





## COMPLETE STAFF WORK (Regular Monitoring/Assessment of CBFM Area) Makawayan Upland Farmers Association (MUFA)

## A. Factual Background:

The CBFM Area in Barangay Makawayan, Torrijos, Marinduque is awarded to Makawayan Upland Farmers Association (MUFA), previously Makawayan/Tigwi Upland Farmers Multipurpose Cooperative (MTUFMC) on November 12, 1999 with CBFMA No. R-IV-B-MAR-CBFMA-99-002. It is composed of two parcels located at Sitio Matalim and Bungahan with a total land area of One Hundred Fifty Seven Hectares and Two Thousand Square Meters (157.2000 Has.) Both areas are combination of lots under Certificate of Stewardship Contract (CSC) issued on August 1994. Each CSC lots are mostly planted with coconut for copra production intercropped with various annual/agricultural crops. MUFA is a Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) registered organization with Registration No. CR#012-987 currently represented by Mr. Sammuel R. Fabul, Sr.

In 2013, 29.0 hectares agroforestry plantation under National Greening Program (NGP) was established in the CBFM area in Makawayan wherein Narra and coffee seedlings were planted.

Another project was awarded to MUFA in 2016. It was entitled "Community-Based Agroforestry with Backyard Gardening" funded by the Comprehensive Agrarian Reform Program (CARP). Agroforestry plantation was established in the 20.0 hectares site located at Sitio Bungahan, Makawayan, Torrijos within the 157.2000 hectares awarded CBFM Area. Forest Trees planted were Mahogany and Gmelina while Fruit Trees include Rambutan, Lanzones, Guyabano and Langka. Seeds of Agricultural Crops were evenly distributed to members of the PO for backyard gardening.

In 2021, 7.0 out of the 29.0 hectares 2013 NGP plantation was subjected for enhancement planting. Three thousand five hundred (3,500) narra seedling were planted in the area.

#### > 1987 Constitution

- Enjoins the state to enter into co-production, joint venture, or production agreements vic-à-vis natural resource management with empowered communities

### Executive Order (EO) 192 (1987)

- Reorganizes the environment and the natural resources sector, and mandates the DENR to conserve, manage, develop, properly use, license, and regulate the use of natural resources.

## ➤ DENR Department Administrative Order (DAO) 123 (1989)

- Promotes community participation in the rehabilitation, protection, improvement, and management of degraded and productive residual forest, bushlands, virgin forests, and marginal lands.

## ➤ Local Government Code (LGC) of 1991 or RA 7160

- Devolves central government functions, such as the natural resource management functions of the DENR, to Local Government Units (LGUs).

## National Integrated Protected Areas System (NIPAS) Act or RA 7586 (1992)

- Allocates forestlands and forest resources as protected area systems for purpose of biodiversity conservation, habitat preservation, watershed protection, and maintenance of ecological balance.

## Executive Order (EO) 263 (1995)

- Declares CBFM as the country's national strategy of sustainable forest management.

#### ➤ DENR Department Administrative Order (DAO) 96-29 (1996)

- Provides the Implementing Rules and Regulations of EO 263; paved the way for the granting of resource use rights to communities; and allows the transfer of tenure as well as their limited division through such mechanisms as joint venture and contracting.

## DENR Memorandum Circular (MC) 97-12 (1997)

- Adopts the DENR Strategic Action Plan for CBFM.

#### ➤ Indigenous People's Right Act (IPRA) or RA 8371 (1997)

- Recognizes, protects, and promotes the rights of indigenous peoples, and paved the way for the individual or communal titling of ancestral forestlands.

#### D. Potential Problem/s:

Natural calamities and phenomenon like typhoon, El Niño and La Niña are some of the main problems that may affect the CBFM area of MUFA. These are also factors causing high mortality in the established plantation thereat. The presence of roaming animals owned by individuals farming in the adjacent areas is also problem in maintaining the planted forest trees and high value crops.

#### E. Actions Taken:

Regular monitoring and assessment of the CBFM Area is being conducted. This is to evaluate the status of the area and what activities are being conducted by the PO development, maintenance and protection activities. This is also a way to assess the status of the projects established within the CBFMA.

#### F. Findings and Recommendation:

During the monitoring conducted in the CBFM area of MUFA, it was observed that only species of mahogany, guyabano, and cassava were survived and grown in the established agroforestry plantation funded under CARP. This may due to lack of maintenance and protection activities in the area and the presence of roaming animals owned by individuals cultivating in adjacent farm lots. It was also noticed that the trail from the lowland to the CBFMA was covered by shrubs, vines and different kind of grass. On the other hand, high survival rate in the established plantation under NGP was noticed. Planted Narra trees are firmly standing while coffee plants are already in good condition.


It was also found out that most of the members of MUFA did not continue the practice of backyard gardening. They focus on fishing which is the main source of living of the populace of Brgy. Makawayan.

Based on the observations and information gathered during the regular assessment/monitoring in the CBFM Area of MUFA, Mr. Fabul was advised to remind the PO members especially those holders of CSC to practice regular maintenance and protection activities in the area. In relation to the issue regarding the presence of roaming animals that serves as threat to the forest trees and high value crops, it was recommended that the association must coordinate with Makawayan BLGU for appropriate action.
