

In order to maintain the status of Marinduque Province as a low risk in terms of illegal ENR activities, the personnel of Monitoring Enforcement Section (MES) of DENR PENRO Marinduque conducted series of patrolling and monitoring in NGP sites aside from its regular LAWIN patrolling and Wildlife Trafficking Monitoring. The ground surveillance/ patrolling is continuously conducted to strengthen law enforcement to prevent any illegal activities within the Forestlands and NGP sites. Furthermore, this activity also aims to establish the presence of DENR in the considered local hotspots in the province.

Aside from the usual patrolling and monitoring, Communication, Education & Public Awareness (CEPA) and distribution of IEC materials are also conducted simultaneously to inform the public about the laws and policies implemented by the DENR.



BARANGAY MALBOG, BUENAVISTA, MARINDUQUE

WHEREAS, the Monitoring and Enforcement Section of PENRO Marinduque adhere to strengthen the forest protection and anti-illegal logging activity of DENR PENRO Marinduque.

WHEREAS, outside the regular LAWIN Forest and Biodiversity Protection System, the undersigned conducted regular foot patrolling to monitor the activities within the forest land as well as to monitor some implemented project of the Department like NGPs and fireline establishment.


WHEREAS, per instruction of the Chief, Monitoring and Enforcement Section, to conduct regular patrolling within the Forest Land of Barangay Malbog, Buenavista, Marinduque and to monitor the status of the established fireline last April 2023

METHODOLOGY

- 1. Coordination with LGU
- 2. Foot Patrolling
- 3. Tracking and Geotagging

RESULTS and FINDINGS

- The foot patrolling starts in Sitio Sabang. Barangay Malbog, Buenavista, wherein it is also the location of the established fireline in 1st Quarter of CY 2023;
- Generally, from the low lying areas such as river and nearby community settlements, mostly the land cover can be classified as perennial and while the team continuously walking to the high elevation area, the land cover is gradually turning to grassland;
- The high elevation area was classified as fire prone based on the identification and mapping of fire prone area conducted in 1st Quarter of CY 2023;
- 4 The fireline established is still observed however through continuous raining, the cogon grass sprouted in the fireline.
- Trees planted in the NGP areas are in good condition, majority of the planted trees are approximately 10 meters height and some are already bearing flowers and fruits;
- Some key observations were also noticed in the patrolled area, to wit
 - a Traces of foot print of deer was observed and concluded that the area is their feeding ground. Aside, from traces of deer, the team also saw several jungle fowls (labuyo) and feces of cows in the area.
 - b. The patrolled area is accessible to local residents since some of the CSC areas are located in therein, and
 - c. Some cut tree branches was also observed along the way which is probably used for charcoal making.



CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION

Based on the facts stipulated, the undersigned has the following conclusions and

- The area is a good habitat to endemic wildlife species as evidence by the traces and appearance in the area, and
- 2 To conduct continuous CEPA in the area, since some locals are still do charcoal making where the raw materials are gathered from the forest land.







WHEREAS, per instruction of the Chief, Monitoring and Enforcement Section, to conduct regular patrolling within the Forest Land of Barangay Malbog, Buenavista, Marinduque and to monitor the status of the established fireline last April 2023

METHODOLOGY

- 1. Coordination with LGU
- 2. Foot Patrolling
- 3. Tracking and Geotagging

RESULTS and FINDINGS

- The foot patrolling starts in Sitio Sabang. Barangay Malbog, Buenavista, wherein it is also the location of the established fireline in 1st Quarter of CY 2023.
- Generally, from the low lying areas such as river and nearby community settlements, mostly the land cover can be classified as perennial and while the team continuously walking to the high elevation area, the land cover is gradually turning to grassland;
- The high elevation area was classified as fire prone based on the identification and mapping of fire prone area conducted in 1st Quarter of CY 2023;
- 4 The fireline established is still observed however through continuous raining, the cogon grass sprouted in the fireline.
- 5. Trees planted in the NGP areas are in good condition, majority of the planted trees are approximately 10 meters height and some are already bearing flowers and fruits;
- 6 Some key observations were also noticed in the patrolled area, to wit
 - a Traces of foot print of deer was observed and concluded that the area is their feeding ground Aside, from traces of deer, the team also saw several jungle fowls (labuyo) and feees of cows in the area.
 - The patrolled area is accessible to local residents since some of the CSC areas are located in therein, and
 - Some cut tree branches was also observed along the way which is probably used for charcoal making



CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION

Based on the facts stipulated, the undersigned has the following conclusions and

- The area is a good habitat to endemic wildlife species as evidence by the traces and appearance in the area, and
- 2 To conduct continuous CEPA in the area, since some locals are still do charcoal making where the raw materials are gathered from the forest land.



NARRATIVE REPORT RE: INVOLVEMENT OF FOREST COMMUNITIES IN FOREST PROTECTION WORKS CONDUCTED IN BARANGAY TUNGIB-LIPATA, BUENAVISTA,

MARINDUQUE ON FEBRUARY 08, 2023

In compliance with the target for CY 2023 under 5.1 Involvement of Forest Communities in forest protection works, please be informed that on February 08, 2023 DENR-PENRO Marinduque thru the Technical Services Division's Monitoring and Enforcement Section conducted Communication, Education, Public Awareness (CEPA) in Barangay Tungib-Lipata, Buenavista, Marinduque.

The activity was held at the open court of Barangay Tungib-Lipata Buenavista, Marinduque last February 8, 2023 at 9:30 in the morning. The activity started by an opening prayer followed by singing of National Anthem. Welcome message was delivered by Barangay Councilor Randy R. Valencia of Barangay Tungib-Lipata, Buenavista, Marinduque. He was designated by the Barangay Captain for health reason.

The first topics that were discussed are the Legal Basis and Definitions of Gender and Development, and the Magna Carta of Women (RA 9710) presented by Ms. Sarah Jane L. Montalban, GAD Focal Officer. The presenter explained to the participants the current situation regarding the issues on the rights and roles of women in nation building.

The next topic is the features of Marinduque Wildlife Sanctuary presented by Forester Glaiza M. Peñaflorida of the Protected Area Management Office (PAMO). She discussed the importance and roles of Marinduque Wildlife Sanctuary in terms of ecosystem services, the importance why it needs to be regulated and protected, the cultural, and other services that protected area provides not only to the nearby communities but to the whole province of Marinduque. She also mentioned the challenges that the PAMO is facing in managing and protecting the MWS. It was further explained Section 20 of Expanded National Integrated Protected Area System (ENIPAS) and other different prohibited acts of the said RA. Also, she discussed Conservation and Protection of Wildlife otherwise known as Republic Act No. 9147.

Mr. Ronald M. Matining of the National Greening Program (NGP) explained the program and reminded the participants in their role on the project that was implemented in Barangay Tungib-Lipata. Mr. Matinig further explained that the program was intended to them and they should also help protect and maintain the area.

The final topic presented was about the Current Status of Philippine Forest, Revised Forestry Code of the Philippines otherwise known as Presidential Decree No. 705, Executive Order No. 23 -Declaring Moratorium on the Cutting and Harvesting of Timber in the Natural and Residual Forests and the Creation of Anti-Illegal Logging Tasks Force and other pertinent laws.



Accomplishment of the National Greening Program (NGP) and the Enhanced National Greening Program (eNGP) were discussed by Forester Joybert F. Mijares. He also explained the Basic Forestry Law, Cutting Permits, Chainsaw registration and the penalties when violations are committed.

After the presentation, it was followed by an open forum facilitated by Forester Bernadine Jasul. The participants provided some issues and concern and the team provided them with all the answers and solutions regarding tree cuttings, renewal of chainsaw and the proper disposal of solid waste. Other issues that were raised are the; 1.) Possibility of community engagement in the seedling production as part of their livelihood and for them to earn additional income; 2.) Issue on the political boundary conflicts in the area. For. Mijares explained that the willingness of the community to produce seedlings is very much welcome. The team encouraged them to proceed with their plan to produce seedlings and promised them to provide technical assistance if requested. This initiative by the community will limit other members of the community to engage in illegal activities like charcoal making which is accordingly is rampant in the area. For the boundary conflict, the participants were informed that political boundary conflict can only be resolved between the two barangays in conflict through the intercession of the municipal LGU of Buenavista together with the DENR-PENRO Marinduque and the NAMRIA.

A total of forty (40) participants, twenty-two (22) male and nineteen (19) female participated in the said meeting. Different CEPA/IEC materials regarding ENR Laws were distributed, including flyers on Magna Carta of Women.
