## Orientation for Enforcement Agencies on relevant Biodiversity and Wildlife Conservation Laws and Policies for the West Philippine Sea Kalayaan Island Group April 20, 2023 || Puerto Princesa City, Palawan

The Biodiversity Management Bureau is the lead agency responsible for the conservation and protection of biodiversity under the Department of Environment and Natural Resources. This is implemented through our programs on the management of Protected Areas under the NIPAS Act (Republic Act No. 7586 as amended by RA 11038), and Wildlife Conservation (Republic Act No. 9147 or the Wildlife Resources Conservation and Protection Act).

With regards to the West Philippine Sea, this Bureau was tasked by the Department to explore and study effective strategies for the conservation and management of the biodiversity and ecosystems therein, as a means to further national interest. One of our identified activities contributory to this is the conduct of capacity-building on Biodiversity and Wildlife conservation for our partners in Maritime Enforcement, especially those that are routinely deployed in the Kalayaan Island Group (KIG).

As such, may we invite your Agency to an **Orientation for Enforcement Agencies on** relevant Biodiversity and Wildlife Conservation Policies for the West Philippine Sea this coming April 19-20, 2023, at Puerto Princesa City, Palawan.
