Pinoy Indie Films Road Show was founded in 2018 by **Ms. Karen Jane Salutan** who is a filmmaker and a businesswoman. She saw the struggles of the indie filmmakers who do not have a platform and marketing resources for their films that is why she established Pinoy Indie Films Road Show that bridges the gap between the indie filmmakers and their markets (Schools and government offices) which serves as a new and unconventional platform to promote Filipino culture and arts through independent films especially films about education, peace, women empowerment, health, environment, gender equality and other films that have social impact that are made by independent filmmakers and producers. We bring socially relevant films in schools, government offices and communities through block screenings across the country especially in remote areas where Filipino films are not shown. Our goal is to make independent Filipino films to be accessible to every Filipino. Most of the films that are accessible to the masses are films that are made by big studios and have advertising budget.

At present, a lot of great independent Filipino films have no means and opportunity to screen in mall theatres and during this time of pandemic, most commercial Filipino films are shown digitally through Netflix and other online platforms. Some Filipino films maybe lucky to have limited screenings in mainstream cinemas where Hollywood and mainstream films dominate the theatres. The only options available to them are school campuses and occasional invitations to micro cinemas which are not enough to create the public impact mainstream films make through simultaneous screenings. We offer Filipino films that are suitable for what our client needs and those films are about education, violence against women and children, women empowerment, agriculture, indigenous people, family values and etc. We are helping independent filmmakers and producers who make films with great Filipino values, films that can shape the heart and minds of many Filipinos and films that can bring awareness about the issues in the society that need to addressed and resolved. These filmmakers do not have the opportunity for their films to be shown and compete in commercial theaters even on streaming platforms such as Netflix and they do not have the budget to promote their films on television and other traditional media.

In an industry dominated by film goliaths and tycoons, we are a game changer in the endeavors that we are taking in and we are able to excel and being recognized because of our sincerity and commitment to help the independent filmmakers, love for the country and our passionate service to our fellow Filipinos. We fell in love with the Philippines because of our rich audio-visual heritage, culture and tradition. Even we grew up in Manila or cities we can understand the people from Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao through regional films. This is what we want to share to our fellow Filipinos from the cities and in the far-flung areas: to appreciate and love our own culture We want others to be complete human beings who are critically thinkers and to lead productive lives by learning good values from the films that we are showing. Good values that they can carry as they grow up and become productive and law abiding citizens of the country.

We won a grant from **DOST under Women-Helping-Women: Innovating Social Enterprise (WHWise) Grant** that will help us to develop **EdukSine app and streaming website** for educational and socially relevant films that will cater to the current pandemic situation. This innovation will allow us to reach more Filipinos all over the Philippines and abroad. We will launch EdukSine in the third quarter of 2022. We are in the transition phase of becoming EdukSine Corporation.



CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

In 2019, we have launched our new program called "**Cine Kabundukan**" last year in Kalinga Province and we are dreaming to reach more Filipinos in the far-flung areas in the Philippines. We have observed that it is not impossible to bring socially relevant films in the mountains. We have shown **Ang Guro kong di marunong magbasa and Ang Babae sa Likod ng Mambabatok** in Bgy. Pasil, Magsilay and Tabuk City, Kalinga last September 29, 2019 and Oct.4, 2019. We have shown the films for free, gave school supplies, books, bags from Eton International School, beauty products from BeaUtify, Greenelas slippers and bibles. The kids, teachers and the barangay officers who have watched the films had the chance to watch these types of films for the first time.

They were touched by the message of Ang Guro kong di marunong magbasa that promotes the value of education, hope and peace and they are happy to see their treasure and very own Apo Whang Od in a movie.



If we want to make the younger generation reflect deeper, to have

critical thinking, if we want to make the Philippines a great nation-then it means we need to support the independent films that have the power to create a better nation and we can bring them not just in the cities but also in the mountains.

KABABAIHAN NG MALOLOS Directed by Sari Dalena and Kiri Dalena



SYNOPSIS:

With BasiliaTantoco as narrator, the film dramatizes the events from 1888 to 1906 when the Women of Malolos worked for the liberation of the country and of Filipino women. In 1888, the ladies asked the Gov General for permission to open a night school where they could learn Spanish. Despite the objections of the Spanish friars who saw this as a political move, the women opened their school in 1889, inspiring Jose Rizal to write his Letter to the Young Women of Malolos. But the school lasted for only four months because the Spanish friars cracked down on the town's activists. In 1896-1897, many of the women provided food, arms, and clothes for the Katipuneros of Bulacan. During the Phil-Am war in Feb 1899, eight of them served the first Red Cross in Malolos. In 1906, ten joined and recruited members



for the local chapter of the AsociacionFeminista Filipina, the first women's organization in the country. The film ends with the firm resolve of Basilia's barcada to continue the struggle for the complete liberation of Filipino women of all classes.



SINANDOMENG Directed by Byron Bryant



SYNOPSIS:

A heart-warming comedy about this strongwilled daughter of an old farmer who had to do the farming herself because all the men in the family have gone working abroad, the last one to go was her husband, who left in a different way, collapsing dead one morning while plowing the field. After her husband's burial, Sinang is offered a good price by a big subdivision developer to sell her parcel of land. While her sisters consider selling their parcels, which they all equally inherited from their invalid father Ka Domeng, Sinang firmly refuses. Unlike them whose husbands are sending money from abroad, she has no source of income but her small farm. Sinang has the heart for farming. With daughter Aliyah helping her, she resolutely plows the land, nurse the rice seeds, going through the whole process with diligence. The experience is filled with frivolity and happy moments. But old wounds are refreshed between sisters, too. Still, love for



family and for their inherited land prevail in the end. And Sinang's field turns green as they finish planting, promising a bountiful harvest.



SYNOPSIS:

Sol Searching revolves around strict grade school teacher Sol Dolores (Gilleth Sandico), the only person in the community who has the guts and patience to educate the farmers. Living in a province whose only source of livelihood is farming, Sol saw what others had left as is—that their village's farmers lack the knowledge and funds to produce enough crops for a living.

When Sol dies, her husband Djanggo Dolores (Joey Marquez) does not have enough funds to have her buried. It reached a point where her coffin had to be brought by Lorelei Baloloy (Pokwang) and Bugoy (JM Salvado) to various places so they could get enough funds or finally find someone who can help bury her

SYNOPSIS:

The film is based on the classic Philippine short story 'Tanabata's Wife' by Baguio born author Sinai Hamada published in the 1930s.

It is the early part of the 20th century and Japanese immigrant farmers are doing well with vegetable gardens in La Trinidad Valley near Baguio, where they have pioneered the cultivation of salad greens in the region, among them Tanabata- San. Middle-aged and lonely, he hires a young Bontok woman, Fasang, as farmhand, and falls in love with her. They marry and have a son, Kato. They grow the garden, but Fasang is enamored of the city lights of an emerging Baguio. She loves the cinema. She falls for the wiles of a distant cousin, Okdo, and they elope, taking Kato with them.



With only his teen-aged aide Tiago working the farm, Tanabata is distraught. He loses his will to live and abandons the garden. He wants to go home to Japan to die, wishing only to see his wife and son one last time. Fasang falls on hard times, too. Okdo loses his job at Camp John Hay and abandons her. She goes to the work camp to dig roads. When all seems lost, Tiago finds Fasang and implores her to come home with Kato. Tanabata-San's family is restored: True love like the seasons will have its way, it is as old as the mountains.
