**ACTIVITY REPORT ON CONDUCTED 3rd QUARTER WATERBIRDS
ASSESSMENT AT SNAKE ISLAND NCMCR ON AUGUST 5, 2022**

As part of the regular monitoring of waterbirds population in Snake Island-National Coastal and Marine Center for Research, a quarterly assessment was programmed to monitor its population and analyze for further studies. For the 3rd quarter of year 2022, monitoring team from PENRO Palawan and SIMO in partnership with CENRO PPC and City ENRO conducted the assessment on August 5, 2022.

During the assessment, fourteen (14) bird species were observed, eleven (11) of which are waterbirds with a total of forty-six (46) individuals recorded and three (3) were forest birds with a total of nine (9) individuals counted. The species with the most individuals recorded is the Lesser Sand Plover, which has 23 individuals counted. It was low tide during the monitoring. The table below also shows the conservation status of these waterbirds based on International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Redlist of Endangered Species version 2020-2, Department of Environment and Natural Resources Biodiversity Management Bureau (DENR BMB): Philippine Redlist of threatened wild fauna Part 1 - Vertebrates and the Palawan Council for Sustainable Development (PCSD) Resolution No. 15-521.


