





RDP Chapter 20: Ensuring Ecological Integrity, Clean and Healthy Environment

ASSESSMENT

The overall performance of the region from 2017-2020 in terms of management of the environment and natural resources has successes and misses based on the Regional Development Plan (RDP) 2017-2022 targets. The collaborative efforts of the government and private sectors contributed to the sectors' improved performance while ensuring environmental balance.

CHALLENGES

Among the sector challenges in MIMAROPA include: (1) Inadequate ENR data for planning, programming, and policy regulations, (2) Enforcement of environmental laws, (3) Environmental Degradation, (4) Air and water quality monitoring, (5) Hazardous waste management disposal, and (6) Disaster risk management.

STRATEGIES TO ADDRESS THE CHALLENGES

(1) establishment of ENR database, (2) encourage community-based participatory activities in the implementation of environmental laws, (3) conduct of inventory of the region's with critical hotspots, (4) provision of additional air and water quality monitoring stations in the region, (5) strict compliance of health care facilities with the standard for hazardous waste management and (6) revisions of the implementing rules and regulations of the Philippine DRRM Act 2010 (RA 10121) to explicitly identify public health emergencies such as pandemics in the definition of disaster events.







Major ENR Programs, Activities, and Projects

National Greening Program	In MIMAROPA, for CY 2020 a total of 12,323 hectares benefitted from the maintenance and protection activities of the program covering the NGP established plantations in 2018 and 2019. Out of the 12,323 hectares, a total of 6,426 hectares benefitted from Palawan
Water Quality Management Area	In MIMAROPA, there are three waterbodies officially designated as WQMA (Coron Bay in Palawan, Sabang Bay in Puerto Galera, and Calapan River in Oriental Mindoro) and one is undergoing designation (Bacuit Bay in Palawan)
Ecological Solid Waste Management Program	As to date, out of the 78 LGUs in the region (including the 5 provinces) 38 has approved 10-year Solid Waste Management Plans (SWMPs). For Palawan, 15 municipalities and 1 for the province has approved SWMPs
Integrated Watershed Management Plan	On December 2020, the IWMP of Caguray Watershed in Occidental Mindoro and Bansud River Watershed was finalized and submitted to DENR MIMAROPA.
Climate Change-Responsive Integrated River Basin Management and Development Master Plan	The formulation of Climate Change-Responsive Integrated River Basin Management and Development Master Plan for 8 clustered river basins by the University of the Philippines included MIMAROPA particularly the provinces of Oriental Mindoro and Palawan
Rapid Land Tenure Appraisal	As of 2020, 19 barangays in Roxas, Oriental Mindoro was accomplished.









Moving Forward:

- A balance economic growth and environmental conservation and protection to optimize the possible gains of sustainable development;
- Safety nets shall also be developed and put in place to mitigate environmental degradation, over exploitation, and damaging uses of the region's resources;
- The region needs to strengthen the role of PAMBs in the management and protection of the protected areas;
- The new normal setting requires a strengthened and innovative actions from the government and private sectors in curbing solutions without prejudicing the risks posed by COVID-19 on environmental sustainability while ensuring public health; and
- Promotion of green spaces in major urban areas through urban forestry activities be strengthened


