This pertains to the draft Presidential Proclamation re: Repealing Proclamation No. 663, Series of 2013, and Transferring the Administration of Busuanga Pasture Reserve (BPR) to the MIMAROPA Regional Office of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR).

Previously, the said draft proclamation was already concurred by the concerned DENR Undersecretaries and forwarded to the Office of the DENR Secretary. However, due to changes in administration, then Acting DENR Secretary Jim Sampulna was not able to sign the indorsement Memorandum for the President and the DENR has not able to forward the same to the Office of the President. Thereafter, this Office revised and improved the initial submission by including the Technical Description adopted for BPR based on the result of ground verification conducted in 2015. Hence, we are respectfully resubmitting the draft Presidential Proclamation.

The said draft proclamation aims to repeal Presidential Proclamation No. 663, Series of 2013, entitled, "Repealing Proclamation No. 2057 and Transferring the Administration of Busuanga Pasture Reserve to the Forest Management Bureau of the DENR."

A. Background

In 2013, Presidential Proclamation No. 663 was promulgated by the then President, Benigno S. Aquino, III. Under the said Proclamation, the Forest Management Bureau (FMB) shall have jurisdiction over the administration, protection and management of the pasture lands. To effectively manage the area, the Bureau, as the administrator, has created the BPR Management Office (BPRMO) stationed in the CENRO Calamianes Islands. The said Office has been responsible for the field monitoring of projects/activities, LAWIN patrolling, and investigation of unlawful activities within the area, among others. Although the FMB was the administrator of the area, its functions are still limited, especially in: 1) filing, litigation and prosecution of cases against violators of environmental laws, rules, and regulations within BPR; and 2) facilitating the review and evaluation of applications for permits, and tenure instruments. Hence, this Bureau endeavors to address these identified gaps in the existing Presidential Proclamation through this policy initiative. The proposed Presidential Proclamation will help in efficient and strategic management of the BPR since the DENR MIMAROPA has the line functions and powers to perform the above-mentioned limited functions of FMB, and has jurisdiction over CENRO Calamianes Islands.

B. Salient Features

Hereunder are the salient provisions of the proposed presidential proclamation:

- Provides the exact area coverage and technical description adopted for BPR based on the actual ground survey verification conducted by FMB in coordination with CENRO Calamianes Islands;
- 2. Provides assumption of management, administration, protection and supervision of the Busuanga Pasture Reserve to the DENR MIMAROPA;
- 3. Integrates the functions of the BPRMO to the CENRO Calamianes Island; and
- 4. Provides more efficient and strategic management of BPR since the DENR MIMAROPA has the line functions and has jurisdiction over CENRO Calamianes Islands, where the BPR is located.

C. Action taken

The draft presidential proclamation was deliberated in the Policy Review Committee (PRC) of the FMB for final endorsement to the Secretary. Likewise, the draft presidential proclamation was presented to and concurred by the DENR MIMAROPA and DENR Legal Affairs Service. DENR MIMAROPA posed no objections to the transfer of the administration of BPR to their Office.

D. Action Requested

The approval of the draft presidential proclamation will facilitate the strategic management of the BPR, hence, it is respectfully recommended for the Secretary's consideration and approval.

Enclosed in this Memorandum is the above-mentioned draft presidential proclamation and memorandum for the President, for your ready reference.

We have the honor to forward herewith for **CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL**, the Draft Presidential Proclamation repealing Presidential Proclamation No. 663 Series of 2013 and transferring the administration of Busuanga Pasture Reserve (BPR) to the MIMAROPA Regional Office of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR).

BACKGROUND

- Busuanga Pasture Reserve is a parcel of public domain situated in the island of Busuanga, Province of Palawan, was withdrawn from "sale, settlement or any other form of disposition, exploration or exploitation," and "reserved as pasture reserve" pursuant to Presidential Proclamation No. 1387, Series of 1975;
- On May 10, 2010, then President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo issued Presidential Proclamation (PP) No. 2057 "Authorizing the Philippine Forest (PhilForest) Corporation to Administer the development of the area covered by the Busuanga Pasture Reserve delineated by Proclamation No. 1387";
- On October 14, 2013, following the dissolution of the then PhilForest, then President Benigno S. Aquino III issued Presidential Proclamation No. 663, "Repealing Proclamation No. 2057 and transferring the administration of the Busuanga Pasture Reserve to the DENR-Forest Management Bureau (DENR-FMB);
- 4. The area is currently being administered by the Forest Management Bureau (FMB) pursuant to Presidential Proclamation No. 663 citing Section 3 of Commonwealth Act No. 452 that the Bureau of Forestry (presently the FMB of DENR) shall have jurisdiction and authority over the administration, protection, and management of pasture lands;

JUSTIFICATION

The MIMAROPA Regional Office of DENR has the line functions and powers which would help effectively and efficiently manage the BPR especially through the: (1) implementation of existing laws, policies, rules and regulations on the conservation and protection of the BPR; (2) filing, litigation, and prosecution of cases against violators of pertinent environment laws, rules and regulations within Busuanga Pasture Reserve (BPR); and (3) review, and evaluation of applications for permits, tenure instruments and/or agreements within BPR in accordance with existing laws, rules and regulations.

LEGAL BASIS

Executive Order No. 192, s. 1987 provides that:

"SECTION 13. Forest Management Bureau. There is hereby created a Forest Management Bureau which shall integrate and absorb the powers and functions of the Bureau of Forest Development (BFD) and the Wood Industry Development Authority (WIDA), in accordance with Section 24 (e) hereof **except those line functions and powers which are transferred to the regional field office**. The Forest Management Bureau, to be headed by a Director and assisted by an Assistant Director shall advise the Secretary on matters pertaining to forest development and conservation and shall have the following functions, but not limited to:

- (a) Recommend policies and/or programs for the effective protection, development, occupancy, management and conservation of forest lands and watersheds, including grazing and mangrove areas, reforestation and rehabilitation of critically denuded/degraded forest reservations, improvement of water resource use and development, ancestral lands, wilderness areas and other natural preserves, development of forest plantations including rattan, bamboo, and other valuable non-timber forest resources, rationalization of the wood-based industries, regulation of the utilization and exploitation of forest resources including wildlife, to ensure continued supply of forest goods and services.
- (b) Advise the regional offices in the implementation of the above policies and/or programs.
- (c) Develop plans, programs, operating standards and administrative measures to promote the Bureau's objectives and functions.
- (d) Assist in the monitoring and evaluation of forestry and watershed development projects to ensure efficiency and effectiveness.
- (e) Undertake studies on the economics of forestry and forest-based industries, including supply and demand trends on the local, national and international levels, identifying investment problems and opportunities, in various areas.
- (f) Perform other functions as may be assigned by the Secretary and/or provided by law.

XXX

SECTION 21. Functions of Environment and Natural Resources Regional Office. Environment and Natural Resources Regional Offices shall be located in the identified regional capitals and shall have the following functions, but not limited to:

(a) Implement laws, policies, plans, programs, projects, rules and regulations of the Department to promote the sustainability and productivity of natural resources, social equity in natural resource utilization and environmental protection.

- (b) Provide efficient and effective delivery of services to the people;
- (c) Coordinate with regional offices of other departments, offices, agencies in the region and local government units in the enforcement of natural resource conservation laws and regulations, and in the formulation/implementation of natural resources programs and projects;
- (d) Recommend and, upon approval, implement programs and projects on forestry, minerals, and land management and disposition;
- (e) Conduct comprehensive inventory of natural resources in the region and formulate regional short and long-term development plans for the conservation, utilization and replacement of natural resources;
- (f) Supervise the processing of natural resources products, grade and inspect minerals, lumber and other wood processed products, and monitor the movement of these products;
- (g) Conduct field researches for appropriate technologies recommended for various projects;
- (h) Perform other functions as may be assigned by the Secretary and/or provided by law.
- (i) The natural resources provincial and community offices shall absorb, respectively, the functions of the district offices of the bureaus, which are hereby abolished in accordance with Section 24 (b) hereof. The provincial and community natural resource office shall be headed by a provincial natural resource officer and community natural resource officer, respectively."

Also, **Executive Order No. 292** grants the President residual powers and continuing authority to reorganize the administrative structure of the Executive Branch.

- 1. Forest Management Bureau
- 2. DENR MIMAROPA Regional Office.

COORDINATION INVOLVED

The DENR Undersecretary for Legal, Administration, Human Resources and Legislative Affairs through the DENR Legal Affairs Service has provided their comments and recommendation pertaining to the draft Presidential Proclamation. The DENR MIMAROPA has also posed no objection on the transfer of the administration of BPR to their Office.

POTENTIAL PROBLEM

No potential problem is foreseen considering the approval on the issuance of Presidential Proclamation repealing Presidential Proclamation No. 663 Series of 2013 and transferring the administration of Busuanga Pasture Reserve (BPR) to the MIMAROPA Regional Office of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) is pursuant to existing, laws, rules and regulations.

SECTION 21. Functions of Environment and Natural Resources Regional Office. Environment and Natural Resources Regional Offices shall be located in the identified regional capitals and shall have the following functions, but not limited to:

(a) Implement laws, policies, plans, programs, projects, rules and regulations of the Department to promote the sustainability and productivity of natural resources, social equity in natural resource utilization and environmental protection.

- (b) Provide efficient and effective delivery of services to the people;
- (c) Coordinate with regional offices of other departments, offices, agencies in the region and local government units in the enforcement of natural resource conservation laws and regulations, and in the formulation/implementation of natural resources programs and projects;
- (d) Recommend and, upon approval, implement programs and projects on forestry, minerals, and land management and disposition;
- (e) Conduct comprehensive inventory of natural resources in the region and formulate regional short and long-term development plans for the conservation, utilization and replacement of natural resources;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3 of Commonwealth Act (CA) No. 452, the Bureau of Forestry (presently the FMB of DENR) shall have jurisdiction and authority over the administration, protection, and management of pasture lands;

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Forestry Development (BFD) was reorganized by virtue of Executive Order No. 192, s. 1987, into the FMB, a staff Bureau, under the DENR. The line functions of the BFD were transferred to the Regional Offices;

WHEREAS, the DENR MIMAROPA Regional Office is a field office which has jurisdiction over CENR Office Calamianes Islands in Coron where the BPR is located;

WHEREAS, the administration of the BPR is suitably a line function that should be carried out by the DENR field offices in accordance with its mandate;

WHEREAS, Presidential Proclamation No. 2057 (s. 2010) authorized the Philippine Forest Corporation (PFC) to administer the development of the area covered by the Busuanga Pasture Reserve (BPR);

WHEREAS, Presidential Proclamation No. 663 (s. 2013) repealed Presidential Proclamation No. 2057 and transferred the administration of the BPR from the PFC to the Forest Management Bureau (FMB) of the DENR;

WHEREAS, the Administrative Code of 1987 grants the President authority to reorganize the administrative structure of the Executive Branch;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, FERDINAND ROMUALDEZ MARCOS JR., President of the Republic of the Philippines, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of the land, do hereby repeal Presidential Proclamation No. 663, Series of 2013 and all other orders and issuances inconsistent thereto, and mandated the DENR MIMAROPA Regional Office to be the administrator of the BPR

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the Republic of the Philippines to be affixed.
