

## Introduced by Representative LEODY "ODIE" F. TARRIELA

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

It is the State's policy to protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature. In this regard, the protection and conservation of country's wildlife resources and its habitants should be given paramount consideration.

This bill aims to promote *Tamaraw* (Bubalus mindorensis) conservation, protection and sustainability by creating the Tamaraw Conservation Coordinating Council which shall govern and provide policy direction on *Tamaraw* conservation, oversee the implementation of the Tamaraw Conservation Management and Action Plan (TCMAP) and the Tamaraw Protection Program (TCP), and integrate these in local development plans. The bill further mandates the Council to create a Tamaraw Conservation Technical Advisory Group to ensure science-based intervention and decisions on the conservation of *Tamaraws*; as well as Tamaraw Conservation and Research Center (TCRC) to serve as the national conservation research center for *Tamaraws* on the areas of conservation, genetics, reproductive sciences and disease management.

This version of the bill has already been approved by the House in its third reading during the 18<sup>th</sup> Congress. In this respect, the immediate consideration and passage of this bill is earnestly requested.

## INTRODUCED BY REPRESENTATIVE LEODY "ODIE" F. TARRIELA

#### AN ACT

INSTITUTINALIZING THE TAMARAW CONSERVATION PROGRAM, CREATING ITS ADMINISTRATIVE AND IMPLEMENTATION MECHANISM, AND PROVISING FUNDS THEREOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

**SECTION 1.** Short Title. – This Act shall be known as the "The Tamaraw Conservation Management Act."

SECTION 2. Declaration of Policy. — It is the policy of the State to protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature. It is also the policy of the State to conserve and protect the country's wildlife resources and its habitats, enhance biodiversity, and ensure provision of ecosystem services.

Towards this end, the State shall institute measures with due regard to local and national interest, Philippine commitments to international conventions, treaties and agreements for the protection and conservation of biodiversity, and wildlife resources.

SECTION 3. Creation of the Tamaraw Conservation

Coordinating Council. - The Tamaraw Conservation Coordinating

Council, hereinafter referred to as the Council, is hereby created and shall

be the body charged with the formulation of policies and management of

programs pertaining to the conservation of the Tamaraw (Bubalus

Mindorensis) and its current population in the country.

The Secretary of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) shall serve as the Chairperson of the Council. The DENR Regional Executive Director for Region IV-B may be designated as the permanent representative by the DENR Secretary and the Assistant Regional Director for Technical Services shall serve as the Vice-Chairperson of the Council.

The Chairperson shall invite representatives from the following to serve as members of the Council:

- a) One (1) each from the Provincial governments of Occidental
   Mindoro and Oriental Mindoro:
- b) One (1) each from concerned municipal government offices;

- c) Members of the House of Representatives from Congressional Districts of the provinces of Occidental Mindoro and Oriental Mindoro;
- d) One (1) each from the National Commission on Indigenous

  Peoples Offices in Occidental Mindoro and Oriental Mindoro;
- e) One (1) each from the Indigenous Peoples tribal groups of Buhid, Tau-Buid, Iraya, Bangon, and Alangan;
- f) One (1) each from the academe in Occidental Mindoro and Oriental Mindoro;
- g) Three (3) locally-based conservation non-government organizations (NGOs); and
- h) One (1) from the local Chamber of Commerce.

**SECTION 4.** *Powers and Functions of the Council.* – For the effective implementation of the provisions of this Act, the Council is hereby vested with the following powers and functions:

- a) Oversee the implementation of the Tamaraw Conservation

  Management and Action Plan (TCMAP) and the Tamaraw

  Conservation Program (TCP);
- b) Integrate and harmonize TCMAP objectives and activities in local development plans, management plans, and the annual

- work and financial plans of the offices and agencies represented in the Council;
- c) Monitor and review the implementation of TCMAP;
- d) Provide administrative support to the implementation of projects and interventions under the TCMAP;
- e) Create thematic or site-based groups, as needed;
- f) Coordinate with LGUs for issued affecting their areas of jurisdiction;
- g) Coordinate with other government agencies and instrumentalities, the private sector and civic organizations for cooperation and assistance in performance of its functions;
- h) Arrange, negotiate for, accept donations, grants, gifts, loans, and other funding from domestic and foreign sources to carry out the activities and objectives of the TCP; and
- i) Perform such other functions as may be necessary in carrying out the provisions of this Act.

### SECTION 5. Tamaraw Conservation Technical Advisory Group.

- To ensure science-based interventions and decisions on the conservation of Tamaraws, the Council, through the Chairperson, shall create a Tamaraw Conservation Technical Advisory Group to be composed of representatives from the following:

- a) Biodiversity Management Bureau (BMB);
- b) Ecosystems Research and Development Bureau;
- c) Philippine Veterinary Medical Association (PVMA);
- d) International Union for Conservation of Nature Asian Wild Cattle Specialist Group; and
- e) Other experts from the academe and conservation organizations.

SECTION 6. The Tamaraw Conservation Program Office. – The Tamaraw Conservation Program Office (TCPO) is hereby created. It shall act as the implementing arm of the Council and shall perform the following functions:

- a) Lead the formulation and implementation of TCMAP;
- b) Prepare the Annual Work and Financial Plan for the TCP based on the priority activities in the TCMAP;
- c) Assist in the mobilization of resources to augment financing of the TCMAP;
- d) Develop project proposals and activities in pursuit of the strategies of TCMAP;
- e) Create a Quick Response Team, in coordination with the Protected Area Management Office, the concerned local government units, and the Philippine National Police for the

- conduct of law enforcement, investigation, and population surveys;
- f) Recommend management interventions including policies and guidelines to address or resolve pressing issues and problems;
- g) Serve as secretariat of the Council;
- h) Initiate coordination mechanism and necessary arrangements with the Protected Area Management Board through its PASu, for collaborative conservation of Tamaraw population within the protected area and facilitate integration and harmonization of TCMAP with the management plan of the concerned protected area;
- Manage the Tamaraw Gene Pool Farm located in Sitio Canturoy, Barangay Manoot, Rizal, Occidental Mindoro, in coordination with the Protected Area Management Office of Mts. Iglit-Baco Natural Park;
- j) Lead in the implementation of the TCP's Work and Financial Plan in coordination with stakeholders, such as local governments, the Protected Area Management Board and Protected Area Superintendents concerned;

- k) Prepare and submit quarterly and annual reports on Tamaraw conservation to be submitted to the Secretary of DENR through the Regional Executive Director and the BMB; and
- 1) Perform other duties as may be assigned to the Council.

SECTION 7. Organizational Structure of the Tamaraw Conservation and Research Center. — The TCPO shall be under the supervision of the DENR Region IV-B Office and shall be headed by the PENRO of Occidental Mindoro. Within six (6) months from the effectivity of this Act, the DENR Regional Executive Director for Region IV-B, in coordination with the BMB, shall prepare the manpower requirements, including plantilla positions for the TCPO to be submitted to the Department of Budget and Management.

**SECTION 8.** Establishment of the Tamaraw Conservation and Research Center.—The Tamaraw Conservation and Research Center (TCRC) is hereby established to ensure that all conservation policies and activities undertaken by the TCPA are based on empirical data findings from scientific studies and research. The TCRC shall:

a) Serve as the national conservation research center for the
 Tamaraw in the areas of conservation genetics,
 reproductive sciences, and diseases management;

- b) Promote conservation and research for the endemic species of Mindoro Island; and
- c) Take over the operation of the existing Tamaraw Gene Pool Farm within Mts. Iglit-Baco Natural Park to pursue the envisioned plan to strengthen and expand Tamaraw meta-population management in the entire Mindoro Island.

The management and operation of the TCRC facility shall be lodged with the TCPO. All research activities shall be coordinated with the ERB and BMB.

SECTION 9. Tamaraw Conservation in Protected Areas.—The concerned Protected Area Management Board shall monitor and manage the Tamaraw population within the protected areas, ensuring the introduction of adequate measures and interventions for its conservation. The PAMB, through PASu, shall collaborate closely with the TCPO in carrying out Tamaraw conservation programs and activities within the protected areas.

**SECTION 10.** *Appropriations.* – The Secretary of the DENR shall immediately include in the Department's programs the implementation of

this Act, the funding of which shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.

SECTION 11. Implementing Rules and Regulations. – Within six (6) months following the effectivity of this Act, the DENR shall, after consultation with concerned government agencies and other institutions, promulgate rules and regulations for the effective implementation of this Act.

**SECTION 12.** Separability Clause. – If any portion or provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional, the remainder of this Act or any provision not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 13.** Repealing Clause. – All other laws, ordinances, orders, rules, regulations and other issuances or parts thereof which are inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

**SECTION 14.** Effectivity. – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
