

ACTIVITY DESIGN CONDUCT OF LEARNING EVENT ON REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9262 OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "ANTI-VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN AND THEIR CHILDREN (VAWC)"

A. RATIONALE

The one (1) day conduct of learning event to end violence against women and their children (VAWC) is observed annually during the month of November. The objective of this annual event is to raise awareness among all employees that VAWC is a public issue of national concern and it supports the Philippine Government's goal to protect the human rights of women and children and its commitment to address all forms of gender-based violence. The following issuances provide the national legal mandates for the annual campaign Proclamation 1172 Series of 2006 – Declaring the last week of November and first week of December as the campaign to end violence against women and children. The law also raises the standard by which this campaign is conserved by mandating key agencies to undertake activities designed to raise public awareness on VAWC.

With the theme "VAW-free community starts with Me", it shifts the campaign to positive advocacy messaging, by giving emphasis on everyone's commitment and contributions in ending VAWC and our collaborative pursuit of our common vision of a LAW-free community.

B. OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the campaign are the following:

- 1. Uplift the knowledge of employees on gender based violence among peer through Orientation and conduct of lectures.
- 2. Empower the employees to be assertive of their rights; and
- 3. Instill positive influence in building a community that is respectful of everyone's right to be free from abuse and violence.

C. METHODOLOGY

The Learning Activity shall be carried out to selected personnel from different units/sections of PENRO, CENRO-Socorro and CENRO-Roxas, Oriental Mindoro through lecture-discussion with an aid of Powerpoint presentations. Active participation of attendees will be encouraged.
