ENFORCEMENT**

This is in reference to the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) - National Commission on Indigenous Peoples (NCIP) high-level policy discussions of issues and concerns over forest lands, alienable and disposable public lands, mineral resources, and other natural resources with issued ancestral lands, domains and those with ongoing claims. On 17 August 2022, a follow-up meeting was conducted which was presided by Joselin Marcus E. Fragada, CESO III, Undersecretary for Field Operations-Mindanao together with Commissioner Rhodex P. Valenciano as the designated/nominated focal persons of their respective offices in the June 22, 2022 meeting.

During the said meeting, it was agreed that the creation of different subgroups be formalized in order to facilitate discussions on key issues, to wit:

- a) Subgroup on Titling of Lands and Section 56 on Vested Rights
- b) Subgroup on Mapping and Data Sharing
- c) Subgroup on Coordination Mechanism for Section 58 of IPRA
- d) Subgroup on FPIC, Tenurial Instruments and other DENR permits, and Enforcement
- e) Subgroup on Dispute Resolution

The Forest Management Bureau was assigned to lead discussions on **Subgroup on FPIC, Tenurial Instruments and other DENR permits, and Enforcement** which is being Co-Chaired by Engr. Caridad Katherine Gullunan of NCIP with the following objective(s):

- To provide for enforcement measures and mechanisms as regards:
 - o the issuance of cease-and-desist orders (CDO) by NCIP and/or DENR;
 - o the cancellation of permits, licenses, instruments, or certifications, in cases of violation of the IPRA, Memorandum of Agreement, and other pertinent laws, rules and regulations; and

- utilization, control and enjoyment by the ICCs/IPs of the land and natural resources within their ADs/ALs in light of the expiration of programs, permits, licenses, and other RUIs issued thereon.
- To ensure that FPIC from the ICCs/IPs and the corresponding Certification Precondition (CP) are secured before any person, organization, or entity, public or private, conducts any project, program or activity, including issuance or renewal of permits and licenses and the conversion or merging of tenurial instruments, within or affecting ADs/ALs;
- To harmonize overlapping jurisdictions between DENR and NCIP as regards reservations, such as forest reservations, mineral reservations, and watersheds, which are located within ADs/ALs but are also covered by Presidential Proclamations or laws; and
- To provide for the formal recognition of sustainable traditional resource use of ICCs/IPs within their ADs/ALs, including the formulation of a streamlined process for approval of development of projects initiated by ICCs/IPs within their ADs/ALs.

Please be informed that an initial meeting/discussion was conducted last 12 October 2022 (see Annex for detailed discussion) and agreed to limit the scope for each topic, to wit:

1. NCIP to discuss and present their proposed level of participation on DENR activities especially on the processes of issuance of CDO and other administrative process;
2. NCIP to provide access to the existing IPO registry and other similar databases relevant to tenure/permit issuances;
3. NCIP to provide a directory/database of NCIP officials/staff/indigenous peoples organizations representatives to assist the forest tenure instrument applicants on the FPIC process;
4. DENR to submit the list of programs and permits that may require the FPIC process and coordinate with other bureaus for the list of programs and permits being issued;
5. DENR to submit draft MOA to NCIP for review and comments; and
6. Both NCIP and DENR to provide a clear stand on the securing of permits of indigenous peoples in their utilization of natural resources within their ancestral domains.

In this regard, kindly submit the following information being monitored/processed/supervised which in any way affects/involves IPs/ICCs within your sector/office:

1. List of programs, permits, licenses, and clearances
 - processes, requirements and timelines
2. Survey process for permits and licenses that require spatial verification
3. Responsibilities and rights of permittees/holders
4. Possible convergence and collaboration
