

**SUBJECT : EL NIÑO ALERT**

Per latest update of DOST-PAGASA's official press statement released on 02 May 2023, PAGASA has been continuously monitoring the developing El Niño conditions in the tropical Pacific. Recent conditions and model forecasts indicate that El Niño may emerge in the coming season (June-July-August) at 80% probability and may persist until the first quarter of 2024. With this development, the **PAGASA El Niño Southern Oscillation (ENSO) Alert and Warning System is now raised to EL NIÑO ALERT.**

With this, all are hereby directed to undertake the following preparedness actions and precautionary measures in connection with the current situation affecting the country:

1. Monitor closely the warning and other advisories issued by DOST-PAGASA and stay updated on climate advisories;
2. Remind all to conserve water and energy as well as to fix or report water leaks;
3. Strengthen risk communication and localize the warnings and reminders to communities within respective areas of responsibility;
4. Ensure adherence to the Public Health Advisory for El Niño and guidelines / minimum health standards on COVID-19; and
5. Submit regular RDRRMC Situation Report, as needed, highlighting the current situation, preparedness measures, and response needs, to the NDRRM Operations Center.


PAGASA will continue to closely monitor the development of this ENSO phenomenon. All concerned government agencies and the general public are encouraged to keep on monitoring and take precautionary measures against the impending impacts of El Niño.

In this regard, all NDRRMC members-agencies and RDRRMCS concerned are required to continue monitoring their respective AORs and are directed to submit their
