SUBJECT : EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE PROTOCOL
ICOW WITH TROPICAL DEPRESSION "PAENG"

DATE : 27 October 2022

Reference:

- a. NDRRMC Memorandum No. 181 s. 2022 dated October 26, 2022

Per DOST-PAGASA, at 5:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Depression "PAENG" was estimated based on all available data at 660 km East of Borongan City, Eastern Samar (12.1 °N, 131.5 °E). Moving West Northwestward at 10 km/h. Maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h.

Tomorrow early morning through evening: Moderate to heavy with at times intense rains likely over Bicol Region, Eastern Visayas. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains possible over MIMAROPA, BARMM, Zamboanga Peninsula, Northern Mindanao, Caraga, Quezon, Cagayan, Isabela, Apayao, Aurora, and the rest of Visayas.

Tomorrow evening through Saturday: Heavy to torrential rains possible over Bicol Region, Northern Samar, and Quezon. Moderate to heavy with at times intense rains possible over Metro Manila, Western Visayas, Aurora, Bulacan, Mindoro Provinces, Marinduque, Romblon, the eastern portions of Cagayan and Isabela, the rest of Eastern Visayas, and CALABARZON. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains possible over Cordillera Administrative Region, Zamboanga Peninsula, BARMM, and the rest of Visayas, Cagayan Valley, Central Luzon, and MIMAROPA.

As per NDRRMC Memorandum No. 181 s. 2022 dated October 26, 2022, the Emergency Preparedness and Response Protocols ICOW with Tropical Depression "Paeng" for MIMAROPA is raised to **BRAVO** effective immediately. The EPR Protocols shall be subject to change based on updates on the hazards situation and risk levels.

In this regard, All MIMAROPA RDRRMC Member Agencies and LDRRMCs are directed to undertake the following actions:

- a. Send warnings and advisories
- b. Cascade preparedness directives
- c. Activate EOC to Blue Alert
- d. Activate selected Response Clusters




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- e. Preemptively evacuate communities
- f. Pre-activate rapid deployment teams (IMT, RDANA, etc.)
- g. Preposition resources
- h. Account, assess and ensure operational readiness of response facilities (EOCs, evacuation centers, etc.)
- i. Account, assess and ensure operational readiness of critical lifelines (water, communications, power, etc.)
- j. Monitor secondary hazards (such as dam release, flashfloods, etc.)
- k. Secure properties, small sea vessels and other movable assets to safer ground
- l. Ensure maritime safety of all watercrafts (as appropriate)
- m. Issue appropriate travel advisory
- n. Arrange for advance assistance for communities, as authorized
- o. Release Situational Report

Further, the following RDRRMCs are directed to activate the corresponding EPR Protocols:


RDRRMC	EPR Protocol

VI and XII	CHARLIE Protocol (due to Trough of TD "PAENG" and Shear Line)
CALABARZON and MIMAROPA	BRAVO Protocol (due to Tropical Depression "PAENG")
X, CARAGA, and BARMM	BRAVO Protocol (due to Trough of TD "PAENG" and Shear Line)
IX	ALPHA Protocol (due to Trough of TD "PAENG" and Shear Line)

The activation of EPR Protocols shall be effective immediately. It is understood that the EPR Protocols shall be subject to change based on updates on the hazard situation and risk levels.
