

PROJECT BRIEF

The Humble Beginnings of EdukSine

Description

EdukSine is a DOST-funded project and a social enterprise that believes in the transformative impact of relevant and responsive education through film, culture, and the arts. EdukSine uplifts the lives of many filmmakers and producers who have limited support and access to distribution and have no means to make their films accessible to a wider audience. EdukSine supports Filipino independent films via online viewing through our EdukSine website and soon, mobile application, or through hybrid/Face-to-face screening. By organizing block screenings of socially relevant, educational, and independent Filipino films in learning institutions, government offices/centers, and local communities with online viewing platforms and/or a bespoke application, EdukSine is able to effectively and efficiently reach audiences, locally and internationally. We believe that film education is a powerful tool to teach critical thinking, our history, culture and beliefs and a tool for social transformation and freedom from ignorance.

Need

We saw the struggles of many independent filmmakers who do not have a platform and marketing resources for their films that is why we established EdukSine that bridges the gap between the independent filmmakers and their markets (Offices and government offices) which serves as a new and unconventional platform for



nation building and to promote Filipino culture and arts through independent films about education, peace, women empowerment, violence against women and children, LGBT rights, indigenous culture, agriculture health, environment, gender equality and other films that have a social impact that will help Filipinos to develop critical thinking and make them aware about our beautiful culture and the issues in the society that need to be addressed and resolved.

Dream

If we want to make the younger generation reflect deeper, to have critical thinking, if we want to make the Philippines a great nation—then it means we need to support independent films that have the power to create a better nation. Good Films can teach them to vote for the right people, to empower women and children to be morally upright and responsible Filipino citizens.

Mission

It is our mission in EdukSine to make independent Filipino films accessible to every Filipino. EdukSine bridges the gap between the indie filmmakers and their markets (Offices and government offices) which serves as a new and unconventional platform to promote Filipino culture and arts through independent films. It started with a vision to screen films at Cine Adarna (2015), University of the Philippines Diliman until we were able to reach the far-flung corners of the Philippines from Cagayan Province to Tawi-Tawi Province and Philippine embassies and Filipino communities abroad.

Bridging the gap between Indie Filipino films and the Filipino people

Before the pandemic, the EdukSine representative would hold face-to-face block screenings all over the country to share stories that must be heard.

The pandemic did not stop us from distributing films to offices and government agencies. With the grant that we received from DOST under Women-Helping Women: Innovating Social Enterprise (WHWise), we are able to develop the EdukSine app and streaming website allowing us to reach more Filipinos all over the Philippines and abroad. We have launched the EdukSine website last August 13, 2022 and everyone can already book a block screening.

Living up to the name of our company, we believe in the transformative impact of relevant and responsive education through film. Through film watching, appreciation grows as we see the diverse culture in the different regions of our country, perspective widens as we become aware of societal issues and truths, and our love for the country deepens.

Through independent Filipino films, we want others to contribute to the formation of holistic human beings who are critical thinkers and who lead productive lives from learning good values from the films that we are showing and sharing. Good values that the audiences carry in their lives and become productive and law abiding citizens of the country.



OUR SERVICES

In our film catalog, you may choose which films you would like to screen in your office depending on the subjects or courses. Each campus or department may select more than I film for the film showing.

There are 3 ways where we can conduct a film showing in your agency/office:

Online Block Screening

The audience will be watching the film in the EdukSine app which can be accessible for 3-5 days. We will generate tickets depending on the number of audiences giving them exclusive access to the film which they can access for the duration of the film festival/showing dates.

Face-to-Face Block Screenings

The film viewing activity will happen on your office campus. We may conduct it in the auditorium or classrooms given that you provide the EdukSine representative transportation and hotel accommodation to safely deliver the film to the office. The EdukSine representative will only bring the film copy and the laptop for viewing. The visual and audio equipment will be provided by the office.

Hybrid Block Screenings

A combination of online and face-to-face block screenings. The audience will be having access to the film using the EdukSine app for 3-5 days and at the same time, a face-to-face film showing will happen at the office. The face-to-face film showing may happen once or twice per day for up to 5 days in the office auditorium. The EdukSine representative will only bring the film copy and the laptop for viewing. The visual and audio equipment will be provided by the agency.

We may also invite the director, producer, or actors in the film that you have chosen to give a short talk and answer questions from the audience for an additional fee.

The fee for the block screening can come from the Gender and Development budget because most of our films are tackling this issue.

CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

In 2019, we launched our new program called "Cine Kabundukan (Free movies in the mountains)" in Kalinga Province and we are dreaming of reaching more Filipinos in the far-flung areas in the Philippines. We have observed that it is not impossible to bring socially relevant films to the mountains. We have shown **Ang Guro kong di marunong** magbasa and Ang Babae sa Likod ng Mambabatok in Bgy. Pasil, Magsilay and Tabuk City, Kalinga last September 29, 2019 and Oct.4, 2019. We showed the films for free, gave school supplies, books, bags from Eton International School, beauty products from BeaUtify, Greenelas slippers and bibles. The kids, teachers and the barangay officers who have watched the films had the chance to watch these types of films for the first time. They were touched by the message of Ang Guro kong di marunong magbasa that promotes the value of education, hope and peace and they are happy to see their treasure and very own Apo Whang Od in a movie.
