

Post-Disaster Needs Assessment (PDNA) in Palawan on the Effects of Typhoon "Odette"

TERMS OF REFERENCE



BACKGROUND

- Republic Act No. 10121, otherwise known as an Act strengthening the Philippine
 Disaster Risk Reduction and Management System, providing for the National
 Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Framework and institutionalizing
 National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan, Appropriating Funds
 thereof and for other purposes has strengthen the DRRM system of the Philippines.
 Section 9 on the said law states the function to conduct early recovery and post
 disaster needs assessment institutionalizing gender analysis as part of it.
- NDRRMC Memorandum No. 153,s.2021 dated 28 December 2021 to all concerned National Government Agencies, Constitutional Office, State Universities and Colleges, Government-owned or controlled Corporations; The Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils, Civil Society Organizations, and Non-Government organizations RDRRMCs of MIMAROPA, Western Visayas, Central Visayas, Eastern Visayas, Northern Mindanao and Caraga with the Subject: Conduct of Post-Disaster Needs Assessment (PDNA) relative to the onslaught of Typhoon Odette with international Name Rai

OBJECTIVES

- To provide guidance to all DRRMCs and other agencies concerned from the government and private sectors on the creation of Regional/Provincial PDNA Team.
- To ensure an efficient, effective, and well-organized post disaster rehabilitation and recovery after a major disaster, the government begins with conducting an aggregate but detailed sectoral assessment of the disaster damages, losses, and impacts leading to the identification of critical needs of the affected sectors

THE REGIONAL/PROVINCIAL PDNA TEAM

 Creation and Composition of Regional/Provincial team is composed of trained PDNA representatives of all selected member-agencies of the MIMAROPA Regional



Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council and selected members of the Palawan Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council. An executive committee shall coordinate and spearhead the work of PDNA and shall be composed of representative from the following:

The Regional PDNA Team may call upon any department, bureau, office, agency or instrumentality of the government, including Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) and non-government organizations (NGOs) for assistance as circumstances and exigencies may require.

2. Policy Guidelines

General principles in conducting PDNA and the following shall be strictly observed;

- a) The PDNA shall follow a human development approach, which is a people-centered approach. The concept of human development guides the human recovery dimension to restore people's abilities to reach their full potential to lead productive, secure, and peaceful lives in accordance with their needs and interests.
- Ensure the mainstreaming of gender-responsive, culture-appropriate conflictsensitive, and peace and security-promoting approaches in the conduct of PDNA at all levels, at all times
- c) The PDNA shall maintain sensitivity and relevance to the lives of individuals, human development and human rights, and the development processes of their communities and the society at large.
- d) Information gathered from the field shall be considered confidential until the final report is approved





3. Tasks and Responsibilities of the PDNA Teams:

The following are generally the tasks of the PDNA Teams:

- Gather and consolidate baseline information from LGUs, particularly at the local offices and barangay level.
- b) Work closely with relevant National and Regional agencies.
- Undertake field visits in disaster-affected areas to collect information on damages and losses.
- d) Write assessment reports on damages and losses, needs and impacts.
- e) Identify strategies for recovery and reconstruction phase to institutionalize the "Build Forward Better" principle.
- f) Facilitate consultation and validation of the Assessment Report to Broad sectors and sub-sector groups.
- g) Finalize the Report based on the inputs received from broader consultation. The final PDNA report and the RRP will be presented to the RDRRMC, Regional Development Council, TMG of NDRRMC, and the Chairperson, NDRRMC

4. Sectors and Organization

The PDNA shall assess various sectors, and the final report shall have the following four (4) broad Sectors with sub-sectors. The Regional, Provincial, City Offices/ Agencies responsible for the assessment are as follows:

4.1 Productive Sector shall be in charge of all livelihood damage, loss and needs of four major sectors- agriculture, mining, trade and industry and tourism. The composition of the Cluster shall be as follows:

(to include Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) and

4.4 Support Cluster is a sub-cluster under cross sectoral cluster. The sub-cluster shall be in charge in providing for technical and financial advice to the National PDNA team. The composition of the Cluster shall be as follows:

5. Role of the Office of Civil Defense

 The Office of Civil Defense (OCD) shall ensure that the LGUs, through the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (LDRRMOs), are properly informed about the PDNA.

2. Shall coordinate and recommend participants coming from the Regional Agencies and LGUs, ensure availability of needed basic supplies and





logistics, and conduct a proper briefing for the safety and security of PDNA team, as necessary.

3. Before deployment OCD shall ensure the availability of needed basic supplies and logistics

- 4. OCD Regional Directors shall supervise the personnel in the deployment site under their area of responsibility
- 5. Coordinate with the LGUs for the participation of their Local PDNA teams in undertaking the PDNA in their geographical coverage area.

6. Debriefing shall be held at the Emergency Operation Center (EOC) in the deployment site before the demobilization of the PDNA teams

- 7. OCD shall prepare and secure accommodation, food, and transportation arrangements for the PDNA Team to the deployment site from port/airport/seaports/terminal upon arrival in Palawan and throughout the assessment period.
- 8. OCD shall, in coordination with DOH, ensure that appropriate vaccinations and medical kits are provided to the PDNA team members before field assessment.

Role of Department of Interior and Local Government

The Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG), as a member of RDRRMC, shall direct local government officials to allow the access of PDNA Team to available data, provide focal personnel counterparts to the team/s and ensure the safety and security of the PDNA Teams.

6. Report

The PDNA Report shall be the official basis of the Office of the President for rehabilitation plan.

7. Affected Areas to be assessed

The PDNA Team created will cover the affected municipalities in the Province of Palawan including Puerto Princesa City.

8. Training

Identified PDNA teams from the Regional, Provincial and City will undergo an Orientation that will be provided by the Office of Civil Defense. Orientation is deemed mandatory before conducting PDNA.

9. Secretariat Support

The Office of Civil Defense (OCD) shall serve as the Secretariat of the PDNA Team.





10. Funding

Transportation expenses, meals and accommodation in the deployment site are chargeable to Office of Civil Defense except airfare and per diem of the participants subject to the usual government accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

11. DBM Form

The DBM Form shall be used in the field validation in addition to the standard PDNA sectoral forms and in drafting the recommended recovery and reconstruction needs during the workshop.
