AGREED-UPON ACTIONS BY DENR TO THE EMERGING

ISSUES ON THE CONSERVATION OF PHILIPPINE

COCKATOO IN PALAWAN

This pertains to the meeting between the DENR and Katala Foundation, Inc. (KFI) on 29 August 2023 at the Office of Senator Zubiri in Pasay City. The meeting was attended by DENR Secretary Maria Antonia Yulo-Loyzaga, Senator Juan Miguel F. Zubiri, Mr. Maximo C. Landrito, OIC Assistant Regional Director for Technical Services of DENR MIMAROPA, Ms. Armida P. Andres, Assistant Director of BMB and Mr. Anson M. Tagtag, Chief of the Wildlife Resources Division of BMB.

During the meeting, KFI presented an overview of the Philippine Cockatoo Conservation Program and highlighted the emerging issues and challenges related to the conservation of the Philippine cockatoo in Palawan that require immediate attention and action from the DENR, as follows:
