Furthermore, this is to reiterate our recommendations on your previous reports that succeeding submission of CBFMA monitoring reports including CSC or CBFM-CARP projects implementation status/updates should not be per CENRO/PENRO, instead, the Region should consolidate the report of all CENROs/PENROs and submit one report in Completed Staff Work (CSW) format providing the Region's review and evaluation and summary of findings of the individual reports from the field offices for proper evaluation of the target activity and accomplishment of the region.

INTRODUCTION

In recognition of the urgent need for effective action to minimize negative upstream- downstream and on-site-off-site impacts of forest management externalities, the Philippines in 1995, officially adopted the Community-Based Forest Management (CBFM) as its overall strategy of the government towards the management and protection of forest and forestlands. This policy formulation was made through Presidential Executive Order (EO) No. 263, and allied people-oriented policies and programs of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR).



Community-Based Forest Management (CBFM) is a program of the government to encourage reforestation and sustainable management of forests. CBFM covers all areas classified as forestlands, including allowable zones within protected areas not covered by prior vested rights. The program integrates and unifies all people-oriented forestry activities of the Integrated Social Forestry Program, Community Forestry Program, Coastal Environment Program and Recognition of Ancestral Domain. Through CBFM agreement, a particular community was provided tenurial security and incentives to develop, utilize, and manage specific portions of forest lands. CBFM Agreement is a production sharing agreement between the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) and the participating People's Organization (POs) for the period of 25 years renewable for another 25 years. The Department of Environment and Natural Resources is mandated to provide technical assistance to CBFM participants "to help them attain sustainable forest management." The agreement is intended to "help participant's access investment capital, identify markets, and build marketing capabilities." CBFM agreements may be made in "all areas classified as forest lands, including allowable zones within protected areas not covered by prior vested rights.

COMMUNITY BASED FOREST MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT (CBFMA)

Regular montitoring of the CBFMAs within the jurisdiction of CENRO Brooke's Point is being conducted quarterly. In addition to these, continuous comminucation and partnership with the PO of Punang Christian Muslim Native Mullti-Purpose Cooperative (PCMN-MPC) and Bono-Bono, Malihud, Bulalacao Community Based Forest Management Integrated Upland Farmers producers Cooperative (BMBCBF-FMIUFPC) is developed and strengthened.

I. PUNANG CHRISTIAN MUSLIM NATIVE MULTI-PURPOSE COOPERATIVE (PCMN-MPC)

Formerly known as Punang Muslim Native Multi-Purpose Cooperative (PCMN-MPC) was awarded with CBFM Agreement No. RIV-PAL CBFMA-2000-17 issued on December 21, 2000 with a total of 1,481.25 hectares of forest land located at Barangay Punang Sofronio Española, Palawan. PCMN-MPC is registered to Cooperative Development Authority (CDA) with Registration No. 950-04008171 dated January 26, 2000.

1.2 PROJECT IMPLEMENTED WITHIN CBFM AREA

In 2017, The cooperative became a partner of DENR in the implementation of the of CBFM-Comprehensive Agrarian Reform-Program Beneficiaries Development (CARP-PBD) Project covering an area of 20 hectares within the CBFM area. The POs had established an Agro-forestry project (Narra, Rubber and Cacao) intercropped with Banana (Saba) with a total cost of Four Hundred Thirteen Thousand Four Hundred Pesos (Php. 413, 400.00) located at Barangay Punang Sofronio Española, Palawan

Currently, the PO holder's continuously conducted maintenance and protection of established CBFM-CARP project within the tenured area such as strip brushing activities within the planted areas. Some of Cacao planted were found healthy while the Banana is on the fruiting stage which indicates that the planted commodities are surviving because of continuous care provided by the PO members, while the planted Rubber, Narra and some cacao is died due to unshaded and direct from sunlight.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The primary objectives is to rehabilitate the denuded areas to augment on global change program and at the same time enhance livelihood to beneficiaries by planting fruit trees, vegetables, root and other crop and forest trees.

The people's organization (PO) should practice scientific farming and stooped kaingin making and other forms of forest destruction within and adjacent areas of the CBFM. They should improve their open lands and contribute in reducing if not eliminating the effect of global warming/climate change and other calamities. Increase additional income to CBFM PO beneficiaries.

ACCOMPLISHMENT AND STRATEGIES EMPLOYED

It was agreed by the BOD members and occupants within the agroforestry area that some of the members will provide the planting materials and the other was purchased and raised of the members

When the plants becomes productive, 30% of the production will be collected by the people's Organization and the remaining 70% will be given to the members occupying and developing the area on base on the gross proceeds of the products.

As described above, the nursery has an aggregate area of 930 square meters with good source and abundant water supply for use in the nursery and for the workers. The agroforestry area is accessible to all kinds of lands transportation. The transport of seedlings to planting site does not give burden to planters because carabao can be used in hauling.

PROBLEM ENCOUNTERED AND LESSONS LEARNED

Per observations during the implementation of project, that prior to the establishment of the project these must be first presented by the official and members of the organization for purposes of transparency and accountability to ensure full participation and support of the beneficiaries. Likewise on-site training or demonstration must also be conducted to observe proper planting techniques including maintenance and protection. Further, observed that no survey, mapping and planning (SMP) was conducted to ensure appropriate seedling species be planted in a specific area.

Planting techniques and silvicultural practices should be imparted to the PO members through training. CBFM personnel in the CENRO assigned in the area to monitor the different activities undertaken by the PO have limited time due to distance of CBFM areas due to other functions assigned to him. Based on the MOA, the project is one (1) year and/or until the project has been accomplished. However, release of billing payments for the PO were being delayed and it was overlooked by our office so live up the activities for implementation used also delayed.

Shortcomings/lapses identified during the conceptualization and identification phase are the following:

- 1. Soil Analysis
- 2. Choice of species to be planted suited in the area
- 3. Delayed in releasing of funds to PO intended for the purchase of planting materials
- 4. Lack of CBFM personnel and vehicle in the CENRO level to closely monitor the project implementation
- 5. Practice of Survey, Mapping and Planning

RECOMMENDATIONS SUSTAINABILITY MECHANISM

- 1. Benefit sharing between the PO and individual agreement must be documented
- 2. Strengthening of PO must be guided and closely monitored by the DENT personnel
- 3. Provision of funds for maintenance, protection and sustainability of the project especially planted and fruit trees and other cash crops that need brushing from time to time.
- 4. Training of members on livelihood.

1.3 MEETINGS CONDUCTED

On April 20, 2021, CBFM Desk Officer Forester Laarni R. Bolido and her team FTI Mary Cris A. Ibaňez and Forest Ranger Jovencio P. Damaso scheduled meeting with the Officers of PCMN-MPC. The main objective of the meeting is to discuss and informed PO regarding the CARP Project proposal for CY 2022 funding and other related matters regarding the organization

During the meeting, the PO officers raised that the project they wanted was forest tree plantation intercropped with Banana and the other one which is fuel wood. But, after a long serious discussion the PO had decided and agreed that there is no area suitable for the project that they wanted.



Some of the members of the cooperative have ventured on oil palm plantations. They have also established gardens which serve as one of the sources of income of the members residing within the CBFM area and non-members who have claims within the CBFM area.

Palm oil maintenance and harvesting is the major source of income of CBFM members.

1.4 ISSUES AND CONCERN

The following are the identified problems of the PCMN-MPC Peoples Organization:

- The absence of Unity. The officers admitted that they are not able to give their 100% assistance and dedication to the project due to other duties and functions they had attend to. The People's Organization observed that they no longer function with their duties and responsibilities. No more meetings conducted such as to discuss relevant matters on how to achieve their goals as it was stated in the CBFM agreement. As a PO they must to strengthen the organization themselves, nor to seek regular advice with DENR CENRO.
- Project implemented. Some officers recounted of doing the project matters and responsibilities on their own and of not seeing much of each other. The established livelihood project in their area was not properly maintained by the PO after implementation due to non-cooperation and delayed payment of accomplished activities
- Lack of financial support. The officers also claimed about the lack of financial support for the maintenance of their plants and other project implemented.
- Protection and management. Lacking of forest protection activities within the tenured area. There are reports of illegal cutting of trees or timber poaching in the tenured area
- Non-membership of individuals occupying the tenured area which cooperation from them is hard to realized and solicited in the implementation of programs/projects
- Several Certificate of Land Ownership Agreement (CLOA) were issued by Department of Agrarian Reform over the CBFMA area. The subject area is classified as Timberland.
- ❖ Palm Oil Plantation within CBFM area. The portion of CBFM are planted with Palm Oil Plantation which is the one of the source of income of the People's organization
- In 2019, thru the assistance of this Office, their CRMF and Five Year Work Plan were updated covering CY 2019 to 2024. These are currently pending for affirmation

The recommendations and suggestions to wit:

- Reorganizing and empowering the People's Organization thru reorientation of terms and conditions of the agreement. Reiteration of the officers and members of their duties and responsibilities.
- Training/Workshop to capacitate the officers and members of the existing ENR laws, rules and regulations and deputation as Deputized Environment and Natural Resources Officer (DENRO) of selected members of the people's organization.
- Continuous recruitment of more members especially occupants within their tenured area
- Preparation of detailed work plan for each officer to assist/guide them to function more effectively and efficiently.
- Conduct of monthly meeting of officers and quarterly meetings of PO members to immediately address issues and concerns.
- Formulation of a development plan for livelihood projects/programs to be submitted to other Government agencies and financial institutions for possible funding.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The primary objectives is to rehabilitate the denuded areas to augment on global change program and at the same time enhance livelihood to beneficiaries by planting fruit trees, vegetables, root and other crop and forest trees.

The people's organization (PO) should practice scientific farming and stooped kaingin making and other forms of forest destruction within and adjacent areas of the CBFM. They should improve their open lands and contribute in reducing if not eliminating the effect of global warming/climate change and other calamities. Increase additional income to CBFM PO beneficiaries.

ACCOMPLISHMENT AND STRATEGIES EMPLOYED

It was agreed by the BOD members and occupants within the agroforestry area that some of the members will provide the planting materials and the other was purchased and raised of the members

When the plants becomes productive, 30% of the production will be collected by the people's Organization and the remaining 70% will be given to the members occupying and developing the area on base on the gross proceeds of the products.

As described above, the nursery has an aggregate area of 930 square meters with good source and abundant water supply for use in the nursery and for the workers. The agroforestry area is accessible to all kinds of lands transportation. The transport of seedlings to planting site does not give burden to planters because carabao can be used in hauling.

LIVELIHOOD SUPORT AND AGRI-CROPS

a. Features and Planned activities

Intercropping agri-crops is frequently adopted by some members of the PO. Resources needed are cutting suckers, tools and fertilizer, both organic and inorganic. These planting materials are available in the area and can sustain their livelihood program. Registered active beneficiaries are sixty (60) cooperators.

b. Accomplishment and strategies

All items indicated in the Work and Financial Plan (WFP) were procured by the PO. The activities in the whole plantation are PO managed.

The implementation of all activities in the project site was done in a bayanihan system. Based on the MOA, the duration of the project is One (1) year. But due to the delayed in the release of fund for the purchase of seedlings and other materials, it took almost three (3) years to complete the activities scheduled in the work and financial plan. All planted fruits and forest tress are still unproductive except the agri-crops which is harvested.

MONITORING SYSTEM AND ACTIVITIES

Monitoring of all activities is being done be CBFM personnel and the PO for proper documentation of their projects accomplishment and to solve the problem as soon as possible, if there is any. This is also to update the accomplishment for reporting purposes.

An actual monitoring on the different activities at the agro-forestry project is being done quarterly by the DENR-CBFM personnel and PO officers to ensure proper implementation of the project and to check if the schedule of activities is on time.

INITIAL RESULT /OUTCOME

For short term crops like agri-crops/cash crops, the PO has already a succeeding production, planted were Pineapple, Banana, Cassava and other cash crops. These were sold thru wholesale or retail in the market.

After more than three (3) years of project implementation, it has been observed that PO members who were engaged in Agri-crops production have not used new farming techniques. But PO still lives with the combination of the traditional way of farming methods some tries slash and burn.

PROBLEM ENCOUNTERED AND LESSONS LEARNED

Per observations during the implementation of project, that prior to the establishment of the project these must be first presented by the official and members of the organization for purposes of transparency and accountability to ensure full participation and support of the beneficiaries. Likewise on-site training or demonstration must also be conducted to observe proper planting techniques including maintenance and protection. Further, observed that no survey, mapping and planning (SMP) was conducted to ensure appropriate seedling species be planted in a specific area.

Planting techniques and silvicultural practices should be imparted to the PO members through training. CBFM personnel in the CENRO assigned in the area to monitor the different activities undertaken by the PO have limited time due to distance of CBFM areas due to other functions assigned to him. Based on the MOA, the project is one (1) year and/or until the project has been accomplished. However, release of billing payments for the PO were being delayed and it was overlooked by our office so live up the activities for implementation used also delayed.

Shortcomings/lapses identified during the conceptualization and identification phase are the following:

- Soil Analysis
- 2. Choice of species to be planted suited in the area
- 3. Delayed in releasing of funds to PO intended for the purchase of planting materials
- Lack of CBFM personnel and vehicle in the CENRO level to closely monitor the project implementation
- 5. Practice of Survey, Mapping and Planning

RECOMMENDATIONS SUSTAINABILITY MECHANISM

- 1. Benefit sharing between the PO and individual agreement must be documented
- 2. Strengthening of PO must be guided and closely monitored by the DENT personnel
- 3. Provision of funds for maintenance, protection and sustainability of the project especially planted and fruit trees and other cash crops that need brushing from time to time.
- 4. Training of members on livelihood.

B. NATIONAL GREENING PROGRAM

To address the problem of climate change, as country's contribution to the global effort former President Aquino promulgated the Executive Order No. 26 in 2011 that established the National Greening Program and Executive Order No. 193 in 2015 expanding the coverage of the National Greening Program to rehabilitate/reforest the open and denuded forestland nationwide. This program basically aims to address poverty reduction, resource conservation and protection, productivity enhancement, and climate change mitigation and adaptation.

The CBFMA holder is a contractor/partner in the implementation of NGP since it's launching in 2011 for the comprehensive site development of open areas identified within their tenured areas. The program provided the people's organization a livelihood and additional income to its members. This involves employment of some women in the seedling production or nursery operation and tree planting activities while the site preparation as well maintenance and protection activities were undertaken by the head of the families. Non-members with claimed or occupied area within the tenured area were also employed/hired in the nursery operation and plantation establishment.



1.4 FIELD WORKS CONDUCTED

On May 25, 2021, the DENR-CENRO Brooke's Point Personnel continuously conducting regular monitoring and providing technical assistance in the implementation of different programs and projects as well as strengthening the management of their organization to encourage active participation of members and membership of other occupants of CBFMA area including the development of alternative livelihood program. The CBFM staff always reminding the PO of their responsibilities to comply the terms and conditions stipulated in the agreement and be guided of the CRMF and Annual Work Plan. The following are the recommended activities conducted as follows:

- The PO immediately assume responsibility for the protection of the entire forest lands within the CBFMA area against the illegal logging and the other forms of forest destruction;
- 2. Follow all duly-promulgated laws, rules and regulations pertinent to forest management;
- Prepare and implement CRMF,RUP and Annual Work Plans with assistance from DENR and LGU
- 4. Formulate and implement benefit sharing schemes among its members
- 5. The enforcement unit conducted lawin patrol within

Other than CBFM-CARP and NGP which provides livelihood to the members and occupants within CBFM area, other claimants/occupants not involved in the implementation of the subject programs were conducting traditional farm practices which they are planting particularly agricultural crops such as Upland Rice, Banana, Cassava, Pineapple, Calamansi and Coconut for their additional source of income and for their family's food consumption. Aside from that,

the presence of native fruit trees such as Tabo and Maraitum (wild Rambutan) and non-timber forest products such as honey, Tiger grass, (Parokpok), Rattan, Almaciga, Kawayan and Buho also provides additional income to the members and/occupants within the CBFM area. The products produced within the CBFM area helps each claimants survive the effect of COVID 19 pandemic.



Community Based Forest Management (CBFM) Annual Accomplishment Report for CY 2021

1.5 ISSUES AND CONCERN

The following are the identified problems of the BMBCB-FMIUFPC POs:

- The absence of Unity. The officers admitted that they are not able to give their 100% assistance and dedication to the project due to other duties and functions they had attend to. The People's Organization observed that they no longer function with their duties and responsibilities. No more meetings conducted such as to discuss relevant matters on how to achieve their goals as it was stated in the CBFM agreement. As a PO they must to strengthen the organization themselves, nor to seek regular advice with DENR CENRO.
- Project implemented. Some officers recounted of doing the project matters and responsibilities on their own and of not seeing much of each other. The established livelihood project in their area was not properly maintained by the PO after implementation due to non-cooperation and delayed payment of accomplished activities
- Drought issues. Because of drought occurrences, the officers complained on insufficient supply of water to satisfy their planted crops and trees' water requirement which resulted to low plants' survival rate and lesser production.
- Lack of Financial support. The officer also claimed about the lack of financial support for the maintenance of their plants and other farm implements. The subject regarding their failure of compliance with the requirement of the cooperative Development Authority (CDA) concerning business establishment was also brought up.
- Protection and management. Lacking of forest protection activities within the tenured area. There are reports of illegal cutting of trees or timber poaching in the tenured area

The recommendations and suggestions to wit:

- Reorganizing and empowering the People's Organization thru reorientation of terms and conditions of the agreement. Reiteration of the officers and members of their duties and responsibilities.
- Training/Workshop to capacitate the officers and members of the existing ENR laws, rules and regulations and deputation as Deputized Environment and Natural Resources Officer (DENRO) of selected members of the people's organization.
- Continuous recruitment of more members especially occupants within their tenured area
- Preparation of detailed work plan for each officer to assist/guide them to function more effectively and efficiently.
- Conduct of monthly meeting of officers and quarterly meetings of PO members to immediately address issues and concerns.
- Formulation of a development plan for livelihood projects/programs to be submitted to other government agencies and financial institutions for possible funding.






