BASIC INTELLIGENCE SEMINAR FOR ENVIRONMENTAL LAW ENFORCERS

May 23 to 29, 2022 Antipolo City

SEMINAR DESCRIPTION

This seminar aims to equip DENR enforcement personnel with the fundamental knowledge, skills, proper attitude, and discipline required in the performance of their duties and responsibilities as environmental enforcers. This training aims to effectuate the effective enforcement and implementation of ENR Laws to address environmental crimes/violations all over the country, such as illegal logging, quarrying, mining, and wildlife trade. It is specifically designed and conceptualized to develop essential competencies for effective and efficient intelligence and counterintelligence aptitude for the conduct of operations against environmental crimes.

This seminar will focus on the comparative study of military and police intelligence functions and operations, types of intelligence, phases of intelligence cycle, criminal modus operandi, subject profiling, and the identification, mitigation, and elimination of threats to environment and natural resources, as well as those of national security.

RATIONALE

The importance of intelligence and counterintelligence in fighting environmental crimes has become increasingly emphasized, but has yet to be given full attention and detail. The full extent of the complexities of environmental crimes is proving much more challenging to cope with the advancements of technology and technique utilized by individual and syndicated violators. Without the complete, accurate and timely intelligence performed by people with specialized training in environmental law enforcement, all efforts to curb environmental crimes will prove ineffective.

It has long been proven by science that nature alone can survive, but man without nature will perish. The very reason why our environment is in a continuous state of degradation is the failure to effectively and efficiently implement environmental laws. As such, the very existence of mankind depends on its proper treatment of the environment and its natural resources.

OBJECTIVES

At the end of the course, the participants should be able to:

- 1. Gain a working knowledge of human aspirations and expectations and how these are exposed to threats;
- 2. Have a working knowledge on the role of intelligence strategies, and conceptualization and formulation of plans, programs and activities aimed at establishing protocols in order to protect our environment and natural resources; and
- 3. Learn the basic aspects of intelligence know-how, its doctrines and principles fundamental in the conduct of intelligence operations against environmental crimes.

METHODOLOGIES

The seminar will be conducted via face-to-face method. To attain the seminar objectives, the following methodologies will be used during the training proper:
