluster Slogan and Poster Making contest last March. The theme "In achieving a DRUG-FREE community the fight starts with ME" was chosen based on the votes of the member. The twenty-one (21) entries of the Slogan and Poster Making contest were posted thru the DILG MIMAROPA public page and receives 25,106 total heart reactions.

Ms. Panganiban said that the DILG being the Chair of Advocacy Cluster will be conducting this year 2019 ADAC Performance Audit and also the 2019-2020 BADAC Functionality Audit, targeting 78 LGU's composed of Province, Cities and Municipalities and 1,460 barangays to be audit on the functionality of their council target date on the second quarter of this year. The 2020 assessment will be finished on the 3rd quarter of this year.

Ms. Panganiban also said that during the previous meetings, the member of the Advocacy Cluster presented their plans, programs and activities for advocacy on anti-illegal drug as follows:

- PDEA- Distribution of PDEA Comics; Online lectures; newsletterr; tele-radio program, Partnership with DepEd through School Health & Social Mobilization & Networking Sections thru MOA; and Monthly Community Involvement/Outreach Activities.
- PNP- symposium or tokhang; social media operation; tv-radio interview or press release; for Reorientation on screening, brief intervention and referral to treatment among PDOHO personnel and technical support for DDAPTP
- TESDA- Advocacy campaign for staff; trainers and students of TESDA training centers in Oriental Mindoro as part of the TESDA AYAW SA DROGA campaign of the agency; Slogan and poster-making contest on November 2021 in celebration of the Drug Abuse Prevention and Control week; and Seminars on drug awareness and prevention.
- DSWD- Regional Juvenile Justice and Welfare Council Advocacy and Mobilization Plan; and Orientation on Guidelines in Handling Children Allegedly Involved in Dangerous Drugs.

- DEPED- NATIONAL DRUG EDUCATION PROGRAM (NDEP), a comprehensive educational program which provides a holistic approach in preventing and eliminating the menace of drugs in the country; Distribution of PDEA comics to public elementary and secondary schools; Preparation of IEC materials on anti-illegal drug; and Webinar on substance abuse and prevention for teachers.
- PSA- Online lectures on drug awareness to their employees with resource person from PDEA and Zumba Kontra Droga.

Part of the agreement last meeting was the creation of the Regional ICAD Advocacy Cluster Facebook Page, the DILG is ongoing on the creation of the social media Facebook page. Advocacy Cluster also planning to have a Quarterly Anti-Illegal Drugs Advocacy Contest.

5. Updates on the Implementation of DDB Regulation No.4 Series of 2020/ Training-Workshop on ASSIST

All General interventions and Community-Based Drug Rehabilitation Programs implemented by the LGUs or partner agencies and organizations must be documented and certified in compliance with the minimum service requirements provided in the DOH Administrative Orders and relevant DDB Regulations.

- The LGU Anti-Drug Abuse Council, in coordination with the designated Focal Person and the respective Provincial/City/Municipal Health Office, where the PWUDs reside, shall collate and perform self-evaluation of existing intervention programs for PWUDs, implemented in their respective areas of jurisdiction, using the CBDRP checklist (Annex A) provided for by the DOH;
- 2. Upon satisfactory (85%) compliance and availability of services required in the checklist (Annex A), which must contain both treatment and social support programs, the Barangay ADAC shall submit a copy_of the intervention programs being provided at their level to the City/Municipal ADAC for further submission to the Regional Dangerous Drug Abuse Prevention and Treatment Program (RDDAPTP) Coordinator of the DOH. Below 85% compliance refer to DILG audit team for further assessment and support
- 3. The DOH, through the Regional Dangerous Drug Abuse Prevention and Treatment Program units shall evaluate the programs being provided based on the minimum requirements prescribed by Board Regulation No. 7, Series of 2019 (ANNEX B) guided the UNODC Principles of Treatment, Board Regulation No. 6, Series of 2019 (ANNEX C) and the DOH AOs 2018-17 (ANNEX D) and 2019-21 (ANNEX E) respectively.
- SURVEILLANCE DRUG TEST
 - Therapeutic monitoring
 - At least thrice during the duration of IP

Other Matters

Dir Gabales discussed the other cluster of the RICG and requested that to reorganize/reactivate these organized/reactivate Law Enforcement, Justice and Rehabilitation and Reintegration ICAD Clusters. Copies of Executive Order No.15 re

(Creation of Inter-Agency Committee on Anti-illegal Drugs (ICAD) and Anti-illegal Drug 298 Task force to Suppress the Drug Problem in the Country" and PDEA Agency 299 Memorandum Circular No. 2018-023 re "Creation of Regional Inter-Agency Committee 300 on ntiOlllegal Drugs Coordinating Group (RICG)" will be forwarded to all concerned 301 Cluster Agencies for their reference. 302 303 G.
