GRAVEL EXTRACTION IN CORON, PALAWAN

Pursuant to Travel Order No. 2022-001, the undersigned – Mines and Geosciences Bureau (MGB) embedded Casandra Lynda Jalac; Office Support Staff/Bantay Gubat Romel Gacayan; and Forest Technician I Reniel Oliver Fuentes, conducted an inspection on river dredging and sand and gravel extraction in Coron, Palawan last 21 March 2022 in the barangays of Guadalupe, San Nicolas, Decalachao, and San Jose.

Background Information

The MGB embedded personnel received an order from the Regional Director of the Mines and Geosciences Bureau MIMAROPA – Edwin Mojares, Ph.D to conduct an investigation regarding dredging and river quarrying in Coron, Palawan. This is in connection with the complaints of the citizens of Coron on quarry and reclamation.

Purpose and Scope

The fieldwork aims to verify the veracity of the abovementioned activities. To create a database regarding dredging and sand and gravel and to note the following operator(s)/person(s) conducting such activities. Furthermore, to recommend necessary actions.

Findings and Observations

The following subject areas are located within four (4) barangays of Coron, Palawan namely: Guadalupe, San Nicolas, Decalachao, and San Jose (Figure 1). It was observed that there is no dredging activity in Coron but rather sand and gravel extraction. Based on the information gathered, the sand and gravel quarried in the mentioned areas are for the new international airport being constructed in Busuanga, the National Housing Authority (NHA) housing project, and for the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) road projects. The subject areas can be accessed through national highways and barangay roads.

Barangay Guadalupe

- The river quarry is found along the Umaya River, Brgy. Guadalupe, Coron (GPS: 12° 03' 53" N, 120° 09' 34" E). This is located within the 40 hectares of Busuanga Pasture Reserve (BPR) land. It is ~9 km away from CENRO which can be reached within a 10-minute car drive.
- It was found that BCT Construction Inc. is the operator of this sand and gravel extraction. Based on the previous reports of the former MGB and EMB embedded personnel, BCT is operating with an approved ECC but without a quarry permit.
- On 24 March 2021, a cease and desist (CDO) was issued by MGB in violation of Section 103 of the Republic Act (RA) 7942 ("Theft of Minerals") and other applicable provisions of the same RA and DENR Administrative Order (DAO) 2010-21 (see Annex).
- 4. Upon arrival in the subject area, no ongoing extraction was observed. However, there are sacks of sand, *salandra*, and a backhoe in the area. Moreover, stockpiles of sand and gravel, possible recent excavation along the riverbank, and probably recent truck tracks were noted. These may suggest that there is an ongoing quarry activity in the area (*see Photo Documentation 01*).
- 5. Based on the information gathered from the locals at the time of inspection, these sand and gravel are used for making culverts and posts for DPWH road projects. These materials were observed in the area (see Photo Documentation 01).
- 6. Currently, some part of the river is blocked by sediments. As a result, the flow of the river is slightly jammed. This may cause to exacerbate the flooding in the Umaya River.

San Nicolas

- The subject area is geographically situated at 12° 05' 01" N, 120° 11' 56" E. It is ~15 km away from CENRO and can be reached within a 20-minute drive.
- Based on the information gathered, this area is quarried by Kap. Nacachi. The sand and gravel excavated are for the NHA housing project in San Nicolas. At present, they are in stopped operation.
- 3. This was confirmed during the investigation as no quarry equipment nor sacks of sand and gravel are observed in the area. However, the area is left abandoned. As a result, the flow of the river is blocked by sediments. This may heighten the flooding in the area (see Photo Documentation 02).

Brgy. Decalachao

PACECO AREA

- The subject area is geographically located at 12° 07' 35" N, 120° 01' 54" E. It also lies inside BPR but within PACECO. PACECO is a portion of BPR that has a Certificate of Land Ownership Award (CLOA). Approximately, it is 30 km away from CENRO and can be reached in less than an hour drive.
- 2. The undersigned first paid a courtesy to the barangay to discuss the purpose of the activity and to interview a barangay official. According to Kgwd. Philip Palanos, the OIC during the visit, there are no dredging and quarrying activities within their jurisdiction. He further stated that the sand and gravel operations in Brgy. Decalachao stopped in 2018.
- Based on the Forest Management Bureau (FMB-Coron), which oversees BPR, there
 were some trucks found extracting before in the subject area. However, they further
 stated these trucks are not in operation now.
- This was confirmed upon arrival in the area. No quarry equipment nor salandra were observed. However, old truck tracks were noted. Additionally, old piling stations were present.
- Unfortunately, the operator left the area without rehabilitating it (see Photo Documentation 02). This operator was not also confirmed as no concrete evidence was found.
- 6. As a result, the river is blocked by the leftover piles of sediments. The present dimension of the river is also compromised. This may pose a hazard to the residents near the area as river swelling will be rapid during the rainy season (see Photo Documentation 02).

> Papualan River

 This area is located within BPR at 12° 07' 25" N, 120° 02' 11" E. Approximately, it is 30 km away from CENRO and can be reached in less than an hour drive.

- As previously stated by Kgwd. Palanos, there was no quarry and dredging in Brgy. Decalachao. This, however, contradicts the previous report of the former MGB and EMB embedded last 2021. MGB and EMB were able to document the illegal operation of BCT Construction Inc. in Papualan River.
- On 22 June 2021, BCT Construction Inc. was issued a CDO for violating Section 103 of RA No. 7942 and extracting illegally sourced minerals/mineral products (Section 116 of DAO 2010-21).
- 4. Based on the investigation, the company has still haven't done rehabilitation in the area. The company hasn't fixed the bridge that was damaged during the transport of excavated material. Moreover, the river is still blocked by old stockpile sediments and the river depth is still shallow. As the area is prone to flooding, the area must be rehabilitated immediately (see Photo Documentation 03).

Brgy. San Jose

- The quarry area is situated at Sitio Baboy (GPS:12° 09' 47" N, 120° 01' 42" E) and Sitio Kawayan (GPS:12° 09' 22" N, 120° 01' 44" E). Both stations are within BPR. It is ~32 km away from CENRO and can be reached within a 1-hour drive.
- Based on the interview with Kap. Edgar Villareal, BCT Construction Inc. is currently
 doing sand and gravel extraction in the area. He further stated that their operation only
 lasts for a couple of months mostly during summer. Other barangay officials further
 stated that the sand and gravel are for the new airport being constructed in Busuanga.
- 3. The undersigned also discovered that the sand and gravel extracted here are delivered to Sitio Tulbuan, Brgy. Decalachao. At Tulbuan, segregating equipment, backhoe, and salandra are observed. Huge piles of SAG are also present (see Photo Documentation 04).
- 4. During the investigation, there was no ongoing excavation of the area. A parked backhoe, however, was observed. Stockpiles of sand excavated riverbanks and blocked river are among those we saw (see Photo Documentation 04). No ECC was also posted near the area.
- In this area, the river is heavily disrupted. It was even cut as the excavated materials
 were dumped in the river. This result in some part of the river being stagnant. Trees
 along the riverbank were also damaged (see Photo Documentation 04).

Comments and Recommendations

Barangay Guadalupe

 The CDO released last 24 March 2021 should be reiterated to BCT Construction Inc. If proven still conducting an excavation, the company is recommended to be penalized.

- Based on the present list of quarry permit holders of PMRB, BCT Construction Inc. have no legal rights to extract SAG in Brgy. Guadalupe. This, therefore, violates Section 103 of RA 7942 which states that,
 - Theft of Minerals Any person extracting minerals and disposing the same without mining agreement, lease, permit, license, or steals minerals or ores or the products thereof from mines or mills or processing plants shall, upon conviction, be imprisoned from six (6) months to six (6) years or pay a fine from ten thousand pesos (Php 10, 000.00) to twenty thousand pesos (Php 20,000.00), or both, at the discretion of the appropriate court. In addition, he shall be liable to pay damages and compensation for the minerals removed, extracted, and disposed of XXX
- The extracted materials in the areas are considered illegally sourced mineral/mineral products. Based on Section 116 Chapter XII of DAO 2010-21,
 - Illegally sourced minerals/mineral products are those which are mined, extracted, removed, and/or disposed of without the authority or permit under existing mining laws, rules and regulations.
- Lastly, it is suggested that the company also rehabilitate the area to minimize the flooding in the area.

Barangay San Nicolas

 Based on the investigation, the operator is suggested to rehabilitate the area to lessen flooding in the subject area.

Barangay Decalachao

> PACECO

- Further investigation to confirm the company that formerly operated in this area. The PMRB is also requested to help investigate this site
- 2. At present, there is no valid quarry permit holder in PACECO. The company therefore extracted illegally sourced mineral/mineral products (*refer to Section 110 Chapter XII of DAO 2010-21*). Furthermore, if proven that the company operated without a quarry permit, the company violated Section 103 of RA 7942.
- 3. It is recommended that the company should rehabilitate the area to minimize flooding.
- Papualan River
- 1. Based on the investigation, BCT Construction Inc. is recommended to rehabilitate the area to decrease the effect of flooding in the area.

Barangay San Jose

- Based on the present list of quarry permit holders of PMRB, BCT Construction Inc. have no legal rights to extract sand and gravel in Brgy. San Jose. This violates Section 103 of RA 7942.
- Since there is no permit, the extracted materials in the areas are considered illegally sourced mineral/mineral products (refer to Section 116 Chapter XII of DAO 2010-21).
- Additionally, an improper extraction method is observed during the ocular inspection.
 It is recommended that the entire area be inspected further to evaluate other possible violations.
- The contractor is also advised to first secure the necessary permits before conducting extraction of sand and gravel.
- As the regulatory board, Provincial Mining Regulatory Board (PMRB-Coron) should help MGB to monitor such activities to ensure that the company complies with the law.













Dear Mr. T. G. Tiotangco:

This refers to the investigation report dated 26 February 2021 by the technical personnel of CENRO – Coron, re: "Investigation Report on the Alleged Illegal Sand and Gravel Operation at Umaya River, Brgy. Guadalupe, Coron, Palawan."

The corresponding investigation results confirmed that BCT Construction Inc. is engaged in the illegal sand and gravel activity at Umaya River, Barangay Guadalupe, Coron, Palawan.

Please be informed that Section 103 of Republic Act (RA) No. 7942, otherwise known as the *Philippine Mining Act of 1995*, provides that:

"Any person extracting minerals and disposing the same without a mining agreement, lease, permit, license, or steals minerals or ores or the products thereof from mines or mills or processing plants shall, upon conviction, be imprisoned from six (6) months to six (6) years or pay a fine from Ten thousand pesos (P10,000.00) to Twenty thousand pesos (P20,000.00), or both, at the discretion of the appropriate court. In addition, he shall be liable to pay damages and compensation for the minerals removed, extracted, and disposed of xxx."

Hence, you hereby ordered to immediately CEASE AND DESIST from conducting sand and gravel activities in the area without the necessary mining permit. This is without prejudice to the filing of appropriate charges against your company with the proper court for violation of the applicable provisions of RA No. 7942 and DENR Administrative Order No. 2010-21.
