ORIENTATION/DEPUTATION OF WILDLIFE ENFORCEMENT
OFFICERS (WEOs) IN PENRO MARINDUQUE**

In compliance with our target under operations against illegal activities, Mobilization of Wildlife Enforcement Officers (WEO) for CY 2022, please be informed that Monitoring and Enforcement Section conducted two (2) days training orientation for the deputation of Wildlife Enforcement Officers (WEOs) on June 22-23, 2022 in the PENRO Conference Hall Barangay Bangbangalon, Boac Marinduque.

The said training was attended by selected representatives from Municipal Environment Natural Resources Office, Philippine National Police Maritime, and other government agencies. Selected staff and personnel of PENRO Marinduque likewise joined, especially those who were involved in enforcement activities.

The three (3) Resource Speakers at the said event were; Mr. Lino M. Dimapilis, Chief Enforcement Division, Forester Margie U. Ochoa, Assistant Chief Division Chief, Enforcement Division Regional Office and one (1) from PENRO Marinduque, Atty. Veronica J. Nebreja.

Day 1 (June 22, 2023)

The first day of the program started with the registration of the participants then Opening Prayer and singing of the National Anthem. The learning event was highlighted with a roll call of the participants, welcome remarks, and rationale of the activity which was led by Engr. Cynthia U. Lozano, Chief Technical Services Division.

The first topic discussed was Presidential Decree 705 or the Revised Forestry Code of the Philippines and the Salient Provision of Department Administrative Order No. 97-32 (Apprehension, Seizure and Confiscation) which was presented by Forester Margie U. Ochoa. The highlights of the topics were focused on the prohibited acts in section 77-88 of said Presidential Decree. She also emphasizes the definitions of forest products and different kinds of privileges such as permits issued by our Office.

The second topic discussed was Republic Act no. 9147 or the Wildlife Conservation and Protection Act of 2001 which was discussed by Mr. Lino M. Dimapilis, Chief Enforcement Division. The highlights of the topics were the illegal acts and penalties of the said law. Also, showed different species of flora and fauna and their conservation status. The duties and responsibilities as Wildlife Enforcement Officers (WEO) were also tackled. The Republic Act 11038 or the ENIPAS Act of 2018 was also discussed, and the different proclaimed protected areas within the Philippines and legal acts and penalties stipulated in the said act.



Day 2 (June 23, 2022)

The second day of training started with the registration of participants followed by opening prayer then the singing of the National Anthem. To start the program a short recap was led by Ms. Jell Mariel P. Riego, MENRO staff of Santa, Cruz Marinduque.

Atty. Veronica J. Nebreja, discussed the cyber-crime investigation on illegal wildlife trade and protocols on wildlife law enforcement. Atty. Nebreja, imparted how online investigation happens using different social media platforms. She also presented proper conduct of investigations and surveillance.

During the open forum some questions were raised by the participants, such as: 1. What to do during our investigation, if they refuse to sign to the apprehension receipt. Atty. Nebreja, answered that it should be noted properly in the investigation report. 2. What if they have wild plants like pitcher plants for a long time, is it forbidden to sell it?. Forester Don Gibson D. Mercado, answered that it is prohibited under RA 9147 particularly section 7 collection of wild fauna and section 8 possession of wild fauna.

Forester Ochoa, demonstrated new application called "Wild Alert" the purpose of this application is to easily identify different wildlife species that may possibly encounter in the field.

After the series of lectures, Imelda M. Diaz, OIC, PENR Officer and Engr. Cynthia U. Lozano, Chief Technical and Services Division, awarded the certificates of appreciation to the resource speakers (Mr. Lino M. Dimapilis, For. Margie U. Ochoa, Atty. Veronica J. Nebreja).

On to the last part of the program, Forester Don Gibson D. Mercado, In-Charge Monitoring and Enforcement Section, rendered his closing message and acknowledgement to all the Resource Speakers from Day 1 and Day 2 for sharing their time and efforts, he also genuinely thanks everyone who participated to the said activity.

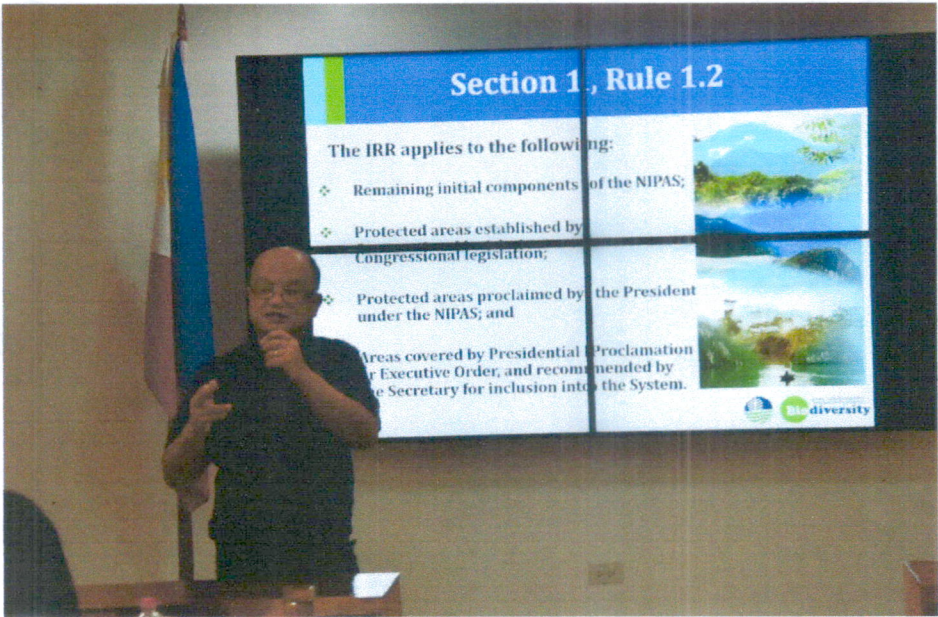

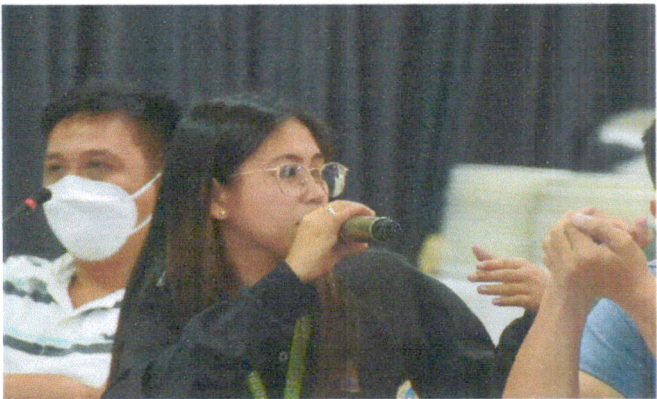

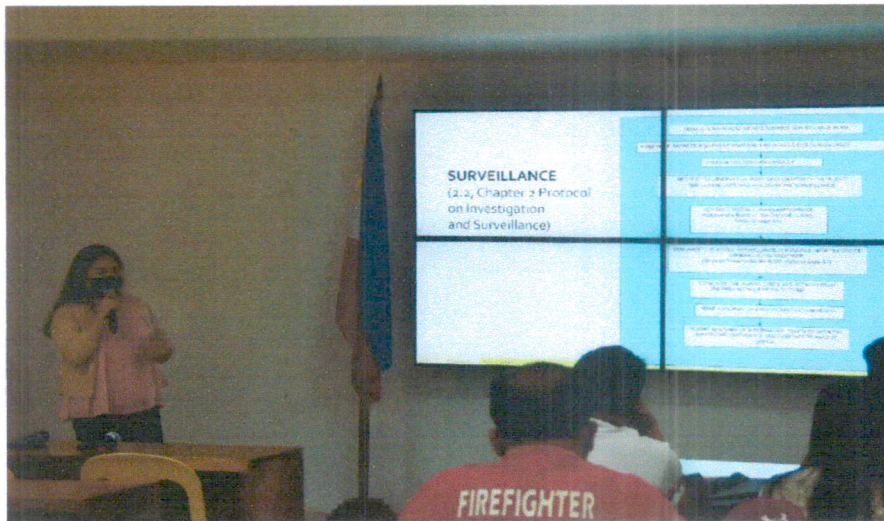

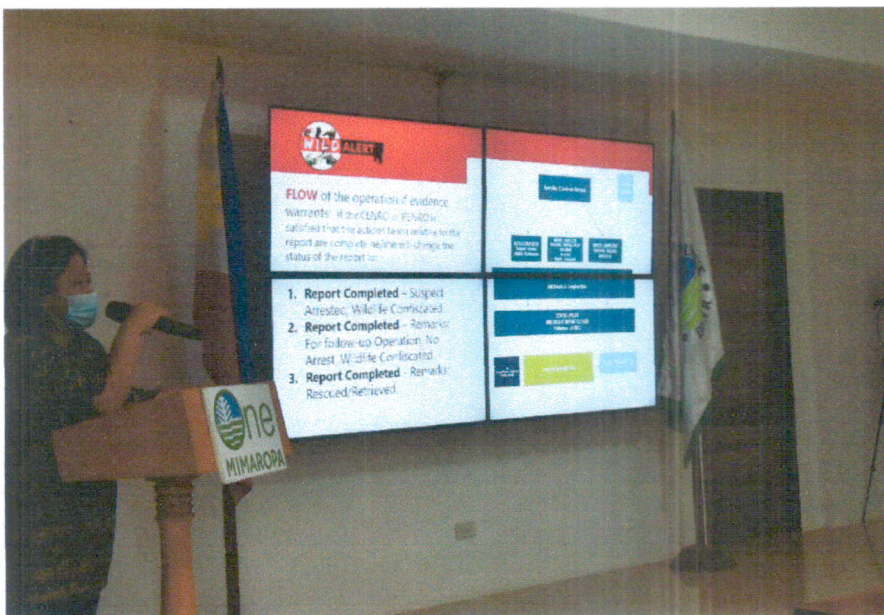

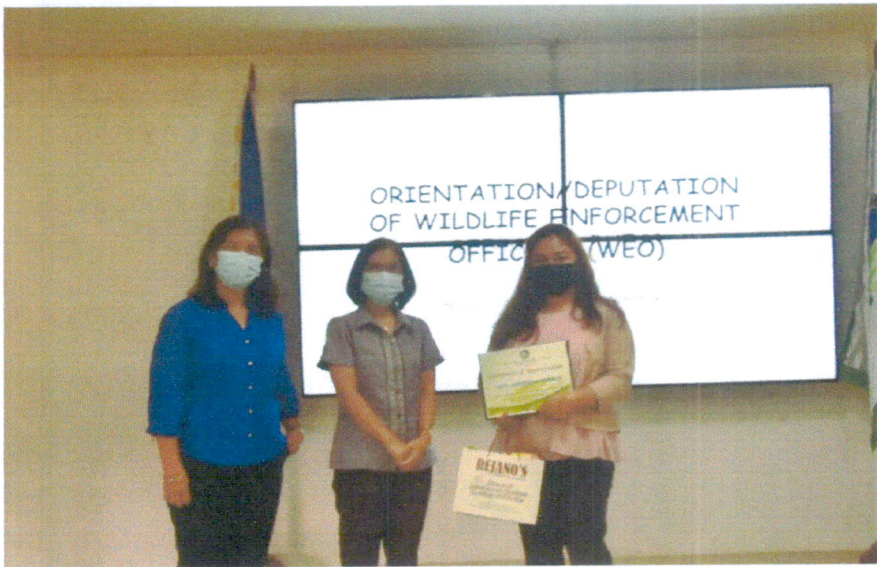
