This pertains to the submitted two (2) hard bound copies and a Compact Disk (CD) copy of the Documentation of CBFM Success Stories funded under CBFM-CARP for CY 2022.

Featured in the Documentation Report is the Malampaya Pancol Multi-Purpose Cooperative (MPMPC), a tenure holder of the Community-Based Forest Management Agreement (CBFMA) awarded by DENR in CY 2000 covering a total area of 1,700 hectares located in barangay Pancol, Municipality of Taytay, Province of Palawan. They are also situated inside the Malampaya Sound Protected Landscape and Seascape.

We have reviewed the said documentation and the CD copy based on the FMB Technical Bulletin No. 18 – "Documentation of Good Practices in Forest Resources Management (FRM)". As defined in the Technical Bulletin, FRM refers to forest management practices and technologies that are innovative or indigenous that can serve as models for "green and inclusive growth". The Technical Bulletin has also provided clear and detailed processes and key points to be considered in the documentation activities. Further, a Storyline /Plot for the Documentation Report was likewise provided.

Hereunder are our general observations, comments and suggestions:

I. General Observations/Comments

A. Documentation report (hard copy)

1. The Report was compliant with the five (5) major parts as per prescribed Annotated Report Outline in the FMB Technical Bulletin No.18, as herewith enumerated:

Part I. Introduction

Part II. Situation on the Ground prior to the Project

Part III. Interventions

Part IV. Success Strategies and Lessons Learned

Part V. Challenges/Call to Action

- 2. The report is not fully compliant with the required content of each part of the report mentioned above.
 - Example. What was prescribed was key accomplishments and gaps but discussions were on Key accomplishments and Impacts rather than key accomplishments and Gaps as per prescribed report outline.
- Discussions were not supported with factual data or necessary statistics particularly the interventions, key accomplishment and impacts. A very limited statistics was noted on the discussion on the situationer.
- 4. Maps are presented in a half page and fonts are too small that is very difficult to read. In addition, the legends provided are not quantified particularly those that needs to be quantified (i.e area of land cover or land uses, area for development).
- 5. Some pictures showing improper handling of seedlings by the PO-MPMPC and inappropriate hole size for out planting of seedlings.

B. Video Documentation Report

- There was a smooth flow of discussion and emphasized in the video were the partnership between the MPMPC and the DENR Offices including the support provided by the latter to the MPMPC, the project interventions, and the changes contributed by the CBFM and the other DENR projects' interventions to the lives of the MPMPC and to their CBFM area.
- 2. There were more video shoots for the improper handling of seedlings of PO members.

II. Suggestions/Recommendations

Since the Written and Video Documentation reports were already accepted at the Region, our recommendations are for enhancement of future works/outputs similar to this one. Our recommendations are as follows:

- 1. Ensure that the report are compliant with the prescribed report outline and content, and consider the provided processes in coming up with the required report/output.
- 2. Provide factual data/information or other statistics that should be quantified in the report and establishes the extent and magnitude of the situation (e.g. problem, challenges, interventions outputs/results and impacts).
- 3. Provide sufficient photodocumentation that may further enhance understanding and appreciation of the reader on a significant situation or subject.
- 4. Maps provided should be in a clear and readable form with complete details. At least these maps are included in the list of maps to be provided in the report, to wit:
 - a) Location map of the project site (barangay, municipality, province)

- b) Control map indicating the proposed or targeted physical interventions with quantified targets;
- c) Development map indicating the quantified physical accomplishments, among other necessary detailed information.
- 5. Edit the erroneous pictures (i.e improper handling of seedlings) in the video documentation with the help of the Regional Public Affairs Office or any able Regional team member.
- 6. Form a multi-level and multidisciplinary review and evaluation team to review the documentation materials before finalization.
