Last October 2022, the body approved to conduct a Regional Culture Conference, to be held at Oriental Mindoro Cultural and Heritage Center or via Virtual or Hybrid, where planners, artists, cultural workers, and identified sectoral development workers will have the chance to be oriented with the recent development and be able to come up with strategies based on the identified issues and concerns.  The Culture Conference aims to raise awareness and appreciation of culture and development and solicit support for the promotion and development of Filipino culture and values. The conference will focus on determining and discussing issues and identifying strategies for mainstreaming culture and values toward recovery and resiliency, as one of the thrusts of the new Philippine Development Plan 2023-2028;  Furthermore, the SCC secretariat believes that there's a need to enhance the initial program presented in the previous meeting, given that the NCCA, in collaboration with NEDA, is currently crafting a Culture, Arts, and Values Road Map in aid of the implementation of the PDP 2023-2028 in mainstreaming culture and values. no dedicated chapter  Additionally, there's a need to discuss the logistical and technical needs for the implementation of the Culture Conference, tentatively set in November. #### Background/Status:

The National Heritage Month (NHM) was established by Presidential Proclamation No. 439 to be observed during the month of May and actively works to increase Filipinos' awareness of, love for, and respect for their country's culture and history.

In coordination with the NCCA, an opportunity to hold a virtual seminar on librarianship and cultural heritage has presented itself, in partnership with the NEDA Regional Office CALABARZON. Webinar will focus on how crucial libraries are to preserving society's knowledge and cultural legacy. Libraries assemble huge collections of paperwork, historical data, and other crucial reference materials to guarantee the preservation of their communities' histories. As a result, they help to make sure that the voices of all communities are heard.

Last May 30, 2023, a total of 125 (92 are females, and 33 are males) attended the Webinar coming from different LGUs, RLAs, and local libraries within CALABARZON and MIMAROPA regions. 71 responded to the evaluation form.

Overall, the respondents rated the activity excellent (4.64).

The Department of Environment and Natural resources (DENR) is the primary agency responsible for the conservation, management, development, and proper use of the country's environment and natural resources, specifically forest and grazing lands, mineral resources, including those in reservation and watershed areas, and lands of the public domain, as well as the licensing and regulation of all natural resources as may be provided for by law in order to ensure equitable sharing of the benefits derived therefrom for the welfare of the present and future generations of Filipinos.
- 3. The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) is responsible for realizing the country's goal of globally competitive and innovative industry and services sector that contribute to inclusive growth and employment generation.
- 4. The two mentioned agencies will report their initiatives in mainstreaming culture, arts, and values.

The Western Philippines University is a higher education institution that was initially a farm settlement school for the *Tagbanuas* (an indigenous cultural community of Palawan) is presented with the opportunity to establish its center, which will promote innovative research, develop new generations of social scientists, and mobilize importance knowledge on pressing community issues. One of the community issues pertinent to understanding development in the local and even national scenario are the lives of the indigenous ethnolinguistic groups in Palawan. As such, the center's establishment is motivated by the apparent need to explore various social issues, including but not limited to Indigenous Peoples' Knowledge, System, and Practices (IKSP), at the vantage point of the social sciences. In a time of economic and social uncertainty, communities seek to recover and rebuild, recognizing research and development as necessary more than ever.
- 2. The proposal aims to establish the WPU Social Science Research and Development (SSRDC), a university research center that specializes in social science research and development, with a particular focus on knowledge, systems and practices of IPs of Palawan. The specific objectives of the proposed WPU Social Science Research and Development Center are: (a) Establish a repository of research outputs and a museum for tangible materials related to knowledge, systems and practices of IPs of Palawan; (b) Identify, generate and publish researches in social sciences and allied disciplines within RDE thrusts and priorities and in-house multi-disciplinary expertise; (c) Provide the necessary technical expertise and research facilities to support the research and development activities; and (d) Implement collaborative sustainable programs, projects, and activities (PPAs) to empower ICCs thru digital Information, Education and Communication (IEC) materials.
