Subject: Request for the Extension on the One (1) Year Storage Time Limit of Hazardous Wastes

Dear Director Salino:

We extend our warm greetings to you from the Philippine Ports Authority PMO Palawan.

Our office at Port of Puerto Princesa has been registered as a Hazardous Waste Generator and categorized as Small Quantity Generator since January 4, 2018.

On December 27, 2022, and March 20, 2023, we had our hazardous wastes (I101, I104, and D407) transported and treated by a DENR-accredited Transporter and Treatment Storage and Disposal (TSD) facility, and we were issued Certificates of Treatment through the Hazardous Waste Management System on February 23, 2023, and May 31, 2023, respectively. The cost of procuring the transporter and treatment facility however, was costly due to inter-island transport because of the lack of a TSD Facility in the province of Palawan.

With this, we respectfully request an extension on the one (1) year storage limit of hazardous wastes for Small Generators as outlined in DENR Administrative Order No. 2013-22, Table 3.2 Compliance Requirements of Waste Generators since we only produce less than fifty (50) liters of used oil and more or less twenty (20) busted bulbs in a year.

Further, we are respectfully asking to be allowed to store up to 200 liters (1 drum) of used oil and at least one hundred (100) busted bulbs, or at least every three (3) years before we procure the transport and treatment of our wastes. With these, we maximize the transportation and treatment costs and are therefore more advantageous to the government.

As an organization deeply committed to environmental management, we assure you that we store our wastes appropriately and responsibly for the health and safety of our surroundings.

Hoping for your favorable consideration on this matter.
