The BMB Director may also invite other relevant government agencies, institutions, and experts to serve as resource persons during the event. The training-workshop will be conducted in a hybrid setup, face-to-face and online via virtual platform (Zoom).

Secretariat support shall be provided by the Wildlife Resources Division (WRD) of BMB. All reasonable expenses, including food and accommodation, to be incurred in the activity shall be charged against the Wildlife Resources Division's fund. Supplies and materials shall be shouldered by the ISLA Biodiversity Conservation, Inc. Per diem, transportation costs, and other incidental expenses of the participants during travel time shall be charged against their respective offices, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

The BMB Director is also authorized to change the date and venue of the above activities if deemed necessary due to unforeseen events/circumstances.

The BMB shall submit to the undersigned an activity report through the Human Resource Development Service within fifteen (15) days upon completion of the activity.
