I. INTRODUCTION AND RATIONALE

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), with funding from the Global Environment facility (GEF) and support from the United Nations Development Program (UNDP), is implementing the project entitled "Integrated Approach in Management of Major Biodiversity Corridors in the Philippines" or BD Corridor. The Project aims to operationalize integrated management of biodiversity corridors to generate multiple benefits including effective conservation of globally threatened species and high conservation value forests, reduce deforestation and degradation, and enhance local biodiversity-friendly livelihoods. It is aimed at addressing the increased degradation of habitats from deforestation and conversion to agriculture and expanding infrastructure development, pollution, invasive alien species (IAS) and climate change which are threatening critical habitats and ecosystems and their attendant biodiversity. This Project has four components, namely:

- Component 1: Effective coordination and governance framework for integrated ecosystem management in the Philippines biodiversity corridors system;
- Component 2: Application of integrated network design and management of biodiversity corridors to ensure continued stability and sustainability of their biological, ecosystem services and socio-economic conservation values;
- Component 3: Community-based sustainable use and management systems in the two pilot biodiversity corridor systems in the Philippines; and
- Component 4: Knowledge management, gender mainstreaming, learning, monitoring and evaluation.

A preparatory and Year-end Assessment Planning Workshop will be conducted to assess progress to date, clearly define the directions and set the basis for succeeding formulations of annual work and financial plans. in project implementation, present and validate the Annual Work and Financial Plan for 2023. This activity will also serve as a venue to resolve challenges faced by the Project,

share lessons, good practices, innovations, and success stories (LGIS) and discuss implications for future implementation.

II. OBJECTIVES

At the end of the assessment and planning workshop, the participants would have:

- 1. Clarified and agreed on the Project Results Matrix describing distinct levels of results, with corresponding verifiable indicators, means of verification and potential challenges;
- 2. Reviewed project progress to-date and confirmed remaining end-of-project targets with indicative (annual) timeframes;
- 3. Clarified and agreed on NPMU, EMBC PMU and MBC PMU scope of remaining work and targets using the annual implementation plan format outlining major activities with corresponding interim indicators or milestones, and proposed activity cost assumptions for similar activities;
- 4. Formulated detailed activities, interim indicators, and annual targets for each component of the Project;
- 5. Specified responsible parties and agreed on coordinated implementation schedules with clear input-output requirements;
- 6. Drafted 2023 Annual Plan with proposed budget requirements; and,
- 7. Prepared and presented the 2022 Annual Progress Report, including slippages, implementation constraints and measures taken to address these, and LGIS, if any.

IV. METHODOLOGY

Pre-work activities

- Submission of Progress-to date Reports by EMBC PMU, MBC PMU, NPMU, FMB, DA-BSWM, and National Consultants by end of October 2022, to include recommendations based on experienced challenges, lessons, successful innovations, and suggestions for success stories that may be transformed into communication materials and publications.
- 2) Submission of draft Work and Financial Plans for 2023 by EMBC PMU, MBC PMU, NPMU, FMB, DA-BSWM, for presentation and discussion during the Workshop.

Activities during the Assessment and Planning Proper

- a) Presentation of Corridor and Component Accomplishments for 2022. The Corridors and Component leads concerned will present their accomplishments vis targets, including slippages, implementation constraints and measures taken to address these, and LGIS, if any;
- b) Group workshops. The participants shall be grouped into five: 1) Mindoro Biodiversity Corridor; 2) Eastern Mindanao Biodiversity Corridor; and 3) DA-BSWM; 4) FMB, and 5) DENR, BMB and National Project Management Unit The sub-groups will discuss their Work and Financial Plans for 2023, building on the gains from 2022; and
- c) Plenary Discussion and brainstorming. The groups will present the Work and Financial Plans for 2023
