



Planting on a Slope


When planting on a slope, plant "out-of-the-fall" by adjusting the grade around the planting hole as illustrated in Figure 14.



Figure 14. Planting on a slope.
Top row: When planting on a slope, adjust the grade to plant "out-of-the-fall".
Right: When planted "into-the-hill", roots on the uphill side will not be too deep, slowing root establishment and growth.




PROSPECTS:

- Use available lands in highland that accounts to about 7M hectares; 50 % is barren or unutilized for agriculture and forestry business development.
- Climate in Mindanao is suited to most agricultural crops.
- Land conservation program. Preserve land against soil deterioration, erosion and soil acidification / degradation of upland soils for agriculture.
- Agro-forestry and multicropping system and crop diversification - bamboo, rubber, fruit trees, strawberries, melons and highland vegetables.

ECONOMIC VIABILITY:

- Based on production of Paulownia, average production of 24,700 bf/ha at 8-10 years and at minimum yield at US \$ 2/bf, a net profit ranging from US \$ 29,640 to 48,628/ha can be derived.
- In a case study conducted in US a net profit of P\$ 47,420/ha was obtained.
- Market: Japan on Paulownia.
- Other viable crops: China, M.E. and Europe.
