II. PRELIMINARIES

Engr. Glenn Marcelo C. Noble, Chairperson and MGB MIMAROPA Regional Director, called the meeting to order at 1:24 p.m. upon confirmation of a quorum (9 out of 10) by the secretariat.

17 III. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF THE PROVISIONAL AGENDA

Per Engr. Pablito M. Estorque, Jr.'s (EMB MIMAROPA) request, discussion regarding safety in case of gas leaks, and structural integrity of mine tailings was included in "Other Matters." With no other additional item to be included, the provisional agenda was approved upon the motion of Mr. Inocencio C. Magallanes (Haribon Palawan), seconded by Ms. Rhoda B. Roque (PCSD).

IV. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF THE DRAFT MINUTES OF THE 1ST QUARTER 2023 MRFC MEETING HELD ON 15 MARCH 2023

The following are the comments/corrections made on the draft minutes of the 1st Quarter 2023 MRFC Meeting:

- Line 14: For. Marilyn R. Limpiada (DENR) requested to correct Ms. Bibiana Lyn T. Aguha's first name which was initially spelt as Bibianalyn lyn; and
- Line 135: Platinum Group Metals Corporation was added among the list of mining and mineral processing companies to be visited.

Considering the above-mentioned corrections, the draft minutes for the 1st Quarter 2023 MRFC meeting was approved upon the motion of Mr. Magallanes, duly seconded by Fr. Jasper A. Tabangay (AVPP).

40 V. MATRIX OF ISSUES AND CONCERNS AND MATTERS ARISING FROM THE 1st QUARTER 41 MRFC MINUTES OF THE MEETING

- A. Relocation of Informal Settlers in the Coastal Sitios of Marabajay and Tagdalungon
 - According to For. Reynaldo C. Rivera (MENRO Bataraza), the construction of sea wall (DPWH-funded project) is ongoing. As for the relocation of informal settlers, Mayor Abraham M. Ibba has coordinated with the Department of Human Settlement and Urban Development for the construction of 12,000 residential units project in Bataraza.
- B. Improvement of Sitio Bohoy access road as requested by a claimant.
- When asked regarding the status of the property in question, For. Rivera said that the property cannot be located, nor its status can be determined according to the municipal assessor. Furthermore, there was also no record of the claimant.

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59	 Atty. Noel E. Aquino (PG-ENRO Palwan) provided the context on the
60	issue raised. He said that previously, there was an attempt to close the
61	road as a certain individual is claiming that it is part of his/her property.
62	
63	Following Atty. Aquino's statements, Mr. Jeb B. Badlon (CBNC) said that
64	there was a request to maintain the Sitio Bohoy access road during the
65	MMT. The road was constructed by RTNMC to serve as access road for
66	the IPs, so the IPs will not pass by the mine site going to their community
67 67	(safety purpose). CBNC wrote a letter to RTNMC regarding the request.
68 60	· Noting that the issue is more of DTNINC's concern Atty. Aquine
69 70	 Noting that the issue is more of RTNMC's concern, Atty. Aquino requested for the matter to be discussed during the MRFC meeting for
70 71	RTNMC, and the Chairperson concurred.
72	krivine, and the chaliperson concorred.
73	C. Utilization of ASDMP Funds
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75	 Regarding the Level 2 Water System Project that lacks a Certification
76	Precondition to proceed, the Chairperson said that he discussed the
77	matter with Dir. Marie Grace T. Pascua (NCIP MIMAROPA) but have not
78	received an update from NCIP MIMAROPA.
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80	 According to Mr. Ernesto A. Llacuna (CBNC), the NCIP Provincial Office
81	informed the company that the corresponding documents have been
82	endorsed to NCIP Regional Office on 22 June 2023.
83	
84	 The Chairperson instructed the secretariat to prepare a letter addressed
85	to NCIP MIMAROPA and requested CBNC for a copy of the documents.
86	
87	 On the abandoned/legacy mine, the Chairperson instructed the
88	personnel of MGB MIMAROPA to take note of the necessary actions to
89	be taken in compliance to Lines 224 to 231 of the Minutes of the 1 st
90	Quarter 2023 MRFC Meeting.
91	D. Undates en National Unitied ICC
92 93	D. Updates on National Unified IEC
93 94	• The Chairperson instructed the company to provide MGB MIMAROPA a
95	copy of their letter requesting for the liquidation of the PHP60 million
96	budget provided by CBNC for the National Unified IEC, which will be
97	forwarded to MGB Central Office.
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99	VI. TECHNICAL REPORTS
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101	1. Presentation of Highlights of the 1Q2023 MMT Validation
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103	Engr. Hanna Lee B. Arriesgado (MGB MIMAROPA) presented the findings
104	and recommendations for CBNC during the 1st Quarter 2023 MMT
105	monitoring.
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Engr. Arriesgado requested Mr. Magallanes and Atty. Aquino to impart 107 to the body the overview of the discussion of the MMT regarding the 108 transport terminal and the slaughterhouse. 109 110 • On the Transport Terminal, Atty. Aquino shared that the area was visited 111 during the MMT monitoring. He finds the sight disheartening as the 112 company spent PHP2.5 million on its construction, however the terminal 113 was not properly maintained nor used for its intended purpose. 114 115 116 The MMT proposed to turn the project over to the municipal government, care of the MENRO, to be used as a satellite office of the MENRO in Bray. 117 Rio Tuba, as well as to build a nursery. 118 119 120 • The Chairperson asked how the transport terminal came into concept. 121 Mr. Llacuna responded that the project was done in anticipation of the rerouting of traffic from Macadam highway to Racub Road hence the 122 barangay was encouraged to construct a terminal site. 123 124 Atty. Aquino added that there has been a change in leadership of the 125 barangay on the time of construction ergo, the plans on the terminal 126 were discontinued/changed. Mr. Lawrence Amores (CBNC) informed 127 128 the body, that water and electricity were set to be installed but were not 129 given priority by the succeeding barangay leader. 130 • Upon hearing the project's background, the Chairperson agreed with 131 the MMT's proposal on its temporary turn over to the municipal 132 133 government/MENRO but advised likewise consider the possibility of retaining its original purpose. 134 135 Considering that the facility has been formally turned over to the 136 137 barangay, Atty. Aquino made a formal motion to request the Regional Director of MGB MIMAROPA to write to the punong barangay of Brgy. 138 139 Rio Tuba to temporarily turn the transport terminal building over to the municipal government, care of the MENRO, for further use and 140 maintenance; duly seconded by Mr. Rivera. 141 142 143 • On the slaughterhouse, Mr. Magallanes imparted that this is a concern of public health. Just like the terminal, this facility is non-functional due 144 to the same reason. Given this, Atty. Aquino requested the Regional 145 Director to write to the punong barangay on their plans on the 146 slaughterhouse. 147 148 • Regarding the suggestion of reducing the MMT monitoring days, Mr. 149 Badlon said that they too find the MMT monitoring days too long, but the 150 company has no issue with the current number of monitoring days. 151 152 153 • Noting that the data on financial expenditures reported were based on the report submitted by the company. The Chairperson said that 154 presenting the data from the company would seem like it's the 155 company's presentation and not the MMT's. Hence, he requested the 156

MMT to validate how the company's financial accomplishment are 157 accounted. 158 159 Engr. Estorque, Jr. informed the body on DENR-Undersecretary Jonas R. 160 Leone's statement regarding Extended Producer Responsibility. He 161 requested the company to ask their suppliers to register. 162 163 On carbon-sink program under mangrove forest protection and 164 enhancement, For. Limpiada inquired for the unit of measure of the 165 established program. Engr. Arriesgado said that the number indicated 166 on the presentation is the number of established programs. 167 168 As a brief background, Mr. Badlon stated that the implementation of a 169 170 carbon-sink program is one of the ECC conditionalities. Based on the 171 study conducted by a third-party consultant commissioned by the company, CBNC must establish a 350-ha. plantation to achieve carbon 172 neutrality by 2057. Through continuous coordination with CENRO 173 Brooke's Pt. and PENRO Palawan, CBNC adopted a 400-ha. mangrove 174 175 forest adjacent to Rio Tuba River and Ocayan River by virtue of a MOA. 176 For. Limpiada requested to include "Carbon Stocks" in tons as unit of 177 measure in future presentations. Engr. Arriesgado reiterated that the 178 179 unit of work measure changed overtime, she added that PCSD once suggested to adjust the unit of work measure according to what can 180 be monitored. On that note, For. Limpiada suggested to monitor and 181 record the unit of measure in hectares. 182 183 The Chairperson instructed the MMT to dedicate a row for other 184 information that is beyond the monitoring control of the team. 185 186 187 For. Limpiada added that the project seemed like an adopt-amanarove program. She advised the company not to adopt a 188 mangrove that are still under maintenance by the CENRO, but instead 189 adopt NGP graduated sites. 190 191 192 2. Presentation of highlights of the 2nd Quarter 2023 Water, Air and Noise Monitoring and Sampling 193 194 Engr. Mark Angelo S. Rogel (EMB MIMAROPA) presented the highlights of the 195 2nd Quarter 2023 Water, Air and Noise Monitoring and Sampling. 196 197 At the end of his first presentation, Engr. Rogel asked the company about 198 199 a pressing matter regarding its TSF 2. According to him, the TSF 2 is almost full. During heavy rains, the water overflows to the siltation ponds of 200 201 RTNMC through the spillway. Should there be an instance where the wastewater discharge of RTNMC will be beyond the prescribed water 202 quality guidelines, he asked who will be liable. 203 204

 Noting the situation, the Chairperson inquired if the companies have an 205 206 agreement on the matter. Engr. Briccio T. Abela (CBNC) said that there is no formal agreement between the companies. 207 208 • When the Chairperson asked who will be liable (should there be an 209 210 exceedance in the water quality parameters), Atty. Aquino responded that it will be RTNMC since RTNMC owns the facility. He added that if the 211 exceedance is caused by CBNC's TSF effluent, then there should be 212 formal agreement/arrangement between the companies. 213 214 215 • The Chairperson agreed with Atty. Aquino's statement that RTNMC will be penalized should there be an exceedance as RTNMC owns the 216 environmental facility. If RTNMC will charge CBNC, then it will be 217 between the two (2) companies. To end the discussion, the Chairperson 218 said that the matter will be raised during the MRFC meeting for RTNMC. 219 220 • Engr. Rogel emphasized the importance of the community's 221 participation in the MMT since most of the BLGU representatives did not 222 join the environment group. Atty. Aquino agreed with Engr. Rogel's 223 sentiments as said representatives joined the NGP group. 224 225 • The Chairperson commented that the BLGU representatives may join 226 227 either group and asked the MMT Leader to manage the grouping. 228 Presentation of compliance with the 1Q2023 and 2Q2023 MMT's field 229 3. findings and recommendations and presentation of physical and financial 230 accomplishments, including updating and established Funds. 231 232 233 Mr. Badlon presented the company's compliance with the 1Q2023 MMT 234 findings and recommendations, and other accomplishments. 235 A discussion ensued regarding the capacity of TSF No. 2. Per report of 236 • 237 the company the level of tailings varies depending on the location 238 (within the TSF). Noting that there are certain areas within the TSF where the level of tailings is beyond 79.50 masl (i.e. 79.55 masl), the 239 Chairperson directed the company to stop discharging tailings at TSF 240 No. 2. CBNC acceded to the Chairperson's instruction. 241 242 243 When Mr. Magallanes asked what will be the decision of the MRFC should there be an incident, the Chairperson responded that a CDO 244 shall be issued re: operations of TSF No. 2. 245 246 Atty. Aquino remarked that since the committee is monitoring the 247 248 structure (through the MMT), the body may be held liable should there be an incident involving TSF No.2 (as it is an environmental structure). 249 250 251 The Chairperson agreed with Atty. Aquino's comments and instructed CBNC to operate within the design capacity of TSF No.2. 252 253 Presentation of recent drone shots/videos of rehabilitation areas 254 4. 255

262 263	Engr. Estorque asked what is stated in the law should there be gas leaks or incident involving the tailings facility.	
264 265 266	The Chairperson read Section 67 of the Mining Act, which states that "In case of imminent danger to life or property, the mines regional director	
267 268	may summarily suspend the mining or quarrying operations until the danger is removed, or appropriate measures are taken by the contractor or	
269 270	permittee."
