- Engr. Glenn Marcelo C. Noble, Chairperson and MGB MIMAROPA Regional
 Director, called the meeting to order at 1:45 p.m. upon confirmation of a quorum
 (10 out of 10) by the secretariat.
- 16 III. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF THE PROVISIONAL AGENDA
 - The Chairperson requested the committee members to peruse the Provisional Agenda for the 1st Quarter 2023 MRFC Meeting, for any comments and/or additional issues/concerns/topics for inclusion in the agenda.
 - The following topics/concerns were requested to be included in the "Other Matters" for discussion:

- Complaint of Mr. Ferdinand Bernas
- Complaint of 79 individuals led by Alayma Tambiling Alma
- Complaint on Health Problems
 - Complaint of Pro-Mining IPs led by Mr. Julhadi Titte
 - Scheduling of MMT Monitoring
- Inclusion of BFAR in the MMT
- Without objections to the additional matter, the body approved and adopted the provisional agenda for the 1st Quarter 2023 MRFC Meeting through the motion of Mr. Inocencio C. Magallanes (Haribon Palawan) seconded by Atty. Noel E. Aquino (PG-ENRO Palawan).

IV. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF THE DRAFT MINUTES OF THE 1ST QUARTER 2023 MRFC MEETING HELD ON 15 MARCH 2023

- The Chairperson requested the members for comments on the draft minutes of the 1st Quarter 2023 MRFC meeting for INC.
- With a few minor corrections/clarifications, the minutes for the 1st Quarter 2023
 MRFC meeting for INC was approved with the motion of Mr. Magallanes,
 seconded by Atty. Aquino.

47 V. MATRIX OF ISSUES AND CONCERNS AND MATTERS ARISING FROM THE 1st QUARTER 48 MRFC MINUTES OF THE MEETING

A. Status of claimants within the 230-has area target for reforestation and the inventory of seedlings that were uprooted.

For. Marvin Louie O. Arlegui (INC) gave an update on the matter. He said that according to ComRel, even after a series of meeting was conducted with the claimant, the latter did not allow the company to utilize the area. Given the situation, the company will focus on the 570-has. area provided by CENRO – Brooke's Pt. The Chairperson commented that the matter is no longer a concern considering that a new area was provided by CENRO – Brooke's Pt.

61	Β.	Time Allotted for the MMT Monitoring
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63		• The number of days for MMT monitoring was adjusted to four (4) days
64		as a response to the concern of the PENRO-Palawan and CENRO-
65		Brooke's Point that the allotted for monitoring were not sufficient.
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67	C.	Encroachment: Illegal Tree Cutting and Charcoal Making in the MPSA Area
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69		• For. Arlegui recalled that this concern was raised to ask help from
70		MGB and DENR in monitoring the incident. He also said that the
71		company has Deputized Environment and Natural Resource
72		Officers (DENRO). The Chairperson asked what was the action taken
73		by the CENRO regarding the matter. Mr. Arlegui said that the CENRO
74		has been coordinating with the DENROs.
75		has been coordinating with the betakos.
76		• Atty. Aquino asked whether the DENRO was deployed by DENR or
70		• Any. Adding asked whether the DENKO was deployed by DENK of was employed by the company. For. Arlegui said that the DENRO
78		were security guards employed by the company who had
79		undergone training and were deputized by the DENR.
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81	D.	Inventory of the Claimants by Hon. Domingo D. Bernas and the MLGU
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83		• Hon. Victoriano B. Colili (LGU-Brooke's Point) said that the issue was
84		raised as there were claimants in the area that are hesitant to utilize the
85		area for the project. He also said that the CENRO has yet to give an
86		update on the inventory. The Chairperson requested MLGU to
87		coordinate with CENRO-Brooke's Point.
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89		• Mr. Magallanes wished to clarify the location of the area and include it
90		in the remarks. Hon. Colili replied that the area involved is in Sitio
91		Mararag and Sitio New Panay in Barangay Maasin.
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93	Ε.	Report/Presentation on the Flooding Occurrence in Brooke's Point
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95		• On the MMT's request for a copy of the report/presentation on the
96		flooding occurrence in Brooke's Point. The Chairperson requested the
97		MMT Secretary to provide the said document via google drive.
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99	F.	Conduct of Coastal Resource Assessment
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101		• The MMT secretariat was asked to look into the baseline conditions to
102		determine the level of metal content and to check if there's available
103		data. Engr. Hanna Lee B. Arriesgado (MGB MIMAROPA) said that they
104		were only able to determine the location of the sampling points, but
105		INC will conduct a coastal resource assessment.
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107		• For. Arlegui responded that updates on the matter will be discussed in
108		his presentation. He explained that the causeway was originally
109		planned to be constructed within the coastal water of Barangays
110		Maasin and Mambalot. However, since there were changes in the
111		design of the causeway, the identified sampling locations for coastal
		design of the couseway, the definited sumpling locations for COusian

112 113 114	resource assessment may not be applicable. Further, the structure will be constructed in Barangay Mambalot.
115 116	G. Capacity of the Installed Culvert
117 118 119	 For. Arlegui updated the body that the engineering team already evaluated the capacity of the culvert. Currently, the company is in the process of installing new culverts.
120 121 122	 In addition to For. Arlegui's update, Engr. Segundo A. Villanueva (INC) explained that the company is currently implementing a flood
123 124 125	management program wherein additional round culverts will be installed while the round culverts along the haul roads will be replaced with box culverts.
126 127 128 129	 The Chairperson requested the company to present the flood management program/plan next MRFC meeting.
130 131	H. Proposal to include QRT in the MMT MOO
131 132 133 134	• The Chairperson instructed the Secretariat to draft the functions and scope of work of the QRT with the assistance of Mr. Magallanes.
134 135 136	I. Inquiry on the STCEP Compliance of INC
137 138 139 140	 Ms. Marilyn R. Limpiada (DENR MIMAROPA) said that according to the last representative of DENR MIMAROPA to the MRFC, Ms. Bibiana Lyn T. Aguha, DENR has yet to receive a letter on the position of the court.
140 141 142 143 144 145	 Hon. Victoriano B. Colili (LGU Brooke's Pt.) commented that he is particularly inquiring on INC's compliance with the terms and conditions of the STCEP as some of the Barangay Chairpersons attested that no public consultation was conducted with concerned stakeholders, which was one of the STCEP conditions.
146 147 148 149 150	 The Chairperson instructed the secretariat to draft a letter to DENR MIMAROPA inquiring on INC's compliance with the conditions of the STCEP.
151 152 153 154 155 156	• On a related matter, For. Arlegui was asked to provide an update on the cut logs. He said that a total of 26,699 pieces of cut logs consisting of 10,206 logs with diameter of 15 cm and above, and 16,493 logs with a diameter of 14cm and below were turned over to PG-ENRO. However, the company has no record on how it was utilized since it was already turned over.
157 158 159 160	• Atty. Aquino remarked that it was not turned over to his office but rather to the provincial government.

provide an update on the utilization of cut logs at the next MRFC 162 meetina. 163 164 J. Clarification on the Certification Precondition 165 166 The Chairperson said that there has been a letter drafted on the matter. 167 • however, it was not sent to the Dir. Marie Grace T. Pascua (NCIP IV) as 168 he would like to personally discuss the matter with the Dir. Pascua. Since 169 170 NCIP MIMAROPA has a representative during the meeting, the Chairperson said that the letter may not be needed. 171 172 Hon. Colili cited the conflicting documents from NCIP MIMAROPA 173 regarding INC's exemption from securing a Certification Precondition 174 175 (CP). He asked the representative to provide a categorical statement/document on the matter. 176 177 Atty. Jansen I. Jontila (NCIP MIMAROPA) referred to the minutes of the 178 179 previous meeting where it was stated that the document (stating the need to secure a CP) was an internal document and was not duly 180 released since it was a memorandum not a notice addressed to the 181 concern party. He suggested for the MRFC to write a letter to the 182 Ancestral Domain Office (ADO) to know whether INC is exempted or 183 184 not. 185 **VI. TECHNICAL REPORTS** 186 187 1. Presentation of Highlights of the 1Q2023 MMT Validation 188 189 190 Engr. Arriesgado presented the findings and recommendations for INC during the 1st Quarter 2023 MMT monitoring. 191 192 Regarding the MOA for MMT creation as raised by EMB MIMAROPA 193 194 during the entry meeting, the Chairperson commented that the MOA should be among the MRFC members not MMT. He explained that the 195 creation of an MMT will be included in the MOA as the MMTs for mining 196 projects are governed by the MRFC unlike the MMTs created by EMB 197 MIMAROPA by virtue of Presidential Decree No. 1586. 198 199 • Noting that the target for topsoil/subsoil recovery was not 200 accomplished, Ms. Roque inquired why the target was set by the 201 company. For. Arlegui responded that INC has applied for an STCEP in 202 203 2022 and anticipated that it will be released within the first quarter of 204 2023. However, since the application for an STCEP is yet to be approved, the company will not be able to develop/open an area. 205 206 Hon. Colili raised his concern on how the topsoil/subsoil is being 207 managed, if it is stored in an area far from water bodies. 208 Enar. 209 Arriesgado responded that the company observes the provision of DAO No. 2018 – 19 regarding topsoil/subsoil management. 210 211

The Chairperson requested the PG-ENRO and PENRO – Palawan to

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 Hon. Colili asked why the MMT was not able to check the siltation pond 212 213 (Barangay Mambalot side) as relayed by his representative. Enar. Arriesaado responded that the team decided not to check the area for 214 safety reason as the around was soft due to heavy rain. The area will be 215 monitored next quarter. 216 217 Mr. Magallanes asked on the source of materials being used for 218 causeway construction. He advised the company to wash the boulders 219 220 if the source is the mine pit as there are a number of complaints 221 concerning the causeway. As for other concerns, he asked the company to observe proper stockpiling of recovered topsoil and to 222 establish fire lines at the 2-has. area under Mining Forest Program. 223 224 • Engr. Villanueva informed the body that the embankment materials 225 226 come from (permittees) rivers of Tamlang, Sarasa up to S. Española while the surfacing materials (which are clean) comes from the mine pit. He 227 explained that the observed discoloration is due to the tires of haul trucks 228 229 that travels back and forth the stockpile and the mine pit. 230 231 Hon. Colili commented that the discoloration has been observed during the past MMT monitoring and supported Mr. Magallanes' idea to check 232 the sea bottom to check if there is accumulation of silt. On a separate 233 matter, he relayed the observation of the PCSD regarding the 234 establishment of demarcation line – part of the terms and conditions of 235 236 the SEP Clearance. 237 The Chairperson noted Hon. Colili's comments and instructed INC to 238 239 comply with the terms and conditions of the SEP Clearance. 240 • For, Arlequi commented that they have complied with the said provision, 241 but they were not able to provide a document regarding the conduct 242 of survey and demarcation line. He added that the survey was 243 244 conducted way back in 2016, hence the company conducted a resurvey, and the demarcation line was identified. The Chairperson 245 instructed the company to provide MMT with the said information. 246 247 248 In response to Mr. Magallanes' advice to maintain the area where the 249 topsoil is stored, For. Arlequi explained that compacting, benching and planting of grass were conducted while a settling pond was established 250 to address runoff should there be any. 251 252 A discussion ensued on the use of single use plastic and styro food 253 254 containers within the vicinity as it has been a huge contributor to solid waste. Atty. Aquino suggested to implement a policy on employees to 255 256 bring their own lunchbox, utensils, and water containers. The Chairperson also suggested to impose penalties on those caught using 257 258 styro and plastics. 259

• Hon. Colili added that the Municipality of Brooke's Point recently 260 adopted an ordinance prohibiting the use of single use plastic and 261 Styrofoam. 262 263 2. Presentation of highlights of the 2nd Quarter 2023 Water, Air and Noise 264 265 Monitoring and Sampling 266 The MMT sampling group, represented by Ms. Samantha Margarita Q. 267 Danganan (EMB MIMAROPA) presented the highlights of the 2nd Quarter 268 2023 Water, Air and Noise Monitoring and Sampling. 269 270 Hon. Colili commented that the discoloration of the water along the 271 causeway has been observed previously. He raised this concern as there 272 273 is fish sanctuary located a few meters from the causeway and supported Mr. Magallanes' suggestion to check if there's accumulation of silt at the 274 275 seafloor. He inquired on the mitigating measures being implemented by the company to address this. 276 277 Atty. Aquino agreed with Hon. Colili's concern and advised the 278 company to improve the causeway gradient specifically at the 279 entrance. 280 281 282 Engr. Villanueva explained the different phases of causeway • construction and assured the body that mitigating measures are in 283 place to address the discoloration such as drainage canals that convey 284 the water to the settling ponds located along the entrance and 285 enclosing the area under construction to contain the silt. He said that 286 these mitigating measures are 80 to 90% effective and that the 287 288 expansion will end by last quarter of 2023. 289 Noting that the expansion activities will last until October, Fr. Jasper A. 290 Tabangay (AVPP) asked the company if it is possible to install an 291 additional layer of silt curtain. 292 293 294 For. Arlegui responded that it will take a while for the new silt curtain to be delivered due to the procurement process, but the company is 295 296 repairing (reinforcing) available silt curtains. 297 298 Atty. Aquino asked on the possible effects of the silt. Engr. Dan Goodwin 299 S. Borja (EMB MIMAROPA) replied that the silt may contain heavy metals. He explained that the water quality cannot be determined as the 300 laboratory results of the samples taken during MMT were not provided. 301 302 Furthermore, the water body along the causeway has not been classified by EMB MIMAROPA, hence it should not be automatically 303 assumed as Class SC. Their office will determine its classification with the 304 305 help of the LGU (i.e., current beneficial use). 306 Atty. Aquino asked what will be used in evaluating the results of the 307 water quality monitoring conducted by the MMT. Engr. Borja replied 308 none as of now but their office will conduct a study. 309 310

311		3.	Presentation of compliance with the 1Q2023 and 2Q2023 MMT's field
312			findings and recommendations and presentation of physical and financial
313			accomplishments, including updating and established Funds.
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315			For. Arlegui presented the company's compliance with the 1Q2023 MMT
316			findings and recommendations, and other accomplishments.
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318			• While For. Arlegui was discussing the land-use, the Chairperson asked
319			why the company has an area for temporary revegetation. For. Arlegui
320			explained that these areas were cleared of vegetation in 2017, but not
321			yet developed. The Chairperson advised the company to change the
322			classification as areas for temporary revegetation should be subjected
323			to progressive rehabilitation if not utilized within three (3) years per DAO
324			No. 2018 – 19.
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326			• Hon. Colili reiterated his request for a copy of the MLA and design of
327			causeway. The company requested for a formal letter of request from
328			the MLGU before providing the requested documents.
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330			• Atty. Jontila asked if the company is compliant with the percentage of
331			IP Workers. Mr. Alex C. Arabis (INC) responded that 30% of the
332			company's workers are IPs, while the IPRA law only requires 10%.
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334		4.	Presentation of recent drone shots/videos of rehabilitation areas
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336			Included in the company's presentation. Please see VI.3.
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338	VII. OT	HER	MATTTERS
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340		1.	Complaint of Mr. Bernas
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342			Hon. Colili relayed to the committee the complaint of Mr. Ferdinand Bernas
343			to seek a response from PCSD. He said that the complainant provided
344			drone shots of the area, mangrove forests that were allegedly cleared to
345			give way for INC's causeway.
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347			The Chairperson asked if the complaint was forwarded to the PCSD as the
348			MRFC will just forward it to the PCSD.
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350		2.	Complaint of 79 Individuals led by Alayma Tambiling Alma
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352			Hon. Colili said that there has been a petition signed by residents of
353			Barangay Maasin. According to the complainants, the kadkaran area is
354			filled with mud, likewise the fishing ground and areas where lobster cages
355			were installed. They believed that the mud was a result of the causeway
356			construction.
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358		3.	Complaint on Health Problems
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- According to Hon. Colili, the same 79 individuals from Barangay Maasin
 complained of skin lesions that they believed were acquired from diving in
 the water near the causeway to harvest lobster.
- The Chairperson asked on the action taken by the LGU regarding the matter. Hon. Colili suggested that the LGU may investigate the cause of the skin lesions and asked if the MRFC would acknowledge the result of the investigation.
- Atty. Aquino added that it will depend on the kind of study conducted. He explained that the individual may go directly to the Municipal Health Office (MHO) to know the cause of the his/her illness and the MHO may release as certification. This may be used to know whether it is the mud that's causing his/her illness.
- 375Relative to the study, Atty. Jontila remarked that there is also a need to376establish the baseline condition of the area (mud).
- 378Atty. Jontila asked whether the MMT will conduct a study or if the MMT or379the MRFC can act on the subject complaint else it should be endorsed to380the rightful authority.
- 381 A long discussion ensued between the Chairperson and Hon. Colili as to 382 383 why the matter was brought before the MRFC when the MLGU can act on it as it concerns the health of its constituents. In the end, Atty. Aquino cited 384 the LGU's police power, legislative measures being done by the LGU to 385 protect the health and safety of the community. He understood the 386 sentiment of Hon. Colili as the latter depended on the advice of the 387 company (to bring the matter to the top management) but noted that this 388 is within the police power of the LGU since this concerns health. He advised 389 to bring the said individuals to the MHO or Provincial Health Office for 390 check-up. If based on the check-up, the itchiness is caused by bacteria 391 found in heavy metals, this will be the time to conduct an 392 investigation/study. 393
 - Hon. Colili explained that he brought the matter to the MRFC as the schedule was near anyway. The Chairperson understood and hoped that the LGU can act on it immediately since it concerns health.
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4. Complaint of Pro-Mining IPs

- On this matter, Hon. Colili imparted the sentiments of the Pro-Mining IPs regarding the alleged non-payment of Royalties to IPs.
- Atty. Jontila relayed the response of FPIC Team on the various issues concerning Mr. Julhadi B. Titte et al.:
- Revocation of IP consent: Mr. Titte et al.'s representation is not enough to conclude that this is the decision of the whole IP community. During the FPIC process, 3,748 individuals (15 years old and above) decided in favor of the project.

Annulment of the MOA: There is a question whether Mr. Titte and his 411 • 412 group are authorized by the community or are they exercising their individual right. 413 **Bribery:** Document must be duly notarized as this is a serious allegation 414 on the part of the company. 415 416 The FPIC Team recommended to conduct further investigation and to defer the suspension 417 418 Upon hearing Atty. Jontila's explanations, Hon. Colili said that the LGU will 419 discuss the matter and form an initiative based on this information. 420 421 On the annulment of the MOA, Mr. Arabis said that the MOA is a product 422 of a series of discussions and negotiations, and the 1% Royalty to IPs has 423 been comprehensively discussed. 424 425 426 Mr. Arabis further explained that the company and the IPs, as facilitated by the NCIP MIMAROPA, agreed that in the absence of the royalty, the 427 company offered a Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) amounting to 428 429 PHP7.5 million per year, but the IPs demanded for PHP10 million and an advance royalty of PHP7.5 million - this will be in the form of projects such 430 as health, education, scholarship, etc., covering six (6) barangays. He 431 added that the 1% royalty cannot be used as a violation under the MOA 432 433 as it is not included in the provisions and is set as a fixed amount.

5. Scheduling of MMT Monitoring

Atty. Jontilla requested for the secretariat to provide the notice three (3) weeks to one (1) month prior the MMT monitoring so the NCIP representative may adjust accordingly. The Chairperson took note of this and asked the secretariat to accede to the request of NCIP MIMAROPA.

6. Inclusion of BFAR in the MMT

Mr. Magallanes explained that there is a need to include BFAR in the MMT as most of the complaints emanated from the construction of the causeway.

When the Chairperson asked the committee whether BFAR should be part of the MMT or not, most of the members agreed that BFAR should be part of the MMT. Hence, the inclusion of BFAR in the MMT was agreed upon motion of Mr. Magallanes, seconded by Hon. Colili. The Secretariat to prepare a resolution on this matter, to be signed by the members next MRFC meeting.

VIII. ADJOURNMENT

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458 All matters properly discussed and there being no other issue/concern for
459 deliberation, the meeting was adjourned at 06:30 p.m. on the motion of Mr.
460 Magallanes, seconded by Ms. Roque.
