

This has reference to the Memorandum dated November 22, 2021 of the Regional Executive Director (RED) of DENR MIMAROPA Region, endorsing to DENR Central Office the Gratuitous Special Use Permit (GSUP) application of the Provincial Local Government Unit (PLGU) of Oriental Mindoro for the development of a Farm-to-Market Road (FMR) traversing the Barangays of Merit, Ma. Concepcion, Happy Valley and Bugtong na Tuog, in the municipality of Socorro, and Barangay Concepcion, in the municipality of Victoria, all in the province of Oriental Mindoro. Said project will be funded through the Department of Agriculture – Philippine Rural Development Project (PRDP).

Upon careful review and evaluation of the subject GSUP application, this Office noted the following information, to wit:

- The PLGU of Oriental Mindoro had submitted sufficient documentary requirements for the issuance of GSUP for the project. The following are the submitted documents:
 - a. Letter of Intent dated August 13, 2021;
 - b. Official Receipt (OR) No. 9176589 as proof of payment of application fee amounting to Php 500.00;
 - c. GIS-generated map of the area;
 - d. Indicative Management Plan (IMP);



 e. Certificate Precondition with Control Number: CP-RIVB-OrMindoro-2021-08-53 dated September 02, 2021 issued by the National Commission on Indigenous Peoples (NCIP) MIMAROPA Regional Office No. 5, Calapan City;

f. PLGU of Oriental Mindoro Certification dated September 01, 2021, certifying that the LGU has appropriated funds for the development and management of the

project;

g. Sangguniang Panlalawigan Resolution No. 5613, series of 2021 designating Governor Humerlito A. Dolor to officially transact with the DENR and other relevant agencies relative to its GSUP application.

- Based on the conducted GIS analysis of this Office using the maps and shapefiles provided by DENR MIMAROPA Region, the following were observed:
 - a. The proposed FMR project covers an area of 0.96 hectare (approximately 1.37 kilometers long and 7 meters wide), and falls within forest land; and
 - b. The area subject of GSUP application does not overlap with existing National Greening Program (NGP) areas, forest tenure instruments issued by the Department, and other related management arrangements.

Further, the concreting and development of said FMR aims to provide a cost-effective production and distribution of agricultural products between farm and market, which will significantly improve the socio-economic status of the local farmers in the Municipality.

In view thereof and considering the merit of the application, submission of the applicant of the necessary documents, and favorable endorsement from the concerned CENRO, PENRO and RED, this Office recommends that the RED of DENR MIMAROPA Region be given a CLEARANCE to issue a five (5)-year non-renewable GSUP to PLGU of Oriental Mindoro that will cover its development of a 0.96-hectare (approximately 1.37 kilometers long and 7 meters wide) Farm-to-Market Road traversing portions of forest land in the Barangays of Merit, Ma. Concepcion, Happy Valley and Bugtong na Tuog, in the municipality of Socorro, and Barangay Concepcion, in the municipality of Victoria, all in the province of Oriental Mindoro.







ADDITIONAL TERMS, CONDITIONS AND INSTRUCTIONS UNDER THE GRATUITOUS SPECIAL USE PERMIT

- 1. The area granted in this Permit: (a) is a public forest land based on existing records; and (b) shall not be involved in any private transaction.
- 2. The annual government share or user's fee is waived in favor of the Permittee.
- 3. The **Permittee** shall: (a) comply with the laws, rules and regulations and instructions now or hereinafter enforced for the proper use of the land; (b) respect any legal prior claims; (c) conserve the corners and boundary lines of the area; (d) protect any wetlands such as spring, waterfalls, peatlands, swamps, lake, and marshes or natural/ historical/ archeological sites in the area; (e) report to the nearest local forest officer(s) all forest violations in the area and adjacent lands; and (f) submit a year-end report, not later than March 30 of the succeeding year, to the concerned Regional Executive Director thru the CENRO/PENRO the kind, number and value of improvement(s) introduced in the area, among others.
- 4. The **Permittee** shall: (a) not appropriate for himself/herself exclusive use of public trails traversing or adjoining the area or impede the use thereof by the public; (b) not sublease the area or any portion thereof; and (c) protect and conserve threatened wildlife identified under existing rules and regulations.
- 5. A separate permit shall be secured by the Permittee should tree cutting be necessary. However, no tree, regardless of species, shall be cut in the permitted area if found within forty (40) meters from banks of rivers, creeks or streams and buffer strips. In case the said 40-meter strip is bereft of trees, the same shall be rehabilitated by the **Permittee**.
- 6. The Permittee shall strictly observe the terms and conditions of the ECC. In case the Permittee will conduct periodic rehabilitation of the infrastructures or introduce new appurtenances within the GSUP area, the same shall secure an appropriate clearance from the EMB for the purpose and submit the clearance to the concerned DENR Regional Office prior to such undertakings therein.
- 7. The **Permittee** shall protect the permitted area from forest fires and other forms of forest destruction.
- 8. Non-use of the area within six (6) months after it is granted will result in the cancellation of the Permit except in cases of force majeure or fortuitous events.
- In case the area no longer serves the purpose as warranted under the said Permit, the Permit shall be cancelled and the subsequent management and administration of the affected area shall be assumed by the DENR.
- 10. Violation or non-compliance of any of the terms and conditions of the Permit or any environment and natural resources management laws, policies, rules and regulations shall be sufficient grounds for the cancellation thereof without prejudice to whatever legal action that may be taken.
- 11. The GSUP for the construction of roads and bridges shall have a maximum non-renewable term of five (5) years and similarly, the GSUP for the construction and operation of schools, hospitals,

health centers, flood control facilities, water reservoir or impounding dam and its related facilities, air strip, landing site, harbor, public market, public plazas and evacuation site shall have a maximum non-renewable term of five (5) years. The GSUP and its additional terms and conditions shall be approved by the RED.

- 12. Except the agencies permitted to construct roads and bridges, the other agencies permitted to construct and operate infrastructure projects or facilities for public service and use shall apply for the issuance of Presidential Proclamation starting on the second year from the issuance of the GSUP to ensure effective management and sustainability of the infrastructure and facilities and its long-term use of the area where the infrastructure exists.
- 13. Failure to secure a Presidential Proclamation within the allowable period starting from the second year to the fifth year of the GSUP, the **Permittee** shall apply for Forest Landuse Agreement (FLAg) pursuant to DENR Administrative Order No. 2004-59 dated 31 August 2004 and other related policies on special uses of forest lands.

A. BACKGROUND

Review and evaluation of the submitted documents supporting the application for SLUP disclosed the following:

- Provincial Governor Humerlito A. Dolor, MPA, Ph.D. in his letter dated August 13, 2021 addressed to the DENR Secretary, thru this Office requesting for issuance of GSLUP for the Construction/Concreting of Merit to Bugtong na Tuog Farm to Market Road with Bridge in Merit, Victoria to Bugtong na Tuog, Socorro.
- 2. The applicant submitted the following documentary requirements to support the application, to wit:
 - 2.1 Official Receipt Number 9176589 dated October 20, 2021 for the Application Fee amounting to Php500.00;
 - 2.2 Land Status Certification dated August 13, 2021 issued by CENRO Socorro, Oriental Mindoro wherein 0.97 hectare falls within timberland;
 - 2.3 Field Based Investigation Report dated August 4, 2021 conducted by the Field Based Investigation Team from National Commission on Indigenous Peoples recommending for issuance of Certification Precondition;
 - 2.4 Certification Precondition Control Number CP-RIVB-OrMindoro-2021-08-53 dated September 2, 2021 from NCIP;

2.5 Indicative Management Plan;

B. COMMENTS AND OBSERVATIONS

- 1. The submitted documents supporting the application for Gratuitous Special Land Use Permit are found to be in order.
- 2. Memorandum dated June 14, 2021 of the Assistant Secretary for Policy, Planning and Foreign Assisted and Special Projects, and Director, in concurrent capacity, indicates that the approval of GSLUP application is exclusive for government agencies subject to the issuance of a CLEARANCE by the DENR Central Office.

C. RECOMMENDATION





E. Rationale:

Section 39 of NCIP AO No.3 Series of 2012 or THE REVISED GUIDELINES ON FREE AND PRIOR INFORMED CONSENT states that: Programs, projects and activities solicited or initiated by the concerned ICCs/IPs themselves where the activity is strictly for the DELIVERY OF BASIC SERVICES to be undertaken within or affecting the ancestral domain, DO NOT REQUIRE COMPLIANCE WITH THE FBI/FPIC requirement as provided in this Guidelines, however, they shall be subjected to a validation process.

This is also in accordance with Work Order No. 105 series of 2021 dated July 12, 2021 issued by the NCIP MIMAROPA Regional Office to conduct the Field-Based Validation on the subject project.

F. Brief project description:

The proposed concreting of the Farm to Market Road(FMR) start from Brgy. Merit to Brgy. Concepcion, both of the Municipality of Victoria to Brgy. Ma. Concepcion to Brgy. Happy Valley up to Brgy. Bugtong Na Tuog, all of the Mun. of Socorro having a total of 10.734 kilometers. The FMR has a width of 4.00m

2.0 to 6.0m approach slab and two(2) abutments with protection and concrete railings. The total funding of this FMR including the bridge has a total project cost of PhP 163,969,773.44 granted by the Philippine Rural Development Project(PRDP).

G. Specific Objectives of the Field Based Validation:

To determine if:

 The ICC, in fact, voluntary solicited or initiated the programs and Projects to be undertaken;

The ICC consider the programs and projects to form part of their ADSDPP that they will formulate in the future;

The ICC knows the extent of the programs and projects and its Socio-cultural/environmental impact to the community;

4. The programs and projects are for the delivery of Basic Services and Livelihood Projects involving the community;

The parties acknowledge their obligations.

H. Field-Based Validation/Information

The validation was conducted through a dialogue at the IP meeting hall of sitio Granvida, Bugtong Na Tuog, Socorro on July 27, 2021. It was attended by more or less 50 participants composed of IP leaders/elders, Barangay Officials, and the Community members including former KAMTI Chairman Ramon Salamat, IP representative for the conversion of the IP's Ancestral Domain Claim into CADT.

After the preludes of a simple program, the FBI team explained the purpose and objectives of the validation. A resolution from the IP leaders/community members requesting for road concreting, which is part of the supporting documents of the project was brought for confirmation. This request affirmed the document by the participants to be their earnest request to the Province.

Knowing the same group and leaders will be consulted to the other project of the Provincial Government entitled "Construction of Mindoro Trading and Consolidation Facility" (Bagsakan Center) at the DEMO farm of the Province, the validation team brought out and mentioned including the site for the construction of this project. The group appreciated the proposed project saying it is favorable to them for they will have a trading center where they can brought their farm products at standard price. The validation team also asked the estimated distance of the Demo Farm to their ancestral domain and the IP leaders/elders estimated saying it is more or less 12 kms. Away. The bagsakan center will be built inside the demo farm compound located beside the National road at Merit, Victoria. The validation team with selected IP leaders agreed to visit the demo farm the following day with the continuous assistance of the Provincial Government through their representative.

After the explanation of the validation team, Ms. Maritess De Guzman, representative of the Provincial Government explained further regarding their proposed two projects(concreting of FMR & Construction of Trading and Consolidation Facility). She also explained regarding houses built near the road that may be affected or damage brought by the road construction; she said the Provincial Government will provide housing materials for replacement of affected dwellings. She also mentioned some of the program and projects of the Provincial Government such as provision of housings to indigent.

The Field validation team asked regarding what part of the proposed 10.734 kms. road concreting is covered or within their ancestral domain; the IP leaders/elders said only the existing road going to their community(sitio Granvida) is covered by their ancestral domain, CADC No. 085 or only about one-seventh(1/7th) of the 10.734 kms. proposed road concreting project.

Ramon Salamat, longtime IP leader and representative for the delineation of the Mangyan Tadyawan Ancestral Domain Claim(CADC No. 085) explained more about the history including the contents, directions and IP communities covered by their ancestral domain.

The participants were once again asked regarding their interest in the road construction; the community strongly stressed the necessity and importance of the project. They said having a convenient and comfortable road will bring many benefits to them; their farm products will be transported easier; their children will be motivated in going to schools; and during or in times of emergencies like sickness and or giving of birth will be delivered easier and faster to the hospitals.

With the heavy clamors and concerns raised by the IP group, the FBI team affirmed the essential, importance and immediate need for the implementation and construction of the road project (FMR).

Assessment and observation

Road for concreting beginning from Barangay Merit, Victoria up to Barangay Bugtong Na Tuog, Socorro already exists, there will be no new road opening, only road widening.

Most part of the road network is concreted, however little portion will be retain based from our observations considering that most of the concreted roads have cracks and damages. There were also parts of the road not concreted apart from narrow widths.

Construction of a bridge across the subaan river is very important and essential for this will connect the road going to the non-IP and IP communities of Barangay Happy Valley and Barangay Bugtong Na Tuog respectively. The residents in these two mentioned barangays particularly the IPs are hard-up and in danger every time they will market their products. During bad weather and or rainy season, motorcycles and even automobiles can't hardly or cannot cross the river anymore.

The four(4)non-IP barangays starting from sitio Merit to Happy Valley where the road construction traverse benefit from the project, but more on the IPs living in Granvida, Barangay Bugtong Na Tuog who will be using the entire road considering that their barangay is the last and farthest part of the road project.

From the 10.734 kilometers FMR concreting project of the PGOM, it embraces a tiny portion of the ancestral domain of the Tadyawan IPs which is more or less 1.5 kilometers located at the last segment of the road where the IP community is located.

Request for the concreting of the existing road through community resolution was positively affirmed by the IP leaders/elders and community members being one of the basic needs of the IPs

the validation team also asserts the importance of the road concreting project that include the road going to the IP community of sitio Granvida which is very rough and at high elevation that always brought danger to every community member during his travel.

J. Recommendation:

Validation, the FBI team respectfully recommends the issuance of a **CERTIFICATION PRECONDITION** for the Concreting of Farm to Market Road (FMR) from Barangay Merit, Victoria up to sitio Granvida, Barangay Bugtong Na Tuog, Socorro, Oriental Mindoro.

INDICATIVE MANAGEMENT PLAN

I. INTRODUCTION

Description of the area

The proposed Concreting of Barangay Merit-Concepcion, Victoria-Barangays Ma. Concepcion-Happy Valley-Bugtong na Tuog, Socorro Farm-to-Market Road with Bridge is located in the municipalities of Victoria and Socorro. Victoria is bounded on the north by the Municipality of Naujan, on the south east by the Municipality of Socorro, and on the southwest by the Municipality of Sablayan, in Occidental Mindoro. Socorro is bounded on the north by Naujan Lake and the Municipality of Victoria, on the east by the Municipality of Pola, on the south by the Municipality of Pinamalayan, and on the west by the province of Occidental Mindoro.

The existing road network is connected to the Calapan South Road leading to the Provincial Demo Farm in Merit, Victoria and Bugtong na Tuog, Socorro. The total Road Influence Area of 3,482.37 hectares was identified based on the 2.5 km radius from the subproject. Based on Comprehensive Land Use Plans of Victoria and Socorro, all the barangays within the RIA are all prime agricultural lands. Other land uses include NIPAS, forest, agriculture and pasture/grasslands.

Based on the 2015 PSA Census, population in the five (5) barangays covered by the subproject totaled 4,392 wherein 584 are from Merit and 714 from Concepcion, Victoria; 708 from Ma. Concepcion; 1,165 from Happy Valley and 1,221 from Bugtong na Tuog in Socorro. There are 1,009 households in the project area - 130 from Merit; 159 from Concepcion; 165 from Ma. Concepcion 271 from Happy Valley and 284 from Bugtong na Tuog.

The major economies in Victoria and Socorro are agriculture and trading. Major agricultural products include rice, corn, and high value commercial crops like coconut, calamansi, banana, rambutan, lanzones and durian. Based from the records of the Permits and Licensing Division, there were 1,297 commercial establishments in Socorro as of 2011, and 734 in Victoria as of 2014. Data from the Provincial Agriculture Office (2018) showed that crops produced in Victoria and Socorro include rice with 69,514.63 MT; banana with 25,811.19 MT; citrus with 6,983.67 MT; rambutan with 1,036.06 MT; lanzones with 192.20 MT; and coconut with approximately 20 million wholenuts. Livestock and poultry population, on the other hand, consists of 4,277 carabaos, 4,911 cattle, 8,681 swine, 3,919 goats, 98 horses, 12,512 ducks and 67,080 chickens.

The municipal and city level small area poverty estimates of the PSA showed that Socorro's poverty incidence increased from 15.4% in 2012 to 17.2% in 2015. On the other hand, Victoria's poverty incidence slightly decreased from 18.0% in 2012 to 17.4% in 2015.

II. OBJECTIVES

The general objective of the subproject is to improve the socio-economic status of people in the influence areas.

Specifically, it aims to:

- 1. reduce travel time of commuters, basic goods and commodities by 20 minutes (from Barangay Bugtong na Tuog, Socorro to Merit, Victoria and vice versa);
- 2. increase number of vehicles traversing the area by 20% after a year of project completion;
- increase the volume of goods transported via land vehicles with a shift in mode of transportation from habal-habal to Public Utility Jeep (PUJ) or Filcab;
- 4. reduce transport losses by 39% for banana, 4% for coconut, and 49% for calamansi; and
- 5. increase cultivated agricultural land area by 100 hectares for banana, and 50 hectares for both coconut and calamansi.

III. PROJECT SCHEDULE

The proposed subproject will be undertaken by the lowest evaluated Contractor as a result of competitive bidding in accordance with the World Bank procurement guidelines. Project implementation will officially start seven (7) days after the issuance of Notice to Proceed to the winning contractor up to the scheduled project duration estimated to be within a period of 190 calendar days exclusive of 68 unworkable days.

IV. TECHNICAL ASPECTS

Project activity

Out of the total road stretch of 10.734 kilometers, the 7.667 kilometers will be concreted and a bridge of 30 linear meters will be constructed. The bridge will be connecting Barangays Happy Valley and Ma. Concepcion, and will also serve Barangay Bugtong na Tuog residents. There are identified portions along the road stretch where drainage canals, wall protection, and slope protection will be constructed. This would provide convenient road accessibility that will lessen the travel time of commuters. Such improvement will also develop accessibility to market centers/trading posts in the Poblacion and proposed Oriental Mindoro Trading and Consolidation Facility at the Provincial Demo Farm in Merit, Victoria.

Description of production/development

Majority of the road is in bad paved condition such that farmers experience difficulty in transporting their produce to the nearby market. It also affects the crops' quality therefore, farmers usually sell their produce to traders(middleman) but at unreasonable price compared to the prevailing market price.

The community will have numerous benefits upon project completion. First is the reduction in travel time and fare because there will be possible new modes of transportation introduced in the area like public utility jeep (PUJ) or Fil-cab. Second, the quality of crops being transported will be improved leading to minimal spoilage and increased farmer's income. Third, the far-flung barangays will be easily reached with basic services and emergency response during calamities will be strengthened. Fourth, farmers will be able to deliver their produce to the nearby market thereby eliminating the middleman issue which also results to more profit. Fifth, there is a high possibility of increase in land valuation because of the improved road. Sixth, there will be enhanced school participation in the area. Seventh, investors will potentially come in because of its convenience. And lastly, travelling in the area will be safer and more comfortable for the public.

The 30-linear meter bridge will connect Barangays Merit and Concepcion in Victoria, Barangays Ma. Concepcion and Happy Valley with Barangay Bugtong na Tuog in Socorro. It will provide access to nearby markets and communities, and trading of agricultural produce.

Site development

Part of the 10.734-kilometer road with bridge are 1.814-kilometer gravel and 8.890-kilometer concrete types. Rubble concrete canals, wall and slope protections will be constructed in identified portions of the road stretch. The existing road carriageway width is 3.0 meters with no allocated shoulders on both sides which causes traffic in some major points of the road. There are portions that need curved widening for 1.50 meters shoulder width. There is no permanent obstruction in the road sections.

The proposed 7.667-km PCCP has a thickness of 0.23 m and 5.00 m width, and 1.50 m shoulder width on both sides of the road. The Reinforced Concrete Deck Girder (RCDG) Bridge has a length of 30 lm with a width of 4.60 m, a carriageway of 7.32 m, sidewalk of 0.76 m and 0.35 m railings on both sides, two approach slabs of 4.00 m by 8.00 m, and two abutments with wingwall. The proposed RCPC of 0.610 m Ø by 7.00 m length will be constructed in the identified stations. The proposed stone masonry slope protection will be constructed in the identified stations with a length of 0.943 km and 1.403 km on the right and left sides, respectively. A stone masonry with drainage canals, will be constructed in some portion of the road with a length of 0.618 m at the right side and 0.210 m at the left. At the right side of stations 6+900-6+940, 8+900-8+960, 9+020-9+100 a proposed brick wall will be constructed.

V. MANAGEMENT ASPECTS

Organization

The institutional and organizational aspect is important in the implementation and management, accountability and sustainability of the project. The Provincial Project Management Implementing Unit (PPMIU) will serve as the management unit in charge of the planning, design and implementation of the project. The PPMIU's Monitoring and Evaluation Unit under the I-SUPPORT Team shall conduct regular monitoring and evaluation activities to ensure that the project components and objectives are implemented and achieved.

Management strategies/policies

To ensure the project's sustainability, the Provincial Government of Oriental Mindoro (PGOM), in coordination with the concerned barangays, shall provide in their respective budget the necessary annual funding and manpower requirements for the subproject's operation and maintenance.

Road Maintenance works are classified as routine and periodic. Routine maintenance activities are done throughout the year and are labor intensive. These activities will be carried out according to agreed sharing of responsibilities with the barangay, municipal and provincial government to promote greater sense of responsibility and ownership of the project thus ensuring sustainability of project implementation.

VI. FINANCIAL ASPECTS

Project cost

The estimated project cost of ONE HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE MILLION NINE HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FOUR PESOS (Php 163,969,774.00) will be needed for the improvement of the access road and construction of bridge.

Sources of funds

Of the total project cost, 80% or Php 131,175,818.75 will be taken from the Loan Proceeds, 10% or Php 16,396,977.34 from Department of Agriculture – Grant and the remaining 10% or Php 16,396,977.34 will be the PGOM's Equity.

Financial Projections

The economic and financial analysis of the proposed project showed an Economic Net Present Value of PhP 2,103,684.08; Economic Internal Rate of Return of 139.01% and Benefit Cost Ratio of 12.77.

RESOLUTION **PROVINCIAL GOVERNOR** AUTHORIZING PROVINCIAL HUMERLITO A. DOLOR, FOR AND IN BEHALF OF THE PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT OF ORIENTAL MINDORO (PGOM) TO APPLY FOR GRATUITOUS SPECIAL LAND USE PERMIT (GSLUP) WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES (DENR) FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF TWO (2) FARM TO MARKET ROADS UNDER THE PHILIPPINE RURAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (PRDP), NAMELY: (1) CONCRETING OF BARANGAYS MERIT-CONCEPCION, VICTORIA - BARANGAYS MA. NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE SANGGUNIANG PANLALAWIGAN OF ORIENTAL MINDORO to authorize Provincial Governor Humerlito A. Dolor, for and in behalf of the Provincial Government of Oriental Mindoro (PGOM) to apply for Gratuitous Special Land Use Permit (GSLUP) with the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) for the construction of two (2) Farm to Market Roads under the Philippine Rural Development Program (PRDP), namely: (1) Concreting of Barangays Merit-Concepcion, Victoria — Barangays Ma. Concepcion-Happy Valley-Bugtong Na Tuog, Socorro Farm to Market Road with Bridge; and (2) Rehabilitation / Construction / Concreting of Rosacara Farm to Market Road with Bridges, subject to full compliance with all applicable laws, rules and regulations, and to the following mandatory conditions:

- 1. That, the Provincial Governor and all involved department heads and employees of the PGOM, and all parties who signed legal instruments pertaining to the GSLUP complied and shall continue to fully comply with all applicable laws, rules and regulations, as well any subsequent findings, orders or decisions by relevant government agencies, in connection with the review, execution or implementation of the GSLUP which compliance shall be the sole duty and continuing responsibility of said officials or parties;
- 2. That, the said application for GSLUP and relative contracts, and other legal instruments and related documents and all related activities and actions appurtenant thereto shall undergo a thorough due diligence, legal and compliance review by the Provincial Legal Officer and the Provincial Internal Auditor who shall independently issue separate certifications of legality and propriety, to be attached to and made an integral part of the records, as a mandatory prerequisite prior to signing or execution by the Provincial Governor;
- 3. That, no public fund or money shall be appropriated, disbursed or applied to execute or implement any program, project, activity or object of expenditure under the subject application for GSLUP without the prior approval of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan embodied in a duly enacted/approved/signed resolution or ordinance;
- 4. That, the approval of this Resolution by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan is based solely on the independent representations by the Office of the Provincial Governor and departments of the PGOM who signed the request and should not be construed as concurrence to any separate actions by said officials at anytime, whether before or after the approval of this Resolution, nor should such approval make the Sangguniang Panlalawigan a party to any such actions; and
- 5. That, in case of failure by the said officials to comply with any of the foregoing conditions, the approval of this resolution shall be automatically withdrawn and of no effect ab initio.

Let a copy of this Resolution be furnished to Provincial Governor Humerlito A. Dolor, the Provincial Finance Committee, the Provincial Legal Officer, the Internal Auditor, and all concerned officials for their information.

#### E. Rationale:

Section 39 of NCIP AO No.3 Series of 2012 or THE REVISED GUIDELINES ON FREE AND PRIOR INFORMED CONSENT states that: Programs, projects and activities solicited or initiated by the concerned ICCs/IPs themselves where the activity is strictly for the DELIVERY OF BASIC SERVICES to be undertaken within or affecting the ancestral domain, DO NOT REQUIRE COMPLIANCE WITH THE FBI/FPIC requirement as provided in this Guidelines, however, they shall be subjected to a validation process.

This is also in accordance with Work Order No. 105 series of 2021 dated July 12, 2021 issued by the NCIP MIMAROPA Regional Office to conduct the Field-Based Validation on the subject project.

# F. Brief project description:

The proposed concreting of the Farm to Market Road(FMR) start from Brgy. Merit to Brgy. Concepcion, both of the Municipality of Victoria to Brgy.Ma. Concepcion to Brgy.Happy Valley up to Brgy. Bugtong Na Tuog, all of the Mun. of Socorro having a total of 10.734 kilometers. The FMR has a width of 4.00m

2.0 to 6.0m approach slab and two(2) abutments with protection and concrete railings. The total funding of this FMR including the bridge has a total project cost of PhP 163,969,773.44 granted by the Philippine Rural Development Project(PRDP).

# G. Specific Objectives of the Field Based Validation:

To determine if:

- The ICC, in fact, voluntary solicited or initiated the programs and Projects to be undertaken;
- The ICC consider the programs and projects to form part of their ADSDPP that they will formulate in the future;
- The ICC knows the extent of the programs and projects and its Socio-cultural/environmental impact to the community;
- The programs and projects are for the delivery of Basic Services and Livelihood Projects involving the community;
- 5. The parties acknowledge their obligations.

#### H. Field-Based Validation/Information

The validation was conducted through a dialogue at the IP meeting hall of sitio Granvida, Bugtong Na Tuog, Socorro on July 27, 2021. It was attended by more or less 50 participants composed of IP leaders/elders, Barangay Officials, and the Community members including former KAMTI Chairman Ramon Salamat, IP representative for the conversion of the IP's Ancestral Domain Claim into CADT.

After the preludes of a simple program, the FBI team explained the purpose and objectives of the validation. A resolution from the IP leaders/community members requesting for road concreting, which is part of the supporting documents of the project was brought for confirmation. This request affirmed the document by the participants to be their earnest request to the Province.

Knowing the same group and leaders will be consulted to the other project of the Provincial Government entitled "Construction of Mindoro Trading and Consolidation Facility" (Bagsakan Center) at the DEMO farm of the Province, the validation team brought out and mentioned including the site for the construction of this project. The group appreciated the proposed project saying it is favorable to them for they will have a trading center where they can brought their farm products at standard price. The validation team also asked the estimated distance of the Demo Farm to their ancestral domain and the IP leaders/elders estimated saying it is more or less 12 kms. Away. The bagsakan center will be built inside the demo farm compound located beside the National road at Merit, Victoria. The validation team with selected IP leaders agreed to visit the demo farm the following day with the continuous assistance of the Provincial Government through their representative.

After the explanation of the validation team, Ms. Maritess De Guzman, representative of the Provincial Government explained further regarding their proposed two projects (concreting of FMR & Construction of Trading and Consolidation Facility). She also explained regarding houses built near the road that may be affected or damage brought by the road construction; she said the Provincial Government will provide housing materials for replacement of affected dwellings. She also mentioned some of the program and projects of the Provincial Government such as provision of housings to indigent.

The field validation team asked regarding what part of the proposed 10.734 kms. road concreting is covered or within their ancestral domain; the IP leaders/elders said only the existing road going to their community(sitio Granvida) is covered by their ancestral domain, CADC No. 085 or only about one-seventh(1/7th) of the 10.734 kms. proposed road concreting project.

Ramon Salamat, longtime IP leader and representative for the delineation of the Mangyan Tadyawan Ancestral Domain Claim(CADC No. 085) explained more about the history including the contents, directions and IP communities covered by their ancestral domain.

The participants were once again asked regarding their interest in the road construction; the community strongly stressed the necessity and importance of the project. They said having a convenient and comfortable road will bring many benefits to them; their farm products will be transported easier; their children will be motivated in going to schools; and during or in times of emergencies like sickness and or giving of birth will be delivered easier and faster to the hospitals.

With the heavy clamors and concerns raised by the IP group, the FBI team affirmed the essential, importance and immediate need for the implementation and construction of the road project(FMR).

#### Assessment and observation

Road for concreting beginning from Barangay Merit, Victoria up to Barangay Bugtong Na Tuog, Socorro already exists, there will be no new road opening, only road widening.

Most part of the road network is concreted, however tittle portion will be retain based from our observations considering that most of the concreted roads have cracks and damages. There were also parts of the road not concreted apart from narrow widths.

Construction of a bridge across the subaan river is very important and essential for this will connect the road going to the non-IP and IP communities of Barangay Happy Valley and Barangay Bugtong Na Tuog respectively. The residents in these two mentioned barangays particularly the IPs are hard-up and in danger every time they will market their products. During bad weather and or rainy season, motorcycles and even automobiles can't hardly or cannot cross the river anymore.

The four(4)non-IP barangays starting from sitio Merit to Happy Valley where the road construction traverse benefit from the project, but more on the IPs living in Granvida, Barangay Bugtong Na Tuog who will be using the entire road considering that their barangay is the last and farthest part of the road project.

From the 10.734 kilometers FMR concreting project of the PGOM, it embraces a tiny portion of the ancestral domain of the Tadyawan IPs which is more or less 1.5 kilometers located at the last segment of the road where the IP community is located.

Request for the concreting of the existing road through community resolution was positively affirmed by the IP leaders/elders and community members being one of the basic needs of the IPs

the validation team also asserts the importance of the road concreting project that include the road going to the IP community of sitio Granvida which is very rough and at high elevation that always brought danger to every community member during his travel.

# J. Recommendation:

In view of all the above information and result of the Field-Based Validation, the FBI team respectfully recommends the issuance of a CERTIFICATION PRECONDITION for the Concreting of Farm to Market Road (FMR) from Barangay Merit, Victoria up to sitio Granvida, Barangay Bugtong Na Tuog, Socorro, Oriental Mindoro.

# INDICATIVE MANAGEMENT PLAN

#### I. INTRODUCTION

Description of the area

The proposed Concreting of Barangay Merit-Concepcion, Victoria-Barangays Ma. Concepcion-Happy Valley-Bugtong na Tuog, Socorro Farm-to-Market Road with Bridge is located in the municipalities of Victoria and Socorro. Victoria is bounded on the north by the Municipality of Naujan, on the south east by the Municipality of Socorro, and on the southwest by the Municipality of Sablayan, in Occidental Mindoro. Socorro is bounded on the north by Naujan Lake and the Municipality of Victoria, on the east by the Municipality of Pola, on the south by the Municipality of Pinamalayan, and on the west by the province of Occidental Mindoro.

The existing road network is connected to the Calapan South Road leading to the Provincial Demo Farm in Merit, Victoria and Bugtong na Tuog, Socorro. The total Road Influence Area of 3,482.37 hectares was identified based on the 2.5 km radius from the subproject. Based on Comprehensive Land Use Plans of Victoria and Socorro, all the barangays within the RIA are all prime agricultural lands. Other land uses include NIPAS, forest, agriculture and pasture/grasslands.

Based on the 2015 PSA Census, population in the five (5) barangays covered by the subproject totaled 4,392 wherein 584 are from Merit and 714 from Concepcion, Victoria; 708 from Ma. Concepcion; 1,165 from Happy Valley and 1,221 from Bugtong na Tuog in Socorro. There are 1,009 households in the project area - 130 from Merit; 159 from Concepcion; 165 from Ma. Concepcion; 271 from Happy Valley and 284 from Bugtong na Tuog.

The major economies in Victoria and Socorro are agriculture and trading. Major agricultural products include rice, corn, and high value commercial crops like coconut, calamansi, banana, rambutan, lanzones and durian. Based from the records of the Permits and Licensing Division, there were 1,297 commercial establishments in Socorro as of 2011, and 734 in Victoria as of 2014. Data from the Provincial Agriculture Office (2018) showed that crops produced in Victoria and Socorro include rice with 69,514.63 MT; banana with 25,811.19 MT; citrus with 6,983.67 MT; rambutan with 1,036.06 MT; lanzones with 192.20 MT; and coconut with approximately 20 million wholenuts. Livestock and poultry population, on the other hand, consists of 4,277 carabaos, 4,911 cattle, 8,681 swine, 3,919 goats, 98 horses, 12,512 ducks and 67,080 chickens.

The municipal and city level small area poverty estimates of the PSA showed that Socorro's poverty incidence increased from 15.4% in 2012 to 17.2% in 2015. On the other hand, Victoria's poverty incidence slightly decreased from 18.0% in 2012 to 17.4% in 2015.

#### II. OBJECTIVES

The general objective of the subproject is to improve the socio-economic status of people in the influence areas.

Specifically, it aims to:

- reduce travel time of commuters, basic goods and commodities by 20 minutes (from Barangay Bugtong na Tuog, Socorro to Merit, Victoria and vice versa);
- 2. increase number of vehicles traversing the area by 20% after a year of project completion;
- increase the volume of goods transported via land vehicles with a shift in mode of transportation from habal-habal to Public Utility Jeep (PUJ) or Filcab;
- 4. reduce transport losses by 39% for banana, 4% for coconut, and 49% for calamansi; and
- increase cultivated agricultural land area by 100 hectares for banana, and 50 hectares for both coconut and calamansi.

#### III. PROJECT SCHEDULE

The proposed subproject will be undertaken by the lowest evaluated Contractor as a result of competitive bidding in accordance with the World Bank procurement guidelines. Project implementation will officially start seven (7) days after the issuance of Notice to Proceed to the winning contractor up to the scheduled project duration estimated to be within a period of 190 calendar days exclusive of 68 unworkable days.

#### IV. TECHNICAL ASPECTS

#### Project activity

Out of the total road stretch of 10.734 kilometers, the 7.667 kilometers will be concreted and a bridge of 30 linear meters will be constructed. The bridge will be connecting Barangays Happy Valley and Ma. Concepcion, and will also serve Barangay Bugtong na Tuog residents. There are identified portions along the road stretch where drainage canals, wall protection, and slope protection will be constructed. This would provide convenient road accessibility that will lessen the travel time of commuters. Such improvement will also develop accessibility to market centers/trading posts in the Poblacion and proposed Oriental Mindoro Trading and Consolidation Facility at the Provincial Demo Farm in Merit, Victoria.

#### Description of production/development

Majority of the road is in bad paved condition such that farmers experience difficulty in transporting their produce to the nearby market. It also affects the crops' quality therefore, farmers usually sell their produce to traders(middleman) but at unreasonable price compared to the prevailing market price.

The community will have numerous benefits upon project completion. First is the reduction in travel time and fare because there will be possible new modes of transportation introduced in the area like public utility jeep (PUJ) or Fil-cab. Second, the quality of crops being transported will be improved leading to minimal spoilage and increased farmer's income. Third, the far-flung barangays will be easily reached with basic services and emergency response during calamities will be strengthened. Fourth, farmers will be able to deliver their produce to the nearby market thereby eliminating the middleman issue which also results to more profit. Fifth, there is a high possibility of increase in land valuation because of the improved road. Sixth, there will be enhanced school participation in the area. Seventh, investors will potentially come in because of its convenience. And lastly, travelling in the area will be safer and more comfortable for the public.

The 30-linear meter bridge will connect Barangays Merit and Concepcion in Victoria, Barangays Ma. Concepcion and Happy Valley with Barangay Bugtong na Tuog in Socorro. It will provide access to nearby markets and communities, and trading of agricultural produce.

#### Site development

Part of the 10.734-kilometer road with bridge are 1.814-kilometer gravel and 8.890-kilometer concrete types. Rubble concrete canals, wall and slope protections will be constructed in identified portions of the road stretch. The existing road carriageway width is 3.0 meters with no allocated shoulders on both sides which causes traffic in some major points of the road. There are portions that need curved widening for 1.50 meters shoulder width. There is no permanent obstruction in the road sections.

The proposed 7.667-km PCCP has a thickness of 0.23 m and 5.00 m width, and 1.50 m shoulder width on both sides of the road. The Reinforced Concrete Deck Girder (RCDG) Bridge has a length of 30 lm with a width of 4.60 m, a carriageway of 7.32 m, sidewalk of 0.76 m and 0.35 m railings on both sides, two approach slabs of 4.00 m by 8.00 m, and two abutments with wingwall. The proposed RCPC of 0.610 m Ø by 7.00 m length will be constructed in the identified stations. The proposed stone masonry slope protection will be constructed in the identified stations with a length of 0.943 km and 1.403 km on the right and left sides, respectively. A stone masonry with drainage canals, will be constructed in some portion of the road with a length of 0.618 m at the right side and 0.210 m at the left. At the right side of stations 6+900 – 6+940, 8+900 – 8+960, 9+020 – 9+100 a proposed brick wall will be constructed.

The scope of work described in the project's Program of Work includes Combined Field Office and Laboratory Building for the Engineer; Project Sign Board; Occupational Safety and Health Program; Mobilization and Demobilization; Earthworks (clearing & Demoval of Concrete bridge structure, removal of existing concrete pavement, removal of RCPC 24 mm Ø – 610 mm Ø, structure excavation, embankment from roadway excavation, embankment from borrow, subgrade preparation); Surface course(sub-base course); Surface course (Portland Cement Concrete Pavement, 230 mm); Bridge Construction (precast concrete piles, furnished 450mm x 450mm, precast concrete piles, driven 450mm x 450mm, precast concrete test piles furnished and driven, pile shoe, splicing of RC piles with epoxy, reinforced concrete railing double, reinforcing steel bars grade 40 bridge structure and other major structures, reinforced steel grade 60, structural concrete class A 20.68 MPa, structural concrete class A 27.58 MPa, lean concrete, prestressed structure concrete members girder T-IV B launching erection); Drainage and Slope Protection Structure (reinforcing steel bars, structural concrete class A, reinforced concrete pipe culvert 610mm dia., reinforced concrete pipe culvert 1,220 mm dia.,stone masonry); Miscellaneous (Chevron sign).

Additional construction of RCPC at stations 0+447.90, construction within the retained existing PCCP at stations 5+577.50 and 5+744.7, removal and replacement at stations 6+501.65, 7+0.14.15, and 8+194.50, and removal at 6+780.

Slope protection will be constructed at Stations 1+540 to 1+560 left and right side, 2+220 to 2+240 left side, 2+720 to 2+820 left and right side, 2+820 to 2+900 left side, 3+000 to 3+020 left side, 3+20 to 3+040 left and right side, 3+040 to 3+060 right side, 3+940 to 4+020 right side, 3+330 to 3+350 left to right side, 3+940 to 4+020 right side, 4+200 to 4+220 left and right side, 4+340 to 4+360 right side, 4+200 to 4+220 left and right side, 4+340 to 4+360 right side, 4+480 to 4+500 left and right side, 6+160 to 6+180 left and right side, 6+620 to 6+719.22 left and right side, 6+746.22 to 6+880 left and right side, 6+880 to 6+960

Rubble concrete canal will be constructed at Stations 6+746.22 to 6+960 right side, 8+840 to 8+940 right side, 8+950 to 9+030 left and right side, 9+040 to 9+100 right side, 9+440 to 9+520 left side, 9+560 to 9+620 right side, 10+580 to 10+630 left side, and 10+630 to 10+734.54 right side.

#### V. MANAGEMENT ASPECTS

#### Organization

The institutional and organizational aspect is important in the implementation and management, accountability and sustainability of the project. The Provincial Project Management Implementing Unit (PPMIU) will serve as the management unit in charge of the planning, design and implementation of the project. The PPMIU's Monitoring and Evaluation Unit under the I-SUPPORT Team shall conduct regular monitoring and evaluation activities to ensure that the project components and objectives are implemented and achieved.

# Management strategies/policies

To ensure the project's sustainability, the Provincial Government of Oriental Mindoro (PGOM), in coordination with the concerned barangays, shall provide in their respective budget the necessary annual funding and manpower requirements for the subproject's operation and maintenance.

Road Maintenance works are classified as routine and periodic. Routine maintenance activities are done throughout the year and are labor intensive. These activities will be carried out according to agreed sharing of responsibilities with the barangay, municipal and provincial government to promote greater sense of responsibility and ownership of the project thus ensuring sustainability of project implementation.

#### VI. FINANCIAL ASPECTS

#### Project cost

The estimated project cost of ONE HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE MILLION NINE HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FOUR PESOS (Php 163,969,774.00) will be needed for the improvement of the access road and construction of bridge.

# Sources of funds

Of the total project cost, 80% or Php 131,175,818.75 will be taken from the Loan Proceeds, 10% or Php 16,396,977.34 from Department of Agriculture – Grant and the remaining 10% or Php 16,396,977.34 will be the PGOM's Equity.

# **Financial Projections**

The economic and financial analysis of the proposed project showed an Economic Net Present Value of PhP 2,103,684.08; Economic Internal Rate of Return of 139.01% and Benefit Cost Ratio of 12.77.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE SANGGUNIANG PANLALAWIGAN OF ORIENTAL MINDORO to authorize Provincial Governor Humerlito A. Dolor, for and in behalf of the Provincial Government of Oriental Mindoro (PGOM) to apply for Gratuitous Special Land Use Permit (GSLUP) with the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) for the construction of two (2) Farm to Market Roads under the Philippine Rural Development Program (PRDP), namely: (1) Concreting of Barangays Merit-Concepcion, Victoria — Barangays Ma. Concepcion-Happy Valley-Bugtong Na Tuog, Socorro Farm to Market Road with Bridge; and (2) Rehabilitation / Construction / Concreting of Rosacara Farm to Market Road with Bridges, subject to full compliance with all applicable laws, rules and regulations, and to the following mandatory conditions:

- 1. That, the Provincial Governor and all involved department heads and employees of the PGOM, and all parties who signed legal instruments pertaining to the GSLUP complied and shall continue to fully comply with all applicable laws, rules and regulations, as well any subsequent findings, orders or decisions by relevant government agencies, in connection with the review, execution or implementation of the GSLUP which compliance shall be the sole duty and continuing responsibility of said officials or parties;
- 2. That, the said application for GSLUP and relative contracts, and other legal instruments and related documents and all related activities and actions appurtenant thereto shall undergo a thorough due diligence, legal and compliance review by the Provincial Legal Officer and the Provincial Internal Auditor who shall independently issue separate certifications of legality and propriety, to be attached to and made an integral part of the records, as a mandatory prerequisite prior to signing or execution by the Provincial Governor;
- 3. That, no public fund or money shall be appropriated, disbursed or applied to execute or implement any program, project, activity or object of expenditure under the subject application for GSLUP without the prior approval of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan embodied in a duly enacted/approved/signed resolution or ordinance;
- 4. That, the approval of this Resolution by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan is based solely on the independent representations by the Office of the Provincial Governor and departments of the PGOM who signed the request and should not be construed as concurrence to any separate actions by said officials at anytime, whether before or after the approval of this Resolution, nor should such approval make the Sangguniang Panlalawigan a party to any such actions; and
- 5. That, in case of failure by the said officials to comply with any of the foregoing conditions, the approval of this resolution shall be automatically withdrawn and of no effect ab initio.

Let a copy of this Resolution be furnished to Provincial Governor Humerlito A. Dolor, the Provincial Finance Committee, the Provincial Legal Officer, the Internal Auditor, and all concerned officials for their information.
