I. PRELIMINARIES

The meeting started at 1:38 in the afternoon with the singing of the Philippine National Anthem followed by an invocation and the singing of the MIMAROPA Hymn.

II. BUSINESS PROPER

A. Introduction of Incoming EDC Chairperson

Mr. Bernardino A. Atienza, Jr., Chief EDS of PDIPBD of NEDA MIMAROPA and EDC Secretary, introduced the new EDC Chairperson for CY 2023-2025.

Mayor Armi Dela Cruz Carrion is currently serving her second term as municipal mayor of Boac, Marinduque. She was first elected as mayor of Boac in May 2019.

Prior to this, she was the manager and president of the Sanderland Corporation in Paranaque City. She was born in Roxas, Province of Isabela and completed her bachelor degree major in Banking and Finance in 1980 at Centro Escolar University.

B. Oath-taking of the new EDC Chairperson

NEDA MIMAROPA Regional Director and RDC Vice Chairperson, Director Agustin C. Mendoza administered the oath of Mayor Carrion as the new EDC Chairperson.

C. Declaration of Quorum

Mr. Bernardino A. Atienza, Jr. of NEDA MIMAROPA called the roll. Of the 34 members, seven were present, 21 were represented registering a quorum of 85% attendance.

D. Welcome Remarks

EDC Chairperson Hon. Carrion welcomed and thanked everyone for attending the meeting. She expressed her gratitude to RDC Chairperson and Romblon Governor Jose R. Riano for the trust and confidence bestowed upon her as the new EDC Chairperson. She enumerated the agenda items and encouraged the members to actively participate in the discussion while making the meeting an enjoyable one.

E. Approval of the Proposed Agenda

Hon. Carrion presented the proposed agenda for review of the members. On motion duly seconded, the proposed agenda was approved as presented.

F. Approval of the Minutes of the previous EDC meeting

On motion duly seconded, the minutes of the 2nd quarter EDC meeting conducted on May 05 was approved.

G. Matters Arising from Previous Meeting

Mr. Atienza reported the status of agreements during the 2nd quarter EDC meeting. There were nine agenda items presented: 1) 2021 MIMAROPA Regional Development Report, 2) Support to NEDA Board RD Com Mindanao Area Committee Resolution No. 22, s. 2021 on the Philippine Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC) and Policies and Measures (PAMs), 3) Endorsement of the Proposed Development of Lamao Lake in San Fernando, Romblon, 4) Development of Ulong Baywalk/Construction of Seawall, 5) Construction/Improvement of Daykitin Port in Buenavista, 6) Construction/Improvement of Suha Port in Torrijos, 7) Concreting/Improvement of Lusok-Kamandungan Farm-to-Market Road in Sta. Cruz, 8) Buy Local Advocacy, and 9) Palm Oil Industry in Palawan.

He enumerated the following resolutions emanated from the EDC meeting that were passed by the MIMAROPA RDC during its 79th full council meeting held on June 03 virtually through Zoom:

H. Matters for Review/Action

1. MIMAROPA Regional Development Plan (RDP) 2023-2028

The following draft RDP chapters under the economic development sector were presented by the EDC Secretariat for review of the Committee: a) Chapter 4.3: Establish Livable Communities, b) Chapter 6.1: Ensure Food Security and Proper Nutrition, c) Chapter 7: Modernize Agriculture and Agribusiness, d) Chapter 8: Revitalize Industry, e) Chapter 9: Reinvigorate Services, f) Chapter 10: Advance

R & D, Technology, and Innovation, g) Chapter 11: Promote Trade and Investments, and h) Chapter 16: Accelerate Climate Action and Strengthen Disaster Resilience. The outline of their presentations were as follows: a) assessment and challenges, b) targets, c) strategies, and d) legislative agenda.

On motion duly seconded, the draft RDP chapters under the economic development sector were recommended for RDC approval.

2. MIMAROPA Regional Investment Program (RDIP) 2023-2028

Ms. Jobelle M. Cruzado of NEDA MIMAROPA presented the MIMAROPA RDIP 2023-2028. She highlighted the programs, activities, and projects (PAPs) under the economic development sector which will address the goals and strategies identified in the presented draft RDP chapters.

She discussed the assessment of the RDIP 2017-2022 emphasizing the proposed budgets vs. actual budgets and the major capital PAPs (ongoing, completed, and pipelined). She also presented the summary of economic sector investment programs in the RDIP 2023-2028.

On motion duly seconded, the economic sector PAPs of the MIMAROPA RDIP were endorsed to the RDC.

3. 2022 Regional Development Report (RDR) Preparation Guidelines

Mr. Bernardino A. Atienza, Jr. presented the 2022 Regional Development Report (RD) preparation guidelines. The 2022 MIMAROPA RDR is the end-of-plan assessment of the performance of the region for the last year of the 2017-2022 Updated MIMAROPA RDP and its accompanying Results Matrix (RM).

Mr. Atienza enumerated the following RDR chapters under the economic sector where the members are expected to provide inputs: a) Chapter 08 (Expanding Economic Opportunities in Agriculture, Forestry, and Fisheries); b) Chapter 09 (Expanding Economic Opportunities in Industry and Services through Trabaho and Negosyo); c) Chapter 14 (Vigorously Advancing Science, Technology, and Innovation); and d) Chapter 20 (Ensuring Ecological Integrity, Clean, and Healthy Environment).

He added that each chapter shall contain the abstract and accomplishments and observe the use of gender-fair language to avoid stereotyping. Also presented was the schedule of activities in the 2022 RDR preparation up to its publication and dissemination.

Upon motion duly seconded, the 2022 MIMAROPA RDR preparation guidelines was endorsed for RDC approval.

BRIEF FROM THE EDC SECRETARIAT

Subject: Election of EDC Co-Chairperson

1. Section 7 of Executive Order (EO) No. 325, as amended, states that to assist the RDC in the performance of its functions, the Council shall create sectoral committees to handle social, economic, infrastructure, and development administration concerns.
2. The RDC shall determine the composition of the sectoral committees. Their functions are analogous to and supportive of the functions of the RDC. They shall review and endorse matters pertaining to their respective sectors to the RDC Executive Committee and/or RDC Full Council.
3. Based on the implementing rules and regulations (IRR) of EO 325, the Chairperson and Co-Chairperson of these Committees shall either be appointed by the RDC Chairperson or selected by the members among themselves. The terms of the sectoral committees' Chairperson and Co-Chairperson coincide with the term of the RDC Chairperson, which is a fixed period of three years.
4. The RDC MIMAROPA Chairperson, through RDC Memorandum No.11-062 dated 21 November 2022, appointed Hon. Mayor Armi D.C. Carrion of the Municipality of Boac, Marinduque as the Chairperson of the MIMAROPA Economic Development Committee (EDC). She took her oath of office during the EDC meeting held last November 23, 2022.
5. The Co-Chairperson of the EDC shall be selected by the members among themselves. The Co-Chairperson must come from the private sector and is a regular member of the Committee.
6. Action requested: Election of the EDC Co-Chairperson and recommend RDC confirmation.

BRIEF FROM THE EDC SECRETARIAT

Subject: FY 2024 RDC Budget Review

1. Section 4 of the Executive Order (EO) 325, s. 1996 mandates the Regional Development Council (RDC) to review and endorse to the national government the annual budgets of agency regional offices (AROs), state universities and colleges (SUCs), and selected government owned and controlled corporations (GOCCs).
2. The RDC MIMAROPA conducts the annual budget review to ensure that the programs, activities, and projects (PAPs) proposed by AROs, SUCs, and GOCCs are consistent with the Regional Development Investment Program 2023-2028 that was approved by the RDC during its Special Full Council Meeting on 10 February 2023 in Pasay City.
3. PAPs under the FY 2024 budget proposals must be supportive of the region's development priorities and in accordance with the following: a) 8-point Socioeconomic Agenda; b) the Philippine Development Plan 2023-2028; c) the medium-term fiscal framework; d) Build Better More Program; e) local government unit (LGU) capacity-building programs; and f) the harmonization of regional plans with national priorities.
4. The budget proposals of the AROs, SUCs, and GOCCs shall consider the priority PAPs identified in the following plans and programs:
 - a. MIMAROPA Regional Development Plan 2023-2028 and Luzon Spatial and Infrastructure Development Framework;
 - b. Master Plan for Sustainable Urban Infrastructure Development in Calapan City;
 - c. FY 2024 Annual Investment Program, Three Year Rolling Infrastructure Program 2024-2026, and those PAPs approved by the RDC through a resolution;
 - d. Implementation of the proposed Regional Government Center;
 - e. Climate-change adaptation or mitigation;
 - f. implementation of EO No. 138, s. 2021, particularly capacity building programs for LGUs; and,
 - g. Gender and development adopting the new guidelines of the Philippine Commission on Women.

5. Agencies that will undergo the budget review shall submit the following budget forms to the Sectoral Committee Secretariat:

- a. BP Form 1.1: FY 2024 Budget Proposal under Tier 1;
- b. BP Form 1.2: FY 2024 Budget Proposal under Tier 2;
- c. BP Form 2: FY 2022 Budget Utilization Rate; and,
- d. BP Form 3: Status of FY 2023 RDC-endorsed Budget Proposals.

6. The Secretariat will present the status of FY 2022 budget implementation and FY 2023 RDC-endorsed budget proposals of the economic sector agencies. On the other hand, the FY 2024 budget proposals of economic development sector agencies shall be presented by their respective Regional Directors or Assistant Regional Directors.

7. Attached are the submitted RDC Budget Forms of the concerned agencies for reference.

8. Action requested: Recommend RDC endorsement.

BRIEF FROM THE EDC SECRETARIAT

Subject: Establishment of an Integrated Coconut Processing Center

1. The Regional Development Council (RDC) prepares and regularly updates the regional development investment program (RDIP) to reflect changing financing conditions and to include new projects proposed by the local government units (LGUs), regional line agencies (RLAs), and state universities and colleges (SUCs).
2. In an email dated 09 February 2023, the Provincial Government of Marinduque submitted to the Secretariat a copy of Marinduque Provincial Development Council Resolution approving and endorsing to the RDC MIMAROPA the establishment of an Integrated Coconut Processing Center at Barangay Pawa in Boac, Marinduque for inclusion in the RDIP 2023-2028 and for possible funding and implementation by the Department of Agriculture-Philippine Coconut Authority (DA-PCA). The estimated cost of the project is PhP348,794,549.90 for implementation in FY 2024-2025.
3. The project proposal is consistent with the eight-point socioeconomic agenda of the current administration particularly on protecting the purchasing power and mitigating socioeconomic scarring by ensuring food security and improving agricultural productivity through modernizing agriculture and agribusiness.
4. It is also supportive to the goals stipulated in the MIMAROPA Regional Development Plan (RDP) 2023-2028 and conforms to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) Nos. 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth), 9 (Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure), 11 (Sustainable Cities and Communities), among others.
5. Representative from the Provincial Government of Marinduque will present the details of the project. Attached is the project brief of the proposal prepared by the Secretariat.

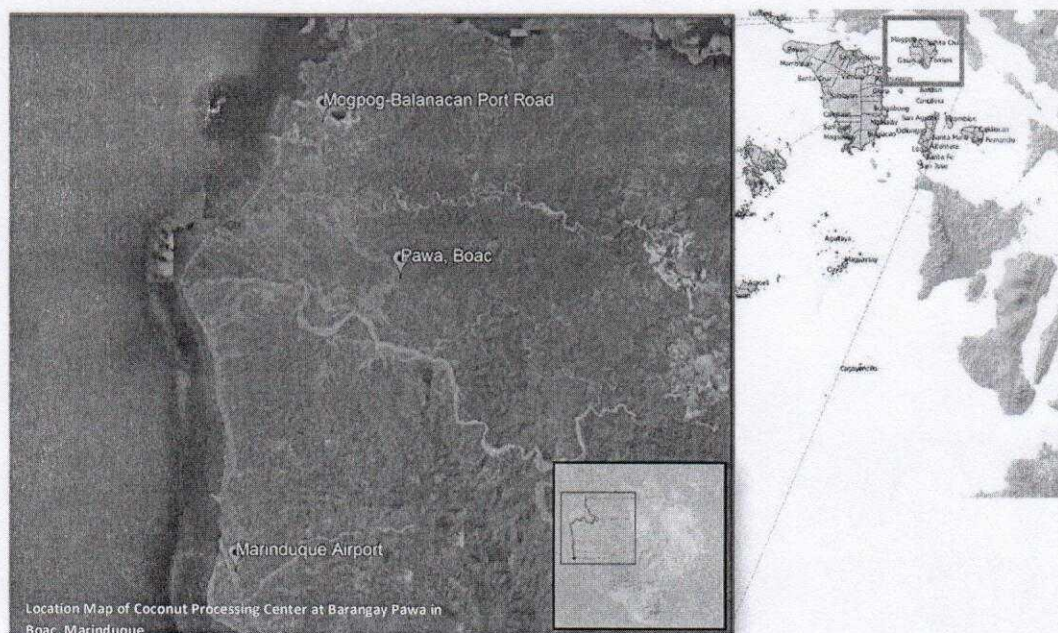
Background

1. In an email dated 09 February 2023, the Provincial Government of Marinduque submitted to the Secretariat a project proposal requesting RDC endorsement of the establishment of an Integrated Coconut Processing Center in the province of Marinduque for inclusion in the Regional Development Investment Program (RDIP) 2023-2028 and for possible funding and implementation by Department of Agriculture-Philippine Coconut Authority (DA-PCA) under the Coconut Farmers and Industry Trust Fund.
2. **Objectives.** The establishment of a coconut processing facility in Marinduque aims to contribute in the development of the coconut industry value-chain, increase farmers' productivity, and create livelihood opportunities for coconut farmers and enterprises in the province. The project will leverage on coconut processing technologies, apply innovative methodologies, and utilize modern equipment to process and convert raw coconut into value-added food and non-food products. The facility is expected to produce virgin coconut oil (VCO), coco flour, and coco vinegar.
3. **Components.** The project will include: (1) preparation of pre-feasibility study including detailed engineering design, (2) social preparation and capacity

building, (3) -construction of facilities and installation of machinery and equipment for processing of VCO, flour, milk, coco water, medium chain triglycerides, (4) organization of project management team as well as hiring and training of key production personnel, (5) test run and commissioning of equipment, (6) securing of permits and licenses, (7) business operations and marketing.

4. **Beneficiaries.** The proposed project will benefit at least 1,517 local coconut farmers including local entrepreneurs, coconut farmers' cooperatives and associations, and other stakeholders in the coconut industry in Marinduque.
5. **Project Location.** The proposed project will be located at a 2,000 square meter area in Barangay Pawa, Boac, Marinduque. The area is 7.7 kilometers away from the port of Balanacan in Mogpog, Marinduque and 20.8 kilometers away from the Marinduque Airport.

Comments and Recommendations

6. **Alignment of the project's objectives with regional priorities.** The proposed project proposal is aligned with the emerging priorities of the MIMAROPA Regional Development Plan (RDP) 2023-2028 on modernizing agriculture and

agribusiness, ensuring food security, revitalizing industry, and promoting trade and investments.

7. It conforms to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) particularly on Goal No. 8: Decent Work and Economic Growth, Goal No. 9: Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure, and Goal No. 11: Sustainable Cities and Communities.
8. It is also aligned with the Regional Coconut Farmers and Industry Development Plan (CFIDP) prepared by the PCA. The CFIDP include programs for community-based enterprises, social protection, coconut farmers organization and development, innovative research projects, and integrated processing of coconut and downstream products.
9. ***Complementation with existing programs and projects.*** The project will also complement the regular programs of PCA such as Community Enterprise Development Program, Cocohub Enterprise Development Program, and Product Development Program.
10. The project was endorsed by the Provincial Development Council through PDC Resolution No. 44-2023. However, the proponent shall also ensure that the project is included in the approved Local Development Investment Plan (LDIP) for the period 2023-2025, Provincial Development and Physical Framework Plan (PDPFP); and/or Comprehensive Land Use Plan (CLUP).
11. ***Concurrence with the project.*** Based on the coordination with concerned agencies, the proponent has already secured the concurrence of PCA on the project.
12. ***Recommendations.*** RDC endorsement for the preparation of feasibility study and implementation of the proposed establishment of an Integrated Coconut Processing Center to PCA is recommended.

Subject: Creation of the Corridor Alliance Advisory Committee (CAAC) under the Economic Development Committee (EDC)

1. On April 2020, the Department of Environmental and Natural Resources (DENR), with support from the United Nations Development Program (UNDP) received funding approval from the Global Environment Facility (GEF) for the project entitled: Integrated Approach in Management of Major Biodiversity Corridors in the Philippines, otherwise known as the BD Corridor Project. One of the pilot sites of the project in the country is the Central Mindoro Biodiversity Corridor in the provinces of Occidental and Oriental Mindoro.
2. The primary objective of the project is to operationalize integrated management of biodiversity corridors to generate multiple benefits including effective conservation of globally threatened species and high conservation value forests, reduce deforestation and degradation, and enhance local biodiversity-friendly livelihoods.
3. The project's four components include: 1) effective coordination and governance framework for integrated ecosystem management in the Philippines biodiversity corridors system; 2) application of integrated network design and management of biodiversity corridors to ensure continued stability and sustainability of their biological, ecosystem services and socioeconomic conservation values; 3) community based sustainable use and management systems in the two pilot biodiversity corridor systems in the Philippines; 4) knowledge management, gender mainstreaming, learning, monitoring, and evaluation.
4. Among the strategies identified under Component 1 is the proposed creation of a Corridor Alliance Advisory Committee (CAAC) which aims to serve as venue to update the key stakeholders on the progress of the BD Corridor Project as well as address and resolve implementation issues and concerns. The DENR MIMAROPA, as the implementer of the project, is proposing to create the CAAC under the EDC. The proposed CAAC shall be chaired by the DENR MIMAROPA Regional Executive Director, to be Co-chaired by a senior political representative from the RDC.
5. In a letter dated January 30, 2023, the DENR MIMAROPA requested the inclusion of the proposed creation of CAAC for the Mindoro BD Corridor Project as one of the agenda of the first quarter EDC meeting. The terms of reference on the proposed creation of the CAAC will be presented by a representative from the Corridor Project Management Unit (CPMU).

1. FY 2022 Budget Review and Consultation

The EDC conducted the FY 2022 budget review on February 22, 2022 online through Zoom videoconference. The Committee reviewed and recommended RDC endorsement of the proposed and ongoing programs, activities, and projects (PAPs) of the 13 economic sector regional agencies (BFAR, CDA, DA, DAR, DENR, DOST, DOT, DTI, EMB, FDA, MGB, PCA, and PCSD) to their respective agency central offices for inclusion in the FY 2023 budget.

The proposed FY 2023 PAPs of the EDC member agencies are supportive of the region's development priorities and responsive to the current regional development plan, strategic regional development agenda, long term vision (Ambisyon Natin 2040), 0+10 point socioeconomic agenda, sustainable development goals, rehabilitation and recovery plan for COVID-19, Balik Probinsya, Bagong Pag-asa (BP²) Program, and Whole-of-Nation Approach. The budget proposals are also consistent with the priority PAPs in the updated Regional Development Investment Program (RDIP).

The EDC member agencies considered the following concerns in their proposals: a) climate change-related PAPs; b) PAPs that require convergence approach; c) GAD-related PAPs; d) PAPs in support of youth development, senior citizens, disabled persons, and indigenous peoples; e) the establishment of a regional office in the designated regional government center; f) PAPs for COVID-19 response and recovery interventions; g) PAPs for the BP² Program; and h) PAPs to end local communist armed conflict (ELCAC).

The RDC, during its 78th full council meeting on March 04, endorsed the FY 2023 budget proposals of the economic sector agencies.

2. Election of Public Sector Representative (PSR) in Romblon

The EDC Secretariat participated in the evaluation of nominees for the selection of public sector representative (PSR) and basic sector representative (BSR) in support to the upcoming RDC reorganization.

The EDC Secretariat facilitate the conduct of election of Public Sector Representative (PSR) in Romblon. The elected PSRs for Romblon province were: 1) Mr. Rodne R. Galicha, Bayay Sibuyanon, Inc.; and 2) Mr. Raymundo D. Cometa, Roadbook Centre, Inc.

3. RDC Special (Reorganization) meeting

The EDC member agencies participated in the RDC Special meeting held on August 26. The Reorganization meeting confirmed the membership of the following PSRs to the RDC and sectoral committees:

- a. Mr. Rodne R. Galicha, Bayay Sibuyanon, Inc.;
- b. Engr. Ana Margarita Lustre-Malijan, Puerto Princesa Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Inc.;

- d. Solomon C. Rosario, Taw Kabui for a Child, Inc.

4. Regional consultation workshop on the formulation of the MIMAROPA Regional Development Investment Program (RDIP) 2023-2028 and Preparation of the FY 2024 Annual Investment Program (AIP)

The EDC member agencies participated in the regional consultation workshop conducted on November 10-11, 2022 via Zoom. It was participated in by the representatives from different RLAs, LGUs, GOCCs, SUCs, and the RDC private sector representatives. During the workshop, the participants validated and reviewed the submitted agency investment programs for the Three Year Rolling Infrastructure Program (TRIP) 2024 – 2026 as well as the PAPs for funding and implementation in FY 2024.

Upon review of the RDC Sectoral Committees during their 4th quarter meetings on November 23, 2022, the list of major capital programs and projects (MCPs), validated sectoral investment programs, and FY 2024 AIPs of MIMAROPA Government Offices were recommended for RDC adoption.

The RDC MIMAROPA during its 4th Quarter meeting on December 02, 2022, approved and adopted the list of major capital programs and

projects and the FY 2024 Annual Investment Programs of MIMAROPA Government Office that will be considered in the preparation of the MIMAROPA Regional Development Investment Program (RDIP) 2023-2028.

The MIMAROPA RDIP 2023-2028 was approved by the RDC during a Special meeting on February 10, 2023.

5. Regional consultation workshop on the formulation of the MIMAROPA Regional Development Plan (RDP) 2023-2028

The EDC member agencies participated in the regional consultation workshop conducted on November 04, 2022 in Manila. It was participated in by the representatives from different RLAs, LGUs, GOCCs, SUCs, and the RDC private sector representatives. The EDC Secretariat facilitated the workshop for economic-related RDP chapters.

Representatives from EDC member agencies served as panelists and provided inputs/comments/suggestions on their concerned RDP Chapters. Said inputs were reflected in the revised write-ups. Upon review of the EDC during their 4th Quarter meeting on November 23, the economic-sector-related RDP chapters were recommended for RDC adoption.

The RDC MIMAROPA during its 4th Quarter meeting on December 02, 2022, approved and adopted the Chapter Strategy Frameworks as part of the MIMAROPA Regional Development Plan (RDP) 2023-2028. The MIMAROPA RDP 2023-2028 was approved by the RDC during a Special meeting on February 10, 2023.

6. 2021 Regional Development Report (RDR)

The EDC reviewed and provided comments on the economic development chapters of the 2021 RDR. On May 05, 2022 the EDC recommended RDC approval of the economic sector chapters of the 2020 RDR.

The MIMAROPA RDR contains an assessment of the performance of the region for a given year based on the targets of the MIMAROPA RDP 2017-2022 Midterm Update and its accompanying revalidated Results Matrix (RM). It also provides strategic and policy direction to refocus priorities and/or catch-up with the RDP targets.

The RDC, during its 79th full council meeting conducted virtually on June 03 passed RDC Resolution No. 2022-079-1085, approving the 2021 MIMAROPA RDR.

7. 2022 RDR Preparation Guidelines

The EDC reviewed and recommended RDC approval of the guidelines on the preparation of the 2022 RDR during its fourth quarter meeting held on November 23, 2022.

The 2022 RDR guidelines provides the standard procedure, data requirements, schedule of activities, and ensure its consistency with the Philippine Socioeconomic Report submitted to the President.

The RDC approved the guidelines during its 80th full council meeting held on December 02, 2022.

8. Quarterly/Annual Regional Economic Situationer (Q/ARES)

The EDC secretariat prepared four quarterly regional economic situationer (QRES) and one annual RES on agriculture, tourism, mineral production, export, import, and investments based on the inputs from the EDC members. The reports were included in the MIMAROPA Links, the official publication of RDC MIMAROPA.

9. The EDC reviewed, deliberated and/or recommended RDC endorsement of the following proposed PAPs:
