Request of the Provincial Government to NCCA for technical assistance	Mr. Dhon Calda, Tourism Officer of the PLGU Oriental presented the request of their PLGU to the National Commission for Culture and the Arts (NCCA) for technical assistance in the establishment of Liwasang Bonifacio in Naujan and Heritage Houses in Pola as local heritage sites.  Mr. Calda emphasized that the development of these particular sites needs a thorough study and assistance coming from the experts. Mr. Calda has requested the SCC to endorse the project in Naujan for technical and possibly financial assistance from the NCCA to fully develop the said site, following the standard guidelines of the NCCA when it comes to heritage sites/areas. 	town of Oriental, Mindoro. Mr. Calda also requested for endorsement from the SCC for funding and technical assistance of the NCCA. Subsequently, after the development and provision of the site development plan, Mr. Calda stated that they requested other regional line agencies for possible funding.  Mr. Oscar Casaysay reiterated on the side of the NCCA that the concern/proposal will be studied. The NCCA will directly communicate	
	with Mr. Calda of the Provincial Government of Oriental Mindoro on or before the next meeting regarding the proposal.	
Reorganization of Local Culture and Arts Councils	Mr. Bongolan presented the second agenda which is the Reorganization of Local Culture and Arts Councils. They stated that the recommended action or action required is for the support and endorsement of the reorganization of the Local Culture and Arts Councils, to be addressed with the MIMAROPA SCC and to be addressed to the Social Development Committee. 	Mr. Dhon Calda stated that they have institutionalized the creation of the Oriental Mindoro Council for Culture and the Arts through Provincial Ordinance No.139-2022, which is the Provincial Tourism Code of the province, and questioned whether there is a need to revise the matter given that it has already been institutionalized.  Mr. Bongolan responded that the case of Oriental Mindoro is not new, as they have encountered similar senses in other LGUs, but it is one of the issues that will be discussed with the new administration, particularly with the new DILG officials. Mr. Bongolan assured that the updates would be discussed at the following meeting.  Mr. Oscar Casaysay stated that they are just reimposing the Memorandum from the DILG. Although there are already institutionalized organizations from LGUs, there is still a need to seek guidance from the DILG.  A brief Cultural Recovery and Resiliency Program video briefing was shown.  The National Commission of Culture and the Arts (NCCA) proposes the endorsement of the Cultural Recovery and Resiliency Plan 2022-2028 as a framework for the culture and the arts sector to be disaster-resilient – prepared to respond to and recover from all disasters.  Mrs. Bevienne G. Malateo requested that the presented matter be considered again at the next meeting for clarification and it is approved by Mr. Casaysay. The Resolution for the Cultural Recovery and Resiliency Program was postponed given the proposal.	Agenda discussion is to be deferred to the next meeting schedule.

As the newly-elected chairperson of the MIMAROPA SCC, the NCCA recognizes the opportunity to help the SCC appreciate the culture, heritage, and the arts of the region even more by immersing in each of the provinces. This can also aid in building camaraderie among members, putting a spotlight on each province, and highlighting the unique and diverse culture of the region.

The tentative work plan assigns the hosting of the subsequent SCC Meetings to the MIMAROPA PLGUs. Host PLGUs are responsible for the recommended meeting venue as well as assisting the secretariat in facilitating the logistical concerns of the meeting. Moreover, the host PLGU is encouraged to arrange a quick learning visit to any cultural facility and/or space so that the SCC can observe and gain new perspectives that may be integrated into their respective agencies and offices.

Additionally, two member RLAs will also present a report on the initiatives of their agencies in mainstreaming culture and values in the region as matters for information during the next meetings. This is to enjoin all members to take part in the SCC's role vis-à-vis the PDP and RDP.

	Paranaque City, Metro Manila with the theme "Culture Counts: Embracing and Forging the Philippine Creative Future". The conference aims to 1) assert the important role of culture in development, especially in the new normal; 2) encourage the appreciation and utilization of cultural statistics as a tool in establishing data on creative economy and measures of development; 3) strengthen support from the national and local governments for cultural and creative sectors in the Philippines, specifically on policy and legislation that will boost the cultural and creative economy, and; 4) motivate more research and studies on culture and arts towards building a robust data resource for policy-making and governance in the country.  Mr. Casaysay reiterated that those who are interested to join the conference are to inform them and they would be sending the invitations. He also said that the venue and the food will be shouldered by the NCCA, however, transportation and accommodation will be shouldered by each agency attending the said conference.

Mr. Angeles presented the overview of the NYC, stating that it was established in 1995 by virtue of Republic Act 8044, otherwise known as the "Youth in Nation – Building Act of 1995", as well as the Mission and Vision of the agency. The NYC 1) advocate policies on youth protection and participation; 2) build and sustain partnerships and networks; and 3) foster youth participation in community development and good governance.

Mr. Angeles ended the presentation by sharing NYC's Annual International exchange programs such as the ASEAN Youth Interfaith Camp in Indonesia.

# Activity Report on the 3-day MIMAROPA Capacity Development Activity last February 8-10, 2022

Mr. Bongolan presented the Activity Report on the 3-day MIMAROPA Capacity Development Activity last February 8-10, 2022.

Attended by 146 Participants, the activity garnered an excellent **4.50** and **4.66** feedback ratings on Part 1 and Part 2, respectively.

Day 1 of the CapDev activity focused on the fundamental function of the LCAC – the roles as per the RA 10066 or *The National Cultural Heritage Act of 2009*, and the Revised Guidelines on the Philippine Registry of Cultural Property (PRECUP) as per DILG-NCCA JMC 2021-01. In the afternoon session, the NCCA PRECUP office facilitated a workshop for the LCACs and LGU participants on how to properly fill up the three forms required under the PRECUP.

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	Days 2 and 3 constituted part 2 of the entire CapDev activity. It stressed the importance of Local Cultural Development Planning, its legal bases, characteristics, and difference from Local Tourism Planning. Since the Oriental and Occidental Mindoro and Palawan have already undergone the training previously, Marinduque and Romblon became the major participants. The two previously mentioned provinces presented their Local Cultural Profiles. Afterward, Mr. Edison Molanida of NCCA OED-LCAC unit explained the processes of the planning and the necessary tools per process.	
Updates on Oriental Mindoro Heritage and Cultural Center (OMHCC)	Mr. Dhon Calda presented the Updates on the Oriental Mindoro Heritage and Cultural Center which is a joint project of the Provincial Government of Oriental Mindoro and the National Commission for Culture and the Arts (NCCA).  Mr. Calda recalled the inquiry during the 2021 3 <sup>rd</sup> Quarter MIMAROPA SCC meeting about the clarification on the Deed of Donation that is being required by the NCCA. In order to address the concern, the NCCA and the Provincial Government of Oriental Mindoro entered into an agreement stating that the Deed of Donation will be undertaken after the construction. 	Mr. Calda proceeded in giving the background of the fund utilization report on the 15 million financial assistance from the NCCA. As of the meeting, the contractor already collected an amount of 5.9 million for the first partial payment and 4.08 million for the second partial payment. This is equivalent to 67.44% construction of the OMHCC.  However, since the OMHCC is amounting to PHP 24M, Mr. Calda said	

	that they provided an additional PHP 15M fund which was sourced out from the 2021 Annual Budget of the Provincial Government of Oriental Mindoro in March 2022. Overall, to finish the project, the total expenditure amounted to PHP 3M. He also stated the need for an additional 25 million for the concreting of the road leading to the OMHCC.  Mr. Calda also discussed the architectural/floor plan of the Oriental Mindoro Heritage and Cultural Center. He also invited the MIMAROPA SCC, to the upcoming inauguration of the OMHCC, tentatively set for July of this year. SCC Chairperson Casaysay congratulated and recognized the provincial government for the substantial project.	
Activity Report on the National Heritage Month Webinar last May 30, 2022	Mr. Bongolan, presented the Activity Report on the National Heritage Month Webinar last May 30, 2022.  As part of the annual celebration of National Heritage Month, MIMAROPA SCC conducted a webinar last <i>May 30, 2022,</i>   <i>at 9:00 AM</i> with the theme "Pamanang Lokal: Binhi ng Kulturang Pilipino". Prof. Felipe M. De Leon, Jr., former NCCA Chairperson, served as the main resource speaker. The webinar was opened by Governor Jose Riano, the RDC MIMAROPA Chairperson and Romblon Governor. 150 participants attended the said webinar thru both Zoom Videoconference and Facebook Live.
