I. Opening Program

The meeting started at around 1:30 in the afternoon with an invocation led by PASu Villanada.

II. Agenda

1. Roll Call and Proof Of Quorum

PASu Villanada has declared that six (6) out of nine (9) PAMB members were present, hence there is a quorum.

2. Call to Order

Pursuant to BMB Technical Bulletin No. 2017 – 04, PAMB Quiatchon was chosen to preside over the meeting on motion of PAMB Rodil and seconded by PAMB Francisco, with concurrence of the body.

3. Review of the Minutes of the Previous Meeting

PAMB Quiatchon asked PASu Villanada to present the previous minutes and resolutions of the meetings conducted last May 4, 2022 in Sablayan and on July 6, 2022 in Bayview Park Hotel, Ermita, Manila.

The members of the board read and reviewed the minutes of the previous meeting conducted on May 4, 2022 at the Palayok ni Jing Restaurant, Sablayan, Occidental Mindoro.

PASu Villanada informed the board that during the PAMB special meeting conducted on July 6, 2022, there were four (4) approved resolutions but only two (2) of them were signed by the Regional Executive Director. She then read and discussed the resolution as well as the responses of Atienza Interisland Ferries Inc. and RBL Fishing Corporation. She also discussed and explained the agreement during the meeting for the information of the other PAMB members who did not attend last July 6, 2022. Both shipping companies were given only seven (7) days to respond upon receipt of the PAMB Resolutions requiring them to compensate for the certain administrative fines.

Upon motion of PAMB Algene Edward Francisco and seconded by PAMB Roberto S. Rodil, with concurrence of the body, the minutes of the meeting for May 4, 2022 and July 6, 2022 were approved with no corrections.

5. New Business

RESPONSE LETTER FROM ATIENZA INTER ISLAND FERRIES INC. AND RBL FISHING CORPORATION PERTAINING TO THE DISCUSSION ON RECENTLY CONCLUDED PAMB SPECIAL MEETING LAST JULY 6, 2022 AT BAYVIEW PARK HOTEL

PASu Villanada read the letter from the Atienza Interisland Ferries Inc. The letter was sent to the Protected Area Management Office via email on July 12, 2022. The letter was asking for a reconsideration regarding the required amount of administrative fine set by the PAMB.

PAMB Quiatchon said that as per his understanding the Atienza Interisland Ferries Inc. did not give a direct answer pertaining to their resolution. He also added that the AIFI, once again, just discussed what they already know and that the company, in no manner, is willing to compensate the damages that they incurred.

PASu Villanada said that as per Atty. Gandhi, if the Atienza Interisland Ferries Inc. will not cooperate, the PAMB can decide to file and pursue a criminal case against them.

DMO III Rongavilla informed the board that she and Atty. Gandhi had a discussion before the meeting. She said that if the PAMB will decide to file a criminal case against Atienza Interisland Ferries Inc., the board needs to establish the prohibited acts they were violated. She then highlighted the possible acts under R.A 11038 (ENIPAS Law):

Sec. 20. *Prohibited Acts.* - Except as may be allowed by the nature of their categories and according to rules and regulations governing the same, the following acts are prohibited within protected areas:

- "(a) Poaching, killing, destroying, disturbing of any wildlife including in private lands within the protected area;
- "(g) Operating any motorized conveyance within the protected area without a permit from the PAMB, except when the use of such motorized conveyance is the only practical means of transportation of IPs/ICCs in accessing their ancestral domain/land;

Sec. 21. *Penalties*. - Violation under this Act shall be subject to the following penalties:

- "(a) A fine of not less than Two hundred thousand pesos (P200, 000) but not more than One million pesos (P1, 000,000) or imprisonment from one (1) year but not more than six years, or both, plus damages of triple the value of the said resources, or both, shall be imposed upon any person who violates paragraphs (a) to (e) of Section 20 herein;
- "(e) Administrative fines of not less than Fifty thousand pesos (P50,000), but not exceeding Five million pesos (P5,000,000), shall be imposed by the DENR Secretary for the violation of any rule, regulation, or provision of any agreement reached with the PAMB: Provided, That if an area which has sustained damage from any activity conducted therein requires rehabilitation or restoration as determined by the court, the offender shall be required to restore or pay compensation for damage, which payment shall accrue to the IPAF.

PAMB Quiatchon clarifies if the imprisonment is only charged to the Boat Captain. PASu Villanada said that according to their legal officer, the liable will only be the boat captain and crew. She was also uncertain if the shipping company will also be held liable by the officiating judge.

DMO III Rongavilla said that these were the challenges that the PAMO and PAMB will encounter.

PASu Villanada said that if PAMB agreed to pursue and file a criminal case against the Atienza Interisland Ferries Inc., the PAMO will prepare immediately the affidavit and all pertinent documents to be submitted to Atty. Gandhi for review and suggestions.

The board agreed to pursue and file a criminal case against the Atienza Interisland Ferries Inc.

PASu Villanada read and presented the response letter from RBL Fishing Corp. The fishing company were asking to reduce the administrative fine from Php 2,298,720.00 to Php 600,000.00

PAMB Quiatchon asked for the comment of the PAMB members regarding the reply of RBL Fishing Corporation.

DMO III Rongavilla informed the board that RBL Fishing Corporation has been involved recently with the same incident last January 5, 2022 in Palawan. The coral damage is at around 1,554 sq. meters amounting to 18 million. After a series of administrative hearings and negotiation, both parties agreed to compensate the amount of 3.1 million. She added that as per Atty. Gandhi the shipping company was not a newbie regarding the grounding incident in a protected area.

PASu Villanada said that when she and SCDO Nicanor were in Palawan for a seminar last June 2022, she had a chance to discuss the same situation with the PASu of Ursula Island Game Refuge and Bird Sanctuary. RBL was forced to pay and settle the administrative fine set by the Local Government because they were fishing in Palawan Area and they can be banned from operating there if they won't settle their damages.

PAMB Quiatchon asked the board if they will stand firm with the previous resolution whereas asking the RBL to pay the administrative fine amounting to Php 2,298,720.00.

PAMB Diamante asked PASu Villanada on the amount of the brand new speedboat.

PASu Villanada said that upon the canvassing done by the PAMO, the brand new speedboat was ranging from 1.7 to 2 million. She then suggested to lessen the amount of administrative fine from Php 2,298,720.00 to Php 1,700,000.00 which can be paid in cash or a 30-footer high speed watercraft with 115 HP outboard engine.

On motion of PAMB Grace Diamante, seconded by PAMB John Paul Ramos, with concurrence of the body a "RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 012 SERIES OF 2022 RE RESOLUTION REQUIRING THE RBL FISHING CORPORATION TO COMPENSATE THE DAMAGE ON CORAL REEF BROUGHT ABOUT BY THE GROUNDING OF F/V MONALINDA 85 AT APO REEF NATURAL PARK AMOUNTING TO P 2,298,720.00, DECREASING THE AMOUNT TO PHP 1,700,000.00" was passed

RESULT OF WATER QUALITY MONITORING ASSESSMENT FOR THE DRY SEASON FOR CY 2022

PASu Villanada presented the result of the water quality monitoring assessment for the dry season conducted last May 23, 2022.

PAMB Quiatchon requested PASu Villanada to present and explain the result of oil and grease from last year for them to have a comparison. He also asked if the methodology of the EMB Laboratory on analyzing the water samples was differ from the Optimal Laboratory.

CMEMP EO Salvador informed the board that the PAMO were accompanied by the EMB personnel during the collection of water samples. The EMB personnel instructed them to collect samples on the water surface only. Unlike their previous collection, they collected multi-level samples and then mixed it into the sample bottles or container.

PASu Villanada clarified this issue in their recently concluded training in Zambales. She asked for the standard procedure on collecting water samples but the EMB explained that the guideline on water quality monitoring and assessment for marine ecosystems is still in process. It is, however, indicated in the EMB manual to have a multi-level water collection, hence this should be used.

PAMB Ouiatchon asked when the PAMO did receive the result of the water analysis. He then suggested conducting the WQMA twice every season. And also asked PASu Villanada if the PAMO needs the help of the PAMB regarding the fund for the WOMA.

PASu Villanada informed the board that the EMB laboratory testing located in Calapan City is free; however, some of the parameters such as nitrate and phosphate are not available. Those parameters are also important to monitor within the protected area. The private laboratory during the last WQMA in ARNP costs around P 72,000.00 for 5 sampling sites excluding travel costs and other incidentals.

PAMB Diamante agreed with the suggestion of PAMB Quaitchon to conduct WQMA twice per season, however the PAMO are still coping from the pandemic therefore spending fund for that activity is challenging because there are many maintenance work/activity and other priorities that the PAMO will be done under the IPAF. She added that since there is an allotted budget from the regular fund, she suggested continuing the conduct of the WQMA as stated on the Work and Financial Plan
