This is in compliance with your Memorandum dated March 22, 2021 received by this Office on May 4, 2021 relative to the above stated subject.

Respectfully submitted are the MoVs of the existing tenurial instruments with issues and concern except for Socialized Industrial Forest Management Agreement (SIFMA) awarded to Palawan State University (PSU) of which about 62.87% of the area overlaps with Mt. Mantalingahan Protected Landscape (MMPL).

Please be informed that this Office conducted initial assessment and perimeter survey on the area developed adjacent to the awarded SIFMA as replacement to the area that overlaps with the MMPL.

Likewise, this Office recommends that the CBFM agreement awarded to Bugon Multi-Purpose Cooperative (BMPC) be **CANCELLED** considering that the 32% of the area is within A&D land and already titled to different individuals. Further, some of the officers/officials of BMPC passed away and most of the surviving members are now inactive, therefore, no members took over the duties and responsibilities of the organization.
