SUBJECT: AUTHORIZING THE CONDUCT OF WORKSHOP ON THE REVIEW/UPDATING OF TAMARAW CONSERVATION MANAGEMENT AND ACTION PLAN (TCMAP), ISLAND-PROTECTION WIDE TAMARAW AND ENFORCEMENT, AND CONSULTATION OF FEASIBILITY STUDY ON TAMARAW TRANSLOCATION AND EX SITU **MANAGEMENT ON OCTOBER 3-6, 2023**

In the interest of the service and as part of the celebration of Tamaraw Month in October pursuant to Presidential Proclamation No. 273 Series of 2002, the conduct of a threeday workshop on tamaraw conservation in San Jose, Occidental Mindoro on October 3-6, 2023 is hereby authorized. Said workshop shall be held in partnership with the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), Asian Wild Cattle Specialist Group (AWCSG), and Zoological Society of London (ZSL) through their local collaborator, the D'Aboville Foundation and Demo Farm (DAF).

The workshop will discuss the following topics:

- 1. Status review and updating of the Tamaraw Conservation Management and Action Plan (TCMAP)
- 2. Multi-stakeholder meeting to discuss the island wide tamaraw protection and law enforcement as preparation to Law Enforcement Forum (LEF) in 2024
- 3. Launch of the initial cycle of consultation for the feasibility study on tamaraw translocation and ex situ management

Expenses during the workshop shall be jointly shouldered by DAF and DENR MIMAROPA, except for travelling expenses and per diems of DENR participants which shall be charged against their respective offices funds', subject to availability and existing accounting and auditing rules and regulations. An amount of P100,000.00 shall be downloaded by the Regional Office to PENRO Occidental Mindoro chargeable against Wildlife Resources Conservation Sub-Program as DENR's counterpart fund in the conduct of the activity.

The TCP Coordinator shall submit report to the undersigned within fifteen (15) days upon conclusion of the activity.

This Order shall take effect on the dates herein specified.
