Based on the Financial Monitoring Report (FMR) submitted by DENR MIMAROPA, the Summary of Financial Performance as of 31 August 2022, is as follows:

Allotment - For the past eight (8) months, as shown above, DENR MIMAROPA registered a low obligation of only 59.03% equivalent to P534.638 Million while the disbursement represents 84.32% equivalent to P450.784 Million against its obligation. The fund utilization of FY 2021 Continuing Appropriations for Enhanced Biodiversity Conservation is very slow considering the length of time (more than twenty (20) months) provided for the project and activities that are being implemented. With this financial performance, it is doubtful that the remaining amount will be fully utilized at the end of this year based on the Cash-based Budgeting System (CBS).

Please be reminded of our **oversight agencies**' observations to our financial operations and corresponding recommendations as follows:

A. Commission on Audit (COA)

In a letter dated 19 July 2022, Dir. Melissa Grace B. Martinez, Director IV, Cluster 8 of the National Government Audit Sector (NGAS) transmitted the Department's CY 2021 Consolidated Annual Audit Report (CAAR) with observations highlighted as follows:

- i. Allotment the obligation rate was 96.38% equivalent to \$\mathbb{P}20,065.734\$ Million;
- ii. **Disbursement** the disbursement rate was 89.68% equivalent to ₱17,994.138 Million; and
- iii. Cash Allocation the cash utilization rate (disbursements over Notice of Cash Allocation) was 98.00% equivalent to \$\mathbb{P}20,975.998\$ Million, leaving a balance of \$\mathbb{P}428.494\$ Million, of which \$\mathbb{P}358.898\$ Million was reverted back to the Bureau of the Treasury (BTr).

Further, COA recommended therein to prepare a detailed **remedial action plan** to reflect the specific measures to be undertaken **to resolve** the identified issues to ensure attainment of physical and financial targets.

B. Department of Budget and Management (DBM) - FY 2021 Agency Performance Review (APR)

In a letter of Undersecretary Tina Rose Marie L. Canda, and Officer-in-Charge of the DBM dated 01 April 2022 informed the Department on their assessment and result of the FY 2021 APR and recommended, among others, the following:

- i. To revisit and reassess the performance indicators, **applying the SMART** (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic and Time Bound) principle, to reflect key indicators of major programs that have a significant impact on the DENR's stakeholders/beneficiaries;
- ii. To ensure a **tighter linkage** between strategic and operational planning and budgeting to meet the agency's physical and financial targets for the period; and
- iii. To adopt sound procurement strategy incorporating **time-bound** concepts for the execution, in accordance with the procurement procedures of the Government Procurement Act (R.A. 9184), and the Government Procurement Policy Boardissued policies and guidelines. Strictly enforce procurement rules and regulations.

C. Congressional Committee on Appropriations Budget Hearing

During the deliberation of the FY 2023 DENR Proposed Budget last 02 September 2022, the Honorable Congresswoman Bernadette Herrera-Dy (Bagong Henerasyon Partylist) clarified the **unused appropriations** of the Department in the amount of ₱1.4 Billion for FY 2021 and ₱1.2 Billion for FY 2020. She then requested the submission of list of Programs, Activities and Projects (P/A/Ps) which were then affected due to non-utilization. The Secretary replied that one of the priorities of the current administration is to conduct evaluation of the Department's processes in order to ensure that there is sufficient use of resources.

- 3) Copy of the minutes of the latest FDU meeting.
