With the implementation of the Lawin Forest and Biodiversity Protection System, respectfully submitted is the detailed report of the Busuanga Pasture Reserve Management Office (BPRMO) on the results of the Lawin monitoring and patrolling conducted in the Municipalities of Busuanga and Coron, Palawan within the BPR area for the month of February 2022.

L. Findings and Result

Two (2) Patrol Teams were dispatched during the conduct of this activity within the Forest Conservation Area (FCA) of BPR situated in the Municipalities of Coron and Busuanga, Palawan. The target distance for month of February 2022 is 30 kilometers (km) based on the Lawin Patrol Plan for 1st Quarter of 2022. On the said month the BPRMO Patrol Teams were able to traverse an aggregate distance of 34.33km or 114.43 % (Table 1).

Table 2 shows a total of 139 Forest Condition Counts (FCCs) recorded during the patrolling. Early Secondary Forest (ESF) appears to have the highest figure recorded for February 2022 with 62 counts or 45%, while Old Growth Forest has no recorded observation.

The remaining forest conditions such as: Open-Uncultivated (OUC), Open-Cultivated (OC), and Advance Secondary Forest (ASF) with corresponding total figures of 24(17%), 21 (15%), and 32 (23%), respectively. Based on the SMART analysis, the total FC with good condition has a total count of 94 or 67.62% which includes OGF, ASF and ESF.

With respect to the presence of natural regenerants, 95 FCCs or 68% of the total FCC were recorded with presence of natural regenerants while 44 FCCs or 32% with absence of natural regenerants. There was no recorded in dense natural regenerants, while fifty-four (54) FCCs or 39% and forty-one (41) or 29% are recorded as moderate and sparse natural regenerants, respectively (Table 3).

There were no recorded observation of threats during the conduct of patrol and monitoring in the month of February. The current threat index is computed as 0 threats per kilometer (T/Km) in February 2022, same from August 2021, down from 0.12 threats per kilometer (T/Km) in the last recorded threat in the month of January 2022.

II. Remarks and Recommendations

- Frequency of the visibility of patrolling and LAWIN monitoring within the Forest Conservation Area of BPR is being intensified to include weekends, if necessary, in order to prevent and immediately address any possible threats within the forested areas of BPR;
- Observed unlawful activities in the ground is being thoroughly investigated and documented and filing of appropriate criminal complaints against the offenders pursuant to Presidential Decree No. 705 and other environmental laws, if so warrant:
- Conduct of seminar/IEC to every barangay recorded with high incidence of unlawful activities within the area covered by the BPR to provide awareness and educate the community on the importance of maintaining ecological and

environmental balance in the locality and the benefits that could be derived from the forest and climate change mitigation; and

 Conduct of rehabilitation activities such as tree-planting, enrichment planting and assisted natural regeneration to maintain and accelerate recovery of forest cover.







This reports presents trends in observations of forest condition, regeneration, threats and indicator species. The combined presentation allows for an evaluation if protection efforts are effective, conservation targets are met and the forest achieves the desired future forest condition. Protection efforts are effective, when records of forest condition, regeneration and indicator species show an upward trend towards more observations more and denser regeneration, particularly in degraded forest areas. Increasing trends in indicator species suggest that the improved forest condition is providing a better habitat for forest dependent species. All trends presented are put in relation to the patrol effort to provide comparability. Forest cover data were derived from 2003 and 2010 NAMRIA land cover maps.


Trends of Observations per Patrol Kilometer in the Forest Conservation Area

Trend in Threats




A decreasing trend in threats in the forest conservation area mean effective forest protection; an increasing trend means the opposite.

Trend in Indicator Species




An increasing trend in indicator species in the forest conservation area means effective forest protection; a decreasing trend means the opposite.






Location of observed threats
