88		Having a quorum, the Chair called the meeting to order.			



For the welcome remarks, DRD **Santos** greeted the participants, and expressed her appreciation for taking their time to attend the meeting. She also took the opportunity to extend gratitude to the representatives of various government agencies who participated and extended support during the 01 September 2023 visit of President **Ferdinand Marcos Jr** in Palawan for the formal declaration of Palawan as insurgency-free.

97 She then ran down the agenda items to be discussed, emphasizing that 98 with the declaration of Palawan as insurgency-free, there are still other pressing 99 issues that need to be addressed and monitored in the region, particularly in 100 Mindoro Island being considered to be the center of gravity (COG) of the CTG, 101 and with the fast-approaching 2023 BSKE, which is scheduled to be held on 30 102 October 2023.

Review of the SDDP and Actionable Items of the RIC-4B 4B 8th Regular
Meeting held on 23 August 2023, and Review of Actions Taken on the
Decision Points of the Joint RIC-4B 6th Regular Meeting and ERIC-4B 2nd

109 The Summary of Discussion and Decision Point (SDDP) of the RIC-4B 110 8th Regular Meeting held on 23 August 2023 was reviewed, approved, and 111 adopted by the Body after a motion for its adoption was made by MAJ **Borja** 112 from MIG22, which was duly seconded by Atty **Mendoza** from DILG-MIMAROPA.

- Following the adoption of the SDDP of the RIC-4B 8^h Regular Meeting, the Secretariat facilitated the review of the actions taken on the decisions of said meeting. The Secretariat also updated the Body on the actions taken and updates on the decision points during the Joint RIC-4B 6th RIC-4B and ERIC-4B 2nd Quarter 2023 Meeting held on 27 June 2023, for the information of ERIC-4B members.

121 <u>RIC-4B 8th Regular Meeting</u>

On the former rebels (FRs) in Occidental Mindoro with Warrants of Arrest 123 124 (WOAs), the **Chair** said the same topic was raised by the MIMAROPA Regional Peace and Order Council (RPOC) Chair himself, Governor Eduardo Gadiano, 125 during the RPOC meeting held on 26 September 2023. He reiterated that no 126 one can go against the mandate of the PNP to serve the WOAs. He 127 nonetheless emphasized that with proper coordination among involved units, 128 the serving of WOAs can be calibrated to produce a more positive outcome, 129 especially in cases where the best solution is for the respondent to face the 130 131 charges and seek practical solutions to clear their name, particularly FRs.

On the update on the CTG disposition and activities in Mindoro Island and arrested CTG high-value targets (HVTs) in Calapan City, the **Chair** mentioned that the presence of high-ranking CTG leaders in Mindoro Island was discussed during the recent validation workshop of the JAPIC-Southern Luzon (SL). He then congratulated the PNP units involved in the filing of case

against Teresita Alcantara @ Jam, particularly the CIDG RFU-4B and the PRO-138 MIMAROPA through RID. He particularly lauded PCMS Leynes, the lead 139 140 investigator in the filing of case against @ Jam, for his dedication in monitoring the case. He noted that the filing of cases is a tedious endeavor, especially for 141 142 agencies like NICA who do not specialize on legal matters and law enforcement, and thanked PCMS Leynes for the assistance. He also 143 emphasized that filing of cases against the CTG, regardless how senseless nor 144 miniscule, is a work in progress that has an impact on the CTG's plans and 145 activities. 146

On the proscription of Regional Operational Command (ROC), Southern Tagalog Regional Party Committee (STRPC), ORO **Manahan** shared an update on the availability of documents that will be attached to the draft petition.

On the security preparations for the 2023 BSKE, the **Chair** explained the significance of consolidating intelligence on the CTG-fielded, -supported and/ or endorsed candidates and candidates paying campaign access fees (CAFs). He said the information will be used as a reference in assessing the extent of the CTG's influence at the grassroots. He reminded the Body that the intelligence will only be used for counter-action only if the information is credible with sufficient basis.

On the Presidential visit to Palawan on 01 September 2023 for the insurgency-free declaration, the **Chair** thanked the members for their contribution and support to the preparation for and the successful outcome of the said event. He expressed hopes that by next year a similar event will be held in Mindoro.

Joint RIC-4B 6th RIC-4B and ERIC-4B 2nd Quarter 2023 Meeting

On the status and utilization of FRs, ARD Rocillo shared that during the 168 RIC 7th Regular Meeting on 27 July 2023, the 3MBDE reported that their two 169 170 handled people's organizations (POs) are already preparing the required documents for the registration to the Securities and Exchange Commission 171 172 (SEC). Further, she added that the NICA-4B offered assistance in providing 173 templates for the registration, since the office supports some organizations under the MIMAROPA RTF-ELCAC in registering to various bodies such as the 174 SEC, DOLE, and CDA, among others. 175

On security and power grid concerns, ARD **Rocillo** reported that the NICA-4B, led by RD **Perlado**, visited the NGCP-South Luzon Division in Biñan, Laguna on 01 August 2023. It was agreed upon during the visit that the former will conduct Security Survey and Inspection (SSI) of the NGCP Calapan City Sub-station as soon as the facility is completed. She explained that presently there are only four repeater tower stations in the region, and the sub-station has yet to complete the construction.

185 On the establishment of EDCA sites and its impact on IP communities in 186 Balabac, Palawan, ARD **Rocillo** reported that the PCSD shared that during their

187 first survey on the EDCA site in 2015, there were no claims from the IPs, adding 188 that the issue in Balabac only came about in 2019, which is believed to be 189 politically motivated.

190

On the legal efforts, ARD **Rocillo** mentioned that the DOJ opted to schedule a workshop/training on DOJ Circular No 20 tentatively on 10 October 2023, inviting select RIC members to participate in the workshop. During the workshop, the active participation of the prosecutors in the case build-up on cases, including those related to the RA 11479 and RA 10168, will be discussed. She added that the DOJ-4 has yet to provide an update on the matter.

On the table-top exercise (TTX) on the National Terrorism Threat Level System (NTTLS) Manual, ARD **Rocillo** noted that representatives from the 10SAB, PNP-SAF; OG2, 3MBDE; CIDG RFU-4B; BI; RMFB-4B; OU2, SOLCOM; RID, PRO-MIMAROPA; APC-SL; FSSOL, 3012AISS; 4ISU; and TOG4 attended said workshop held on 05 July 2023.

204 IV. Highlights of the Meeting/Discussions

206 <u>MIMAROPA Security Environment</u>

ARD **Rocillo** delivered the briefing on the MIMAROPA Security Environment, focusing on the various security concerns and threats in MIMAROPA, namely, the CTG, MNLF, and geopolitical concerns. She discussed that with the declaration of Palawan as insurgency-free, the geopolitical tensions in the West Philippine Sea (WPS) have become the major security concern shaping the security landscape in MIMAROPA, while Mindoro Island has become the remaining operational theater of the CTG in the region.

The **Chair** emphasized that the overall scan of the security environment of MIMAROPA highlights the shift of attention from internal to external security. He asserted that there was a need to finish the CTG problem in Palawan, especially since there is a more pressing security concern in the area, adding that the security forces and the Intelligence Community (INTELCOM) cannot move forward with divided attention.

The **Chair** also explained that there is an existential threat in the WPS that can define the global security order, adding that the WPS is a potential regional flashpoint, along with the Taiwan Strait and Korean Peninsula, among others. He pointed out the declaration of Palawan as insurgency-free is a very good transition for the INTELCOM, especially as there are units who are now abreast and heavily involved with WPS Concerns.

At this point, the **Chair** congratulated the maritime security units, particularly the PN, PCG and BFAR, for standing their ground at sea by making the presence of the Philippines felt in the contested areas. He then encouraged the INTELCOM to continue launching counter-attacks both at sea and inland Palawan.

Nonetheless, RD **Perlado** emphasized the reality that there are still internal security concerns in MIMAROPA that cannot be set aside, adding that the security concerns in the region is divided into internal and geopolitical. He then called for continued vigilance and collaboration among government agencies under the NTF-ELCAC umbrella to sustain the campaign against the CTG, and expressed his support to the INTELCOM, units and agencies in this regard.

Designation of CPP-NPA Personalities from MIMAROPA

ORO **Manahan** discussed the process for designating personalities, particularly CTG members, through the Anti-Terrorism Act (ATA) 2020 mechanism. He explained that for the designation, the funds and bank accounts of individuals designated will be frozen and will not be available. He added that personalities proved to be supporting the CTG can also be designated.

The **Chair** congratulated the CIDG RFU-4B and PRO-MIMAROPA for the filing of ATA case against **Teresita Alcantara** @ **Jam.** He said that the efforts of law enforcement agencies are now being paid-off and it reflects in the progress of the legal aspect in the region.

258 Meanwhile, PCMS **Leynes** suggested to include **Lena Gumpad** 259 @ **Maan** in the list of personalities for designation since the documents against 260 her are almost complete. He also gave an update on the filed cases against 261 the two CTG HVTs arrested in Puerto Galera, and the statements of FRs to 262 identify the two arrested personalities.

The **Chair** solicited comments on the proposed designation of **Sonny Rogelio** @ **Miggy**. For her part, ARD **Rocillo** explained that the intention of @ **Miggy**'s designation is to prevent him from coming back to Palawan.

Cpt **Gonzales** also suggested to also include the secretaries of NPA territorial units, to which the **Chair** agreed and advised the former to submit the necessary documents for their designation.

The **Chair** said the list can be submitted to the Anti-Terrorism Council (ATC) for its review. He also mentioned the planned creation of the task group that will focus on handling the legal efforts of the RIC-4B, adding that the NBI is willing to lead said task group. However, with the suggestion of PCMS **Leynes** to include Prosecutor **Rodan Parocha** in said task group, the **Chair** suggested to have Prosecutor **Parocha** lead the task group.

- 279 <u>Update on EDCA Sites in Palawan</u>
- 280

1LT **Parangue** from the ODI, TOW-WEST presented an update on EDCA sites in Palawan. He showed the proposed EDCA projects in Balabac, Palawan, which include a HADR hangar and a three-storey barracks, and at the Antonio Bautista Air Base (ABAB) in Puerto Princesa City, which include two three-storey

deployment barracks. 1LT **Parangue** also reported that the proposals have already been submitted to higher AFP headquarters for approval, and that there is no definite timeline for the project implementation. With this, he cleared that no EDCA project has begun implementation since all EDCA projects have yet to be approved. He also clarified that the ongoing project in Balabac, which is the construction of a military airstrip, is not an EDCA project but a project under the DND-DPWH TIKAS project.

293 RD Perlado said there is no problem in other EDCA sites, but pointed out 294 that there is an IP issue in Balabac. He sought the comment of the NCIP representative on the matter, particularly on the second consultation dialogue, 295 296 which was slated in July 2023. Mr **Tugas** from the NCIP-Palawan responded that the consultation is ongoing with regard to the construction of the runway. For 297 298 his part, 1LT Parangue said that the fifth consultation was already conducted, 299 the result of which is favorable to the government with the IP residents agreeing to the construction. He also said that by the October, it is expected that the 300 NCIP will issue the clearance/certification for the project, allowing the project 301 to push through. 302

The **Chair** said this is a welcome development, and thanked the ODI and the NCIP for overseeing the matter. He also emphasized the importance of the project vis-à-vis national security and territorial integrity without disregarding the socio-cultural interests of the IPs. He then requested the ODI and the NCIP to provide an update report on the projects in Balabac, to be consolidated and submitted to the National Intelligence Committee (NIC) and the NSA.

311 312 Update on the 2023 Barangay and Sangguniang Kabataan Elections

PLTCOL Devaras, Chief, RID, PRO-MIMAROPA, gave an update on the 313 security preparations for the 2023 BSKE. He shared that the number of police 314 315 personnel in MIMAROPA for deployment is lacking vis-à-vis the number of 316 voting centers in the region, particularly in Palawan and Romblon. He added that this was addressed with the augmentation of personnel from other units 317 318 for additional support in security during the 2023 BSKE. He also presented the 319 election areas of concern, adding that strategic checkpoints were established 320 in these areas. Thereafter, the election data were presented, which includes the number of voting population, and number of candidates who filed their 321 certificates of candidacy. He also reported that there are no threats against 322 the candidates monitored for the period. 323

At this point, the **Chair** asked if there are any candidates who received an extortion demand from the CPP-NPA terrorists. PLTCOL **Devaras**, CPT **Gonzales** and the 3MBDE representative said they have yet to receive any information or report related to the matter.

336 <u>Terrorism Threat Level for October 2023</u>

ORO **Manahan** presented the proposed terrorism threat level in the five provinces in MIMAROPA for October 2023, which is "LOW" with "Level 1" security measures due to the absence of any information suggesting a terror threat in the region.

Without any comments, the proposed terrorism threat level was adopted through a motion made by PLTCOL **Devaras**, which was duly seconded by Mr **Canillas** from the OTS.

347 JRTF-4B 3Q2023 Accomplishments

RD **Perlado** emphasized the importance of organizing and counter-CTG organizing works in MIMAROPA, and called on the DILG-MIMAROPA, who heads the MIMAROPA SUCBEM Cluster, to join the efforts of MIMAROPA RTF-ELCAC in organizing sectoral groups and communities, particularly in the registration to bodies such as the SEC and the CDA, among others, since is the essence of organizing works. He then enjoined the DILG, PNP, 203BDE, and 3MBDE to have their organized groups registered.

In response, Atty Mendoza from the DILG-MIMAROPA committed to take
action on the matter and to inform the RIC-4B regarding any activities of the
DILG-MIMAROPA related to NTF-ELCAC.

For her part, ARD **Rocillo** mentioned the advanced notice from the NTF-ELCAC Secretariat regarding the presentation of the 3Q2023 accomplishment reports by the JRTFs. She also noted that the JRTF-4B is initially scheduled to present on 17 October 2023, and that the JRTF-4B members are invited to the three-day presentation.

The **Chair** said that the consolidation of reports is the most difficult task 367 of the Technical Working Group (TWG). He reminded the cluster heads to 368 369 provide their respective accomplishments based on the prescribed template. He said that the point of the presentation is for the NTF-ELCAC Secretariat to 370 check on the performance of the JRTFs. He also noted that the JRTF-4B can 371 also seek guidance from the CORDS-MIMAROPA. He then asked the 372 DICT-MIMAROPA on the proposed date for the TWG to brief the 373 CORDS-MIMAROPA following the directive from the NTF-ELCAC Secretariat for 374 the TWGs to brief the newly-designated CORDS. 375

376

For her part, Ms **Matib** from DICT-MIMAROPA said the initial arrangements scheduled the meeting on 13 October 2023, but this will be reviewed due to the abrupt schedule of the presentations of accomplishments. RD **Perlado** agreed on the tentative schedule on 13 October 2023.

382 The **Chair** then reiterated the call for the submission of the clusters' 383 accomplishments for third quarter 2023.

Awarding of Plaque of Recognition

387 The Secretariat presented and read the citation of Plaque of Recognition for COL Glenn B Destriza PN(M) (Ret), Head, Enforcement Unit, 388 ECAN Zone Management and Enforcement Division, Palawan Council for 389 390 Sustainable Development. The Chair recognized the efforts of COL Destriza not 391 only in assisting the NICA-4B, but in supporting the efforts and programs of the 392 Palawan PTF-ELCAC, particularly the FRs, as well.

- on the designation of CTG personalities, for the 203BDE and CIDG 402 403 RFU-4B to provide a list of recommended CTG personalities for designation to the Secretariat for consolidation and submission to 404 the ATC for Review: 405
- on the update on the EDCA site in Balabac, Palawan, for the 407 RIC-4B Secretariat to issue RIS to ODI, TOW-WEST and NCIP-408 409 Palawan regarding the update on the developments relative to 410 the free, prior and informed consent (FPIC) for the EDCA site in Balabac, Palawan; RIC-4B Secretariat to consolidate, prepare 411 appropriate report, and submit to the NIC/NSA: and 412
- the proposed terrorism threat level for the five provinces in 414 MIMAROPA is "low" with "Level 1" security measures due to the 415 absence of the absence of an information suggesting specific, 416 417 imminent terror attack in the region;
- for the RIC/ERIC-4B to coordinate with DILG-MIMAROPA re 419 organizing works, particularly the registration to the Securities and 420 421 Exchange Commission and documentation of organized groups; 422 and
- 423 JRTF-4B Clusters to 424 for the submit their respective accomplishments for 3Q2023 to the MIMAROPA RTF-ELCAC TWG 425 Secretariat for consolidation and presentation to the NTF-ELCAC 426 Secretariat in October. 427
