Background and Purpose:

Pursuant to Special Order No. 2021-664, the Project Steering Committee (PSC), Inter-Agency Technical Working Group (ITWG), National Project Coordination Unit (NPCU), and Regional Project Management Committee (RPMC) were created to ensure the successful implementation of the SIBOL Project. - ESG: Work on data such as species distribution.
- Updating of Management Plan and Survey Map (MMPL PAMO)

APASu Quinnee (MOBPLS): Request for SIBOL assistance in pushing the items to Masinloc PAMO.

DENR KISS: Forest Cover data is yearly (from NAMRIA), which Palawan can use as baseline since these data are updated over time, not real-time.

Livelihood Concerns

PASu Beth (PPSRNP): For unutilized funds, can these be redirected to the livelihood component (i.e., BDFE) of communities?

- Ms. Rina (SA 2 SIBOL): What SIBOL needs to look at is NCA. PES schemes are economic instruments with the value based on the ecosystem services. The ES will be the basis of the NCA valuation.
- Livelihood: SIBOL is focusing on big ticket BDFEs (i.e., fiber glass making, cave museum) in Palawan to help in livelihood concerns of communities.
- FFP is also helping communities in SIBOL sites to alleviate their livelihood concerns.
- Ms. Grace (USAID): SIBOL can find a way to respond immediately on the



















		livelihood concerns. Probably work on economic incentives. • PASu Beth is asking for immediate funding for livelihood concerns for IPs. For example, in log clearing, there is no money to fund cash-for-work programs. • ESG: SIBOL can provide seed capital.
		Wood Recovery Permit PPC ENRO: DENR policy on use of debris for Pabahay Programs still require permits. Thus, families in Palawan (CNCH) still can't recover debris. • DENR FMB: Temporary lifting of wood recovery permit (WRP) but only until June 1. There are still requests for extension. Follow up in LGU so request can reach main management office. • FMB also drafted revisions for the new guidelines of WRP.
		 PKMD concerns Detailed activity report on project accomplishments especially on carbon sequestration. Enhancement of monitoring tools-LAWIN and Earth Ranger. National rollout of training designs. Certification and accreditation for forest controllers. Timeline for provision.
