BANBANAN, TAYTAY, PALAWAN ON JULY 7, 2022

Forwarded is the memorandum dated July 25, 2022 of CENRO Taytay along with the report on the conducted seaborne patrol and monitoring in the vicinity of Barangay Banbanan, Taytay, Palawan that serves as **Means of Verification (MOV)** to the target activity under Management of Coastal and Marine Resources/Areas of Malampaya Sound Protected Landscape and Seascape (MSPLS) – Maintenance and Protection – Patrolling.

According to the report, the PAMO-MSPLS patrolled two (2) sites with a total of 38.1 km (490.00ha). Moreover, the aforementioned office recorded and sighted about six (6) to eight (8) motorized boats conducting trawl fishing activity in the vicinities of Barangay Banbanan, Taytay, Palawan. However, no one was caught because the operators immediately escaped and their boats were designed for racing. Likewise, based on the information gathered, the boats chased by the team were residents of Barangays New Guinlo and Alacalian, Taytay, Palawan, but they were unable to identify its owners.

It is recommended that the patrol and monitoring within marine areas of MSPLS be intensified to hinder illegal activities, and coordination with the BLGUs and BFARMC in the inner sound of the said MPA be conducted regularly.

Likewise, an information gathered that the boats chased by the team is a residents of Barangay New Guinlo and Alacalian, Taytay, Palawan but could not identify the operators/boat owners.

Be informed further, that the team patrolled two (2) sites with a total distance of 38.1 kilometers and equivalent to 490.00 hectares.

This Office recommends to intensify the patrol and monitoring within marine areas of MSPLS to hinder illegal activities.

This pertains on the conducted seaborne patrol and monitoring in the above mentioned date and place.

Please be informed that on July 7, 2022, the undersigned together with Office Support Staff Richard M. Valones, Richen R. Armenia, Erwin C. Balvin and Forest Protection Officers Rennie O. Tenolite and Reynaldo T. Conda from Forest Product Monitoring Station – I conducted seaborne patrol and monitoring within the vicinity of Sitio Malaya, Barangay Banbanan, Taytay, Palawan.

At around 3:30 o'clock in the afternoon the team was sailing in the vicinity of Sitio Malaya, Barangay Banbanan, Taytay, Palawan when we spotted an estimated of six (6) to eight (8) motorized boats conducting trawl fishing activity. We went straight in the location of the boat, however one of the operator saw us and immediately informed the other operators, the team chased them but they immediately escaped. Meanwhile, four (4) of this boats caught our attention and tried to chased them until we reached the vicinity of Barangay San Jose, Taytay, Palawan, unfortunately we lost track on them because their boats was very fast and designed for racing. Based on the information gathered the boats that we chased was residents of Barangay New Guinlo and Alacalian, Taytay, Palawan but didn't identify the operator/boat owners.

Be informed further, that the team was unable to take geo tagged photos due to heavy rains and strong wave, but we used the Locus Map application for tracking the area of operation.

The undersigned recommends intensifying the patrol and monitoring within marine areas of MSPLS to hinder illegal activities.
