WHEREAS, during the PMFPC meeting the existing Memorandum of Agreement was reviewed. It was suggested that validity of the MOA should be specified in Article V of the said MOA.

WHEREAS, the LGU is also implementing infrastructure projects thus it should be stipulated in the MOA their responsibility to implement the project with utmost respect to the environment and ensure that the design of the road projects should always consider the least number of trees to be affected.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby **RESOLVED** to adopt and implement the following agreements:

- 1. To include in Article V that the signed MOA will be valid up to 5 years and shall be reviewed/renewed after five (5) years from the date of signing;
- 2. To add additional paragraph on the MOA stipulating the responsibility of the LGUs to implement the infrastructure project with utmost respect to the environment and ensure that the design of the road projects should always consider the least number of trees to be affected;
- **3.** To recognize the authenticity of digital signature and to affix the same to any documents and agreements in case the member is not available during the MOA signing;
- 4. That the DENR should always furnish the members of the Committee with the newly issued laws, rules and regulation with regards to forest protection and natural resources utilization;

DAO 2022-10 - Revised DENR Manual of Authorities for Technical Matters

Mr. Ruiz Selva of the DAR asked about the trees that are damaged by typhoon, if there is a need to secure permit from the DENR Based on the provisions of this DAO, "Tree Cutting Permit and Self-monitoring Form are not required in harvesting and transporting harvested logs from registered plantation instead a Certification from a third-party certifier duly registered or accredited by the DENR shall be secured".

During the period that no Registered Third-Party Plantation Certifier is available in the area, licensed and permanent Foresters from the DENR shall certify plantation developers, free of charge.

In support of the anti-red tape act "ARTA LAW". The **DENR** revised its existing manual of authorities to facilitate the immediate approval issuance of permits, licences, certificates and others that need to be secured from the DENR. The issuance of the following permits delegated to the CENROs and Implementing PENROs, to wit:

- 1. TCP for trees posing danger to property and human lives in public places
- 2. TCP for trees within public places
- 3. TCP for planted trees not covered by a registered plantation
- 4. Issuance of Bamboo Plantation Registration

For. Mercado answered that based on the Memorandum from the Secretary dated March 02, 2022 entitled "Partial Lifting of the suspension from the issuance of Wood Recovery Permits to cover the retrieval and disposition of uprooted and typhoon/fire damaged trees" the DENR will issue

recovery permit to utilize the damaged trees for the period of three months after the onslaught of the typhoon or fire

- -The authority for the issuance of Wood Recovery Permit for typhoon damaged trees was delegated to PENRO Level for volume of trees not greater than 15 cu.m. per Memorandum from the Secretary dated March 02, 2022.
- -The DENR staff also need to conduct an inspection to make sure that the tree is damaged or intentionally cut.
- -Only trees intended for harvesting are needed to be registered and secure a Private Tree Plantation Ownership. Planted trees intended for protection need not to be registered.
- -The Monitoring and Enforcement will conduct inspection and investigation to verify the reported trees.
- -Trimming of branches is allowed as long as it does not compromise the ability of the tree to live and have a valid reason for trimming.
- -Trees below 10cm in diameter are recommended for earth-balling as well as mangrove species since the cutting of it is prohibited under RA 7161.
- -Re-alignment of proposed road project in order to exclude big centennial trees in the affected trees, inventory of trees should take place before the planning stage.

MACEC asked for clarification if their planted Narra and Bamboo in Brgy. Capayang, Mogpog 2 years ago need to be registered.

 - Planning Stage for Infrastructure Projects (DPWH)

-Engr. Montera stated that
since it is National Road it cannot be re-aligned but if it is by-pass road it can be realignedautomatic the affected trees will be turned-over to the DENR -Because the PENRO should
conduct proper inventory, identification, measurement and actual ground validation and not geotagging of trees only, the proposal was denied
-DENR will provide IEC materials regarding cutting permit or other matters -PENRO Diaz reiterated that one of the reasons for the delay in the issuance of the cutting permit is the submission of incomplete requirements.
-PENRO Diaz noted the suggestion and said that will be amended through a resolution.
