SUMMARY OF DISCUSSION AND DECISION POINTS

The Expanded Regional Intelligence Committee (ERIC)-4B (MIMAROPA) held its Second Quarter 2022 Meeting on 231400H June 2022 via Zoom video teleconference, with RD **Ariel T Perlado**, Chair, ERIC-4B, as the presiding officer.

The agenda of the meeting were as follows:

- Update on the Peace and Order in MIMAROPA;
- Post-Elections Assessment vis-à-vis CTG Party-list Groups;
- MIMAROPA RTF-ELCAC Countermeasures to Protect the Youth from the CTG

II. Call to Order and Opening Remarks

Having a quorum, RD **Perlado** called the meeting order.

DRD **Santos** delivered the opening remarks in the meeting. In her message, she provided a background on the agenda items that will be discussed during the meeting. She also encouraged everyone to actively participate in the meeting, comment on the agenda items, and share information.

For his part, RD **Perlado** welcomed the newly-assumed U2, WESCOM CDR Mark Francisco, as the well the presence of the distinguished members of the ERIC-4B.

83 **III. Review of the Minutes and Decision Points/Actionable Items of the**
84 **ERIC-4B 1st Quarter 2022**

85
86 The Body approved and adopted the Minutes and Decision
87 Points/Actionable Items of the ERIC-4B 1st Quarter 2022 after being moved
88 and seconded.

89
90 Following the approval of the minutes, the Body reviewed and
91 provided an update on the actionable items of the previous, meetings;

- 92
93 • For the ERIC-4B Secretariat to provide a copy of the OYSTER to
94 the DepEd for review

95
96 The ERIC-4B Secretariat reported that it has yet to provide a
97 copy of the OYSTER to the DepEd as it is waiting for the National
98 SAKM Cluster to give an updated version in view of the change
99 in the administration.

100
101 Meanwhile, the Chair called on the attention of the DepEd
102 representative Atty **Joana Labuguen** to discuss the planned
103 intensification of the information campaign in the youth sector,
104 noting that despite the efforts of the Security Sector, the
105 Kabataan Party-list still managed to win seats in Congress
106 during the last elections. He reiterated the suggested to
107 include the Orientation on the Youth and Student Recruitment
108 of the CPP-NPA-NDF (OYSTER) to the schools' curriculum and
109 orientations to be conducted during the first day of class.

110
111 For her part, Atty **Labuguen** advised that they are open with
112 the request, and they just need the copy of the OYSTER for their
113 review and endorsement to the DepEd central office. She
114 added that this is a good timing since the review of the new
115 curriculum for the following school year is ongoing.

- 116
117 • To coordinate with the PIA-MIMAROPA to discuss the relevance
118 and importance of the LPE

119
120 The ERIC-4B Secretariat reported that it has already sent the
121 materials on the second localized peace engagement (LPE)
122 dialogue to the PIA-MIMAROPA to be converted to social
123 media.

- 124
125 • To coordinate with ERIC member-agencies for the conduct of
126 the NTF-CTA to their offices, particularly with the DAR vis-à-vis
127 the DAREA disaffiliation and the NHA

This is an ongoing and continuous effort, with some ERIC member-agencies already able to receive the orientation on the NTF70-CTA as well as the Security Awareness Seminar.

- For the PRO-MIMAROPA to provide a copy of 17 CTG personalities with rewards to the ERIC-4B Secretariat

PCol **Delorino** reported that the list is readily available, and can be immediately submitted for intelligence analysis purposes.

- For the ERIC/SAKM-4B to recommend the granting of some E-CLIP benefits to SPL members

The Chair explained the move for the inclusion of the members of the Sangay ng Partido sa Platan (SPL) as beneficiaries of the E-CLIP, especially since these are the Party elements who conduct ideological-political-organizational (IPO) in the communities. He further asserted that including SPL members in the E-CLIP will entice them to surrender and avail of the program.

- For the DENR to provide a list of coastline areas with black sand to be shared with NBI

The Chair tasked the ERIC-4B to coordinate with the DENR with regard to the request of the NBI for data on coastline areas with black sand.

IV. Highlights of the Meeting/Discussions

Update on the Peace and Order Situation in MIMAROPA

PCol **Delorino**, Chief of the Regional Intelligence Division-4B, presented a briefing on the update on the peace and order situation in MIMAROPA. He reported that the crime rates in the region have decreased.

His presentation highlighted the significant decrease (16.72 percent) in the total number of crime incidents in the region from 1,148 crime incidents from 01 January to 22 March to 956 from 01 April to 22 June this year. There has also been a decrease (27.57 percent) in the number of eight focus crimes--namely, murder, homicide, physical injury, rape, robbery, theft, carnapping of vehicles, and carnapping of motorcycles--from 185 incidents to 134 incidents during the same period. Notably, in the second quarter of 2022, rape was recorded as the most prevalent focus crime with 50 incidents, and carnapping of vehicles as the least perpetrated crime without any recorded incident.

176
177 In conclusion, PCol **Delorino** reported that the peace and order
178 situation in the region continues to be manageable, due to intense police
179 operations, strict implementation of local ordinances, maximum
180 deployment of PNP personnel on the streets, and continuous coordination
181 with other law enforcement agencies, local chief executives, and other
182 stakeholders.

183
184 The Chair commented that the data presented PCol **Delorino** are
185 very encouraging. He inquired if the figures cited by PCol **Delorino** include
186 drug-related incidents, to which the latter confirmed since these are
187 included as violations of special laws.

188
189 Meanwhile, the Chair added that the concerns on illegal drugs can
190 be included in future discussions.

191
192 Post-Elections Assessment vis-à-vis CTG Party-list Groups

193
194 ARD **Rocillo** presented a briefing on the CTG's Post-Elections Plans
195 and Activities, which was prepared the National Intelligence Committee
196 (NIC) Standing Committee on Production.

197
198 During the discussion, PLtCol **Ramil Bergado** from the APC-SL raised
199 two points. First, the pointed out that there is a need to raise awareness
200 among the political candidates on their accountability, particularly in
201 supporting the CTG. He suggested that during the filing of Certificates of
202 Candidacy (COCs), the politicians should be required to submit an
203 undertaking that they will not provide any form of support to the CTG.
204 Second, he suggested that newly-elected officials should be given an
205 orientation on the Anti-Terrorism Act of 2020 (ATA) like the
206 NTF-CTG/Orientation for Government Executives and Employees on the
207 CTG Problem.

208
209 The Chair agreed with the points raised by PLtCol **Bergado**, adding
210 that there is a need to work out and collaborate on the second point, since
211 the materials are already available. He also mentioned that this has already
212 been discussed with the DILG-MIMAROPA.

213
214 Relatedly, the **Chair** emphasized anew the importance of the filing
215 cases against the CTG, particularly its aboveground machinery, including
216 the MAKABAYAN Coalition. He further asserted that the more cases are
217 filed, the better, especially since there are multi-faceted efforts pipelined
218 against the CTG.

MIMAROPA RTF-ELCAC Countermeasures to Protect the Youth from the CTG

The Chair explained that the NIC has given directives on focusing on efforts in countering the CTG recruitment of the youths and students. He then sought the cooperation and support of ERIC-4B member-agencies in the information campaign in the youth sector, which the representatives from the RID, PRO-MIMAROPA, RMFB-4B and the 203BDE shared on their ongoing organizing and IO campaigns.

The Chair also reiterated the request for the KKDAT to be mobilized as speakers/messengers of the NTF-ELCAC, which will be supported by the NICA-4B on the condition that they will submit a one-page after-activity report for proper accounting and streamlining of the IO efforts.

Relatedly, PLTCol **Bergado** suggested that the orientation should be also given also to private companies through the coordination with the DOLE, since majority of the employees comes from youth sector. The Chair agreed and commented that it is a good idea to include the orientation prior to the employment of the personnel for them to be aware of the CTG front organizations and labor unions.

For her part, Ms **Jonalyn Flores** from the DSWD also requested for the materials on the NTF-CTA so that they can initiate the conduct of the NTF-CTA in their officers.

Other Matters

For other matters, RD **Perlado** raised the concern on the recent issuance of the warrants of arrest (WOA) against former rebels who already surrendered and currently under the custody of various AFP and PNP units, particularly in Palawan.

PLTCol **Bergado** commented that to address this issue, it is important to first determine the penalties associated with the WOAs, then the possibility of probation can be reviewed. He also raised the ongoing deliberations on the amnesty program for former CTG rebels, which can also address this issue.

For his part, U2, WESCOM Cdr **Mark Francisco** PN said that this is one of the primary issues being raised by AFP units in Palawan. He noted that this is also a matter of coordination between the AFP and the PNP. Nonetheless, he mentioned that the JAPIC-West will hold a special meeting to discuss this matter.

At this point, the Chair suggested that a case conference may be held with NTF-ELCAC and ATC lawyers to discuss this issue. He also pointed out that this can be addressed if the units involved will agree on a

workaround. He also mentioned that the MIMAROPA Legal Cooperation Cluster can be tapped to provide legal advice on the matter.

On the NTF-ELCAC budget for 2023, the Chair sought the opinion of RD **Ricky Sanchez** of the DBM-MIMAROPA on the prospects of the budget of the NTF-ELCAC in view of the change of the administration. RD **Sanchez** responded that this will depend on the thrust of the new administration, hoping that the budget will be increased in the future.

On the alleged the transportation of illegal drugs from Batangas City to the Puerto Galera in Oriental Mindoro via the Berberabe Port, RD **Perlado** instructed the NICA-4B to send an operative to PDEA-MIMAROPA to discuss this matter. He also offered to provide the PDEA-MIMAROPA with an observational post, if necessary.

V. Decision Points and Actionable Items

On the post-election plans of the CTG

- for the ERIC-4B to recommend for the inclusion of an undertaking to be signed by candidates when filing their COCs
- for the ERIC-4B to recommend for the inclusion of the NTF-CTA/OGE/IOB in the orientation of the newly-elected officials in coordination with the DILG-4B

On the NTF-CTA/OYSTER and IO campaign against the CTG

- for the ERIC-4B Secretariat to furnish the DepEd-IVB a copy of materials on the OYSTER;
- coordinate with PRO-MIMAROPA to mobilize the KKDAT chapters vis-à-vis delivery of NTF-CTA/OYSTER;
- provide copies of NTF-CTA to the DSWD.

Other matters

- for the RID-MIMAROPA to provide a copy of the 17 CTG personalities with warrants to the ERIC-4B Secretariat for intelligence purposes;
- ERIC-4B Secretariat to write a letter to the DENR-4B re coastline areas in MIMAROPA as requested by the NBI.

VI. Adjournment

To close the ERIC-4B meeting, RD **Perlado** extended his gratitude to the members for sharing the afternoon to discuss various NTF-ELCAC concerns and countering CTG infiltration of schools. He noted that the discussions had heavily focused on the need to intensify IO campaigns in schools, universities and the youth sector in a bid to negate the CTG's Kabataan Party-list. He then pushed for the inclusion of the OYSTER/OPT in orientations during the opening of classes, which was concurred by the DEPED and PNP attendees; intensification of OYSTER in KKDAT programs delivered during immersions and RCSPs; and more organizing efforts in areas where the CTG remains to have some influence. He concluded his remarks saying that he hopes that efforts of the ERIC-4B will ultimately lead to the end of the CTG in MIMAROPA

Following the closing remarks of RD **Perlado**, the meeting adjourned at 1640H.
