

Dear Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR),

Good day!

Nevertheless, it appears that there is room for

increased awareness and understanding of this law among our fellow citizens.

In light of this, I propose a comprehensive campaign to raise awareness about the importance of adhering to RA 9003 and promoting responsible waste disposal in Puerto Princesa City and perhaps, the whole Philippines. It is my sincere hope that this campaign will not only educate our fellow citizens but also inspire them to take pride in our city and uphold the principles of this law.

I cordially invite the DENR to collaborate with local authorities, environmental organizations, and concerned citizens in implementing and promoting responsible waste management practices in our community.
